SIR RICHARD'S HANDWRITING IN THE PROPOSAL TO H. H. COOK

Mr. M. C. Cameron Was the Go-Between and \$10,000 Was the Price of the Senatorship, According to Mr. Cook's Evidence—W. T. R. Preston Also on Deck.

Ottawa, March 26.—(Special).—Sir Richard Cartwright will be the star witness at the investigation of alleged traffic in senatorships. H. H. Cook's evidence today settled the question of whether or not Cameron is placed upon Sir Richard's case by Sir Mackenzie Bowell presided over the enquiry in room 8, and all the members of the Special Committee were present.

MR. COOK'S EVIDENCE. Mr. Cook's evidence was given from 10:38 he was an applicant for a senatorship. After the death of Sir David Macpherson, in 1886, about the 20th or 21st of Aug. he had an interview with Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who advised him to see Sir Oliver Mowat and the Hon. Sir Richard Cartwright. Sir O. Mowat declined support. Sir Richard Cartwright was prepared to advocate Mr. Cook for the second place.

SENATOR FERGUSON WAS VERY ILL. Mr. Cook, the other applicant, had precedence because he had more recent claims upon the Government, thru assisting with money in the election.

"MEANING KEEP QUIET." After interviewing Sir Richard, Mr. Cook had an interview with Mr. C. Cameron with the knowledge of Sir Richard. Cameron wrote a letter to "Cook" personally. Mr. Cook kept a copy, its address being "Cook, keep quiet." On the 28th August Cook wrote Cameron bespeaking support from some members of the House in the 27th, Cameron was very ill. Mr. Cook, disclosing the names of various applicants, James Innes Salomon, Cox will be his "predecessor," but Cartwright was "his successor."

CAMERON WROTE COOK. On the 29th Aug. Cameron wrote Cook about a long interview with Mowat. One "wealthy" man was standing in the way.

RAILWAY BUILDING IN MANITOBA IN THE INTEREST OF FARMERS

Government Guarantee to Be Transferred From One Section to Another—Serious Hitch Reported as to the Roblin Deal—C.P.R. Said to Be Interested.

WINNIPEG, March 26.—(Special).—The afternoon session of the Legislature today was devoted largely to routine business. An important announcement was made by Hon. Mr. Rogers, who, in explanation of his bill respecting aid to railroads, said that the Government had indeed the Canadian Northern to allow the \$800,000 million guarantee given the Dominion conferring with the C.P.R. in behalf of the deal. It says "there is a growing suspicion that the C.P.R. is not bothering its mind with the Canadian Northern deal. The effort to excite public opinion in favor of the deal by exciting public opinion against the C.P.R. is a poor way to excuse a bad arrangement."

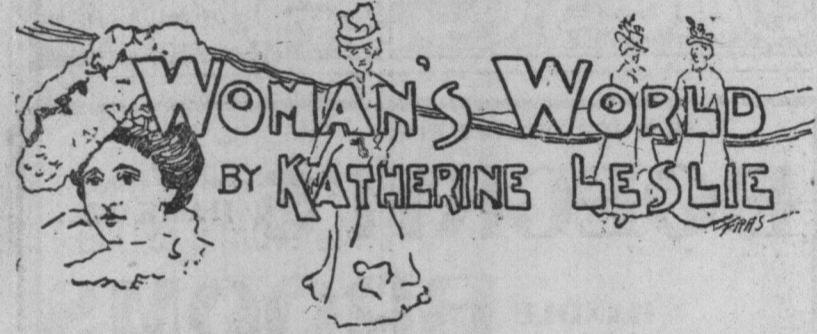



BOARD OF TRADE COUNCIL

No Particular Project Endorsed in Regard to Colonization of New Ontario.

COUNTRY SHOULD BE OPENED UP.

Ontario Government Urged to Take Reasonable and Careful Steps in That Direction.

Several matters of importance were considered at the meeting of the Board of Trade Council yesterday afternoon. Mr. J. E. Ellis presented a report of the Railway and Transportation Committee re the New Ontario Colonization Railway. The report in part stated: "While we have not the evidence before us to justify us in endorsing any particular project, the committee, from information obtained, feel that the country which would be traversed by this road possesses resources, the development of which must prove largely beneficial to the older sections of the province, if care is taken to secure the proper connections and not allow the trade to be diverted eastward. It would, therefore, endorse the Ontario government in taking reasonable steps to open up that country, provided proper independent communication is assured with the older sections of the province, and this city."

SAYS SHERIFF CONSPIRES,

Further Steps Taken Yesterday by J. B. Klock in Regard to the Nipissing Election.

Additional steps were taken yesterday in the matter of the petition brought by J. B. Klock against Sheriff Varin of Nipissing, by the filing of particulars in behalf of the petitioners, and by an order of Mr. Justice MacMahon. The sheriff, it will be remembered, withdrew the writ for the Nipissing election for the Dominion House on the 21st inst. Mr. Klock, late Chief Justice of the county, is the petitioner. He claims to have been defamed on the ground that the postponement of the election was for the purpose of benefiting the names of those persons whom the petitioner alleged to be conspiring with him to defame the election. The names of these persons are: Maurice W. Flannery, Town Clerk of North Bay; James J. O'Connell, Mayor of North Bay; J. M. Magan, one of Sturgeon Falls; Dr. James of Sturgeon Falls; W. W. Pembroke, and one Gilbert of Pelee, Liberal organizers.
