The Sunday School picnic on 5th of July was very successful. The trip out to Bond Lake, and the beauty of that place, were sufficient to tempt quite a number of the seniors of the congregation to join with the young people in their annual outing.

On some recent occasions, when we have had crowded congregations, it has been apparent that the existing exit from the building is inadequate, and it has therefore been determined to provide a door way and staircase leading out directly from the west door of the choir, to be used when required, retaining the present entrance and exit for ordinary use. In addition to this, as a provision for any possible case of emergency, the east window on the north aisle has been fitted so as to

open on hinges, and steps are to be erected on the outside, thus forming an exit independently of the west doors. This may be a wholly needless precaution, and it is hoped that it will prove to be so, but it is better for such things to be overdone rather than have any doubt about them.

The stalls have been further enriched by two more pinnacles, from the same generous donor as before, which have recently been placed in position.

The Residuary Chapter has met twice during the past month for the purpose of giving effect to the action of the congregation towards extension of the fabric.

At one of these meetings the resolution of the meeting of the congregation regarding Mr. Kemp, referred to in the last number of the MONTHLY NOTES was brought to the notice of the Chapter, when the following resolution was passed: "That the Chapter having read the resolution regarding Mr. Kemp passed by the meeting of members of the congregation, do express their hearty concurrence therewith, and do express (as they have frequently done informally, but not hitherto in a formal manner) their appreciation of the merit and value of Mr. Kemp's services, and also the excellent service gratuitously and zealously rendered by all the members of the Choir in the public worship of the Cathedral."

We feel sure that the congregation generally will join with us in an expression of regret on account of Mr. George Parker's illness, which has caused his absence from the choir for some time past. A member of choir and worker, so assiduous and ever present, is inevitably much missed. We hope that it will not be long before we have the pleasure of seeing him in his place again with restored health.

The movement towards extension of the building has not made much progress, being much delayed by the absence from town of so many. In the meantime, however, arrangements have been made for the substitution of brick for the present wooden wall on the south side of the boiler house. This will be immediately useful, and will be something done in preparation for future work.
