IDRED HORSES BURNED

Chicago Fire Drives Many Famihies to Street - Suffragettes In Great Yarmouth, Eng., Burn Down \$100,000 Theatre

Suffragettes Burn Theatre

Great Yarmouth, Eng., April 17—The theatre on the Great Recreation here was burned today, the fire being caused by the explosion of a bomb left under a seat by a militant suffragette. At four o'clock this morning a violent explosion woke the inhabitants of Great Yarmouth and a few moments later the theatre at the end of the pier burst into finmes. It was recently rebuilt at a cost of \$100,000.

The usual suffrage literature was found strewn along the pier and on the beach and it was assumed that suffragettes had attended last night's performance in the theatre, and when they left placed under a seat a bomb with slow fuse attached.

Kempton Park, Eng., April 17—An unsuccessful attempt was made by a militant arson squad to burn the Empire Theatre n Kingston, a suburb, today. The fire was extinguished after \$15,000 damage had been done. All the scenery, stage fixtures and many costumes were destroyed.
