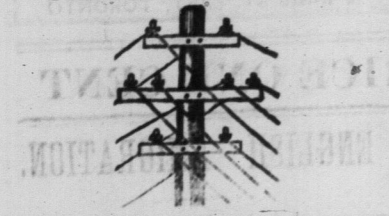

POLITICAL CHRONICLES. The political situation in the province is very evenly balanced.

It is true they can be incorporated under the several provincial legislatures, with the exception of Quebec, but this latter exception is the very reason why they have gone to Ottawa, where they ask a general act that will give them rights all over, including Quebec.

The French Canadians are acting foolishly in this opposing the orangemen. The orange order incorporated is less to be feared a hundredfold than the orangemen denied privileges granted them.

How Sir John will meet the situation has yet to be unfolded. We would not be surprised to see the bill go through the house of commons and Sir John vote for it, and yet see it defeated in the senate.
