

⇒REPORT OF SESSION€

In presenting their annual report the Session gratefully acknowledge the continued guidance and blessing of "the Chief Shepherd." God in His infinite goodness has crowned the year with uninterrupted peace, and with a large measure of prosperity. No material interest of the congregation has suffered, and the Session are very thankful to have reason for believing that its spiritual interests have been steadily advancing. There has been a very marked improvement in the congregational prayer-meeting, the average attendance during the past year. One peculiarly gratifying feature of the prayer-meeting is the regular attendance of a large number of the young people of the congregation. The Session trust that this encouraging state of things may long continue, and that the example of the young people may stimulate some of the older members of the congregation to greater faithfulness in this particular direction.

But the pleasure of reviewing a year's successful work is mingled with the sadness of remembering that many have fallen by the way. The loss inflicted on the congregation by death during the year just closed has been very great. Besides Mr. Alexander Dale and Mr. Robert Blair (neither of whom was connected with the congregation at the time of his death, although both were buried in Brampton), FOURTEEN members and adherents of the congregation were called to their account during 1897.

Nine of these were members in full communion; and of these nine all but one had heen in membership for many years; three of them, Mr. Pringle, Mrs. Whitehead, and Mrs. Huuter, having been connected with the congregation from its very commencement. The Session feel called upon to make special reference to the death of their late Moderator, who, for nearly forty years was permitted to minister to the associated congregations of Brampton and Derry West, and whose

increasing years of Christian work only won for him in an increasing degree the esteem and confidence of all who knew him. They are profoundly grateful for all the comforting and helpful lessons of his long and useful life ; and they feel confident they but voice the sentiments of the whole congregation in paying this public tribute of respect to the memory of a good man and a faithful minister of Jesus Christ.

At the beginning of last year the communion roll contained 329 names. During the year 32 names were removed, 9 members having died, and 23 having been certified to other congregations. There were added during the year 37 (19 by certificate, and 18 upon profession of faith), making the membership at the close of the year 334. On account of the December communion having been postponed till January, the additions to the communion roll for 1887 are less hy 13 than they would otherwise have been.

The Session have to report that the collections taken up in aid of the Session Fund on the three Communion Sabbaths of last year amounted to \$53, and that during the year only \$7 were expended.

16 persons were paptized during the year, 3 of them being adults.

The prayer of the Session is, that all connected with the congregation "may grow up in all things into Him which is the head even Christ," "forbearing one another in love, endeavoring to keep the unity of the "Spirit in the bond of peace."
