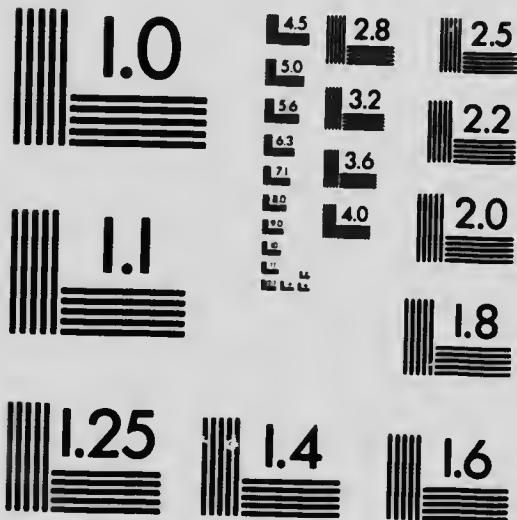

Your Excellency,

The Congregation (Anglican) of St. Mary's Chapel, Montmorency Falls, have just completed the building of a stone Church. In this Congregation all protestant denominations have worshipped

together and will continue to do so in the new Church.

It has been suggested that, in consequence of the land on which this church is built, having been formerly in possession of His Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent, and in close proximity to the house he occupied from 1791 to 1794, His Majesty The King might be graciously pleased to donate some object to mark his interest in the church.

Your Excellency might be interested in knowing that the building where services have been held in the past was a house used by part of the retinue of His Royal Highness the Duke of Kent.

I have been asked to communicate this loyal wish of the Congregation to Your Excellency with the view of its transmission to His Majesty the King and trust

that the very great love and respect in which the memory of His Royal Highness the Duke of Kent is held at Montmorency may be considered an excuse for this letter.
