

OF THE

SYNOD OF HAMILTON AND LONDON,

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

HELD IN ST. THOMAS, ON

APRIL 9TH, 10TH AND 11TH, 1883.

At St. Thomas and within Knox Church there, the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three years, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London, of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after sermon by the retiring Moderator, the Rev. Walter Inglis, from 2nd Peter, 1st chapter, verse 18th, was duly constituted by prayer.

The Clerk then read the following roll, of all the Ministers within the bounds, with their Elders, as attested by the Presbytery Clerks:

Mr. McMullen, Convener of the Commission on the Kinloss Case, presented the report of said Commission, and laid on the table the minutes of their meeting, with the Congregations of South Kinloss and Lucknow, and the Presbytery of Maitland.

On motion of Mr. Laing, seconded by Mr. Henderson, the Minutes of Commission were received, and ordered to be engrossed in the Minutes of Synod. The minutes are as follows:—

Report and Minutes of the Commission of the Synod of Hamilton and London, on the Protests and Appeals of Mr. Duncan Cameron, Minister of Knox Church, Lucknow, against certain proceedings of the Presbytery of Maitland.

To the Reverend, the Synod :

Your Committee beg leave to report that they met in the Presbyterian Church, Kinloss, on the 9th day of May last, and that all the parties in the case were present, as well as a large assemblage of the Lucknow and Kinloss congregations. The following members of Commission were present, viz.: the Chairman with Messrs. Thompson, of Sarnia, and McDonald, of Seaforth, Ministers, and Messrs. Barr, of Norwich, and Walde, of Burlington, representative Elders.

Devotional exercises having been engaged in, the Commission called for the answer of the Kinloss Congregation to the recommendation of Synod to take into their favorable consideration the proposal made by Mr. Cameron to withdraw all his protests and appeals on condition that they build at the fourth concession. The answer of the Congregation was given in the negative.

The Commission therefore proceeded to hear the protest and complaint of Mr. Cameron against the Presbytery's receiving the report of Mr. Sutherland regarding what he had done in re-organizing the South Kinloss Congregation. The appeal was dismissed and the action of the Presbytery was sustained. All parties acquiesced in the decision.

The Commission then took up Mr. Cameron's protest and complaint, against the Presbytery's enjoining on the Sessions of Lucknow and Kinloss, to lay on the table at next meeting all Session Books in their possession.

After hearing the law of the Church explained in such case, ${\bf Mr.}$ Cameron withdrew his protest and complaint.

The Commission then heard the protest and complaint of the officebearers of Knox Church, Lucknow, against the Presbytery's

decision regarding their petition. The Commission sustained this protest and complaint, and declared that the Presbytery should have heard the petitioners before deciding to reject the petition. In this decision all the parties acquiesced.

The Commission then took up the reference from the Presbytery of Maitland anent Church Property, After lengthened deliberation the Commission, having sustained the Reference gave judgment as follows, viz.: That the Kinloss Congregation receive their church on the second concession and the eight acres of land more or less, and the manse, and pay to the Congregation of Knox Church, Lucknow, five hundred dollars and give them up all claim on the Lucknow church, it being at the same time understood that the cemetery shall be common to both congregations for use as a burying ground and that the care of it shall be with the Kinloss Congregation, and that all monies received for lots in the same, shall be applied for keeping the grounds in proper condition, and the Commission strongly recommend

The Commission then took up Mr. Cameron's protest and complaint against the Presbytery for supplying South Kinloss Congregation with Gospel Ordinances on the second concession of Kinloss. The Commission having learned with great satisfaction that the Kinloss Congregation will probably build a new church north of the present site, and the Chairman having appealed to Mr. Cameron to give favorable consideration to the announcement made, Mr. Cameron agreed to withdraw his protest, and so terminated the whole case.

APPLICATION FROM PRESBYTERY OF HURON.

There was read an application from the Presbytery of Huron, asking the Synod to grant leave to delete certain minutes of Presbytery.

Mr. McLean, the Presbytery Clerk, stated to the Synod the case referred to in the minutes. On motion of Mr. Laidlaw, seconded by Mr. McMullen, the request of the Presbytery was granted,

APPLICATION FROM STRATFORD PRESBYTERY, ANENT CERTAIN MINUTES.

There was laid upon the table of Synod an application from the Stratford Presbytery, asking that certain facts be engrossed upon the Records of Synod. bearing upon a former decision of Synod.

On the paper being read the Moderator ruled the request out of order, as it asked the reconsideration of a matter, decided at last

meeting of Synod.

Mr. Fotheringham appealed from the ruling of the Chair. The Moderator's ruling was sustained by a vote of eighty to one.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

The report on Sabbath Observance was called for. Mr. R. N. Grant, the Convener, having removed from the bounds of the Synod and the members of the Committee not having met during the year, it was agreed that this important matter be taken up, and discussed in connection with the Report on the State of Religion.

TEMPERANCE.

The Report from the Committee on Temperance, was read by Mr. Archibald McLean.

On motion of Mr. Battisby, seconded by Mr. Gordon, the report was received.

The recommendations of the Committee were then considered. In reference to the first recommendation, namely. "That the Synod give an expression of approval of the Crooks Act, as a step in the right direction," it was moved by Mr. A. McLean, seconded by Mr. Gordon, that the recommendation be adopted.

It was moved by Mr. Laing, in amendment, seconded by Mr. Mm. Robertson, that while legislation regulating and restricting the liquor traffic, by a system of license, may in view of the present state of public sentiment be a necessity, this Synod will hail with satisfaction any measure that may be adopted by our Legislators, Provincial or Dominion, in the direction of increased stringency of the regulations, under which licenses are granted, or which may otherwise depress or put an end to evils arising from the sale of intoxicating drinks." On the vote being taken 66 voted for the amendment and 54 for the motion. The yes and nays being called for, 69 voted yea on the amendment and 58 nay. The Synod then considered the second recommendation of the Committee, which was adopted unanimously, namely, "The Synod recommend Presbyteries, Sessions and members

in their private capacity, to oppose and resist any attempts to relax the laws now restraining the sale of intoxicating liquors, especially those relating to the early closing of saloons and hotels on Saturday night, but rather to see, as far as in them lies, that these laws be faithfully administered."

INVITATIONS TO THE SYNOD.

Invitations were read from Mr. Millar, the Principal of the Collegiate Institute, and the Rev. B. F. Austin, Principal of the Alma College, asking the members of Synod to visit these Institutions while in the city; also from the Secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association, offering the use of their reading room to the ministers while in the city. The Clerk was instructed to thank these gentlemen for their invitations.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again at 7.30 p. m., and the Sederunt was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

FOURTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, St. Thomas, April tenth, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, half-past seven o'clock p. m. The Synod again met and was duly constituted, the Moderator, Rev. A. D. McDonald and Mr. Mungo Fraser, M. A., engaging in devotional exercises.

On motion of Mr. McMullen, seconded by Mr. Laidlaw, the thanks of the Synod were tendered to Mr. McLeod and the Committee for the carefully prepared report now submitted, and that the recommendations of the Committee considered seriatim.

It was then moved by Mr. Burson, seconded by Mr. McMullen, that the report be adopted, and transmitted to the Convener of the Assembly's Committee on the State of Religion. The motion was carried unanimously.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

It was moved by Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Inglis, "The Synod deplore the continued prevalence of the public profanation of the Sabbath, especially on the Railways of the Province, and urge on all our people, to use their influence for the suppression of this great evil." The motion was carried.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again to-morrow morning at 9.30 a.m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

FIFTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, St. Thomas, April eleventh, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three. The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted by prayer and praise, conducted by the Moderator and Rev. Mr. Laing.

MINUTES SUSTAINED.

The Minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE' ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

Mr. McLean gave in the second report as to the order of business, which, on motion, was adopted.

BUXTON BUILDING FUND.

The report of the Buxton Building Fund was read, showing that \$260.89 had been received during the year, and paid to the Rev. Wm. King.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Laing, the report was received, thanks tendered to Mr. Battisby, the Convener, and the Committee, and the same Committee rappointed for the ensuing year. The Committee are as follows: Mr. J. R. Battisby, Convener, and Messrs. Walker and McCall Ministers; and Messrs. Urquhart, Gemmill and J. H. Taylor, Elders.

APPLICATION FROM STRATFORD PRESBYTERY.

There was read a Minute of Stratford Presbytery, held last evening, requesting the Synod to reconsider its decision anent the said Presbytery's Records.

Mr. Fotheringham and Mr. McAlpine were heard in support of the application.

On motion of Mr. Ball, seconded by Mr. Lachlan Cameron, the matter was remitted to a Committee, consisting of Messrs. Laing, Laidlaw, Battisby and W. A. McKay Ministers, and Mr. A. I. McKenzie, Elder; with power to call for parties and papers, and report at an early hour.

TRANSFERANCE OF THE CONGREGATION OF BERVIE FROM THE PRESBYTERY OF BRUCE TO THAT OF MAITLAND.

Extract Minutes of the Presbyteries of Bruce and Maitland were read, asking that the Congregation of Bervie, be transferred from the Presbytery of Bruce, to that of Maitland. All parties being agreed in the request, the Synod unanimously granted the transference of the said congregation from the Presbytery of Bruce to that of Maitland.

TRANSFERENCE OF THE CONGREGATION OF TROWBRIDGE, FROM STRATFORD PRESBYTERY, TO THE PRESBYTERY OF MAITLAND.

Extract Minutes of the Presbyteries of Maitland and Stratford were read, asking that the congregation of Trowbridge be transferred from the Presbytery of Stratford to that of Maitland.

As all parties were agreed in the request, the Synod unanimously decided, that the said congregation of Trowbridge should be transferred from the Presbytery of Stratford to that of Maitland.

THE BIBLE IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Mr. McMullen, acting convener of the committee appointed by last Synod to wait upon the Ontario Government, with a view to have the Bible used as a class book in the public schools of the Province, gave in their report.

After remarks from several of the members of the deputation appointed by last Synod, and other members of Court, it was moved by Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Chrystal, That the report be received, thanks given the Committee, and especially to Mr. McMullen, for their diligence in prosecuting the work committed to their hands, and that the Committee be re-appointed, with instructions to continue their efforts in the direction indicated by the Synod's resolution of last year, Mr. McMullen to be convener.

The motion was carried unanimously. Mr. Wm. Robertson, of Chesterfield, was allowed to enter his dissent.

NEXT MEETING OF SYNOD.

Mr. Gray moved that the next meeting of Synod be held in Chatham.

Mr. A. D. McDonald (who had left the chair for the time) moved, seconded by Mr. McCoy, that the next meeting be held in the First Presbyterian Church, Seaforth. SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

Mr. Mungo Fraser, M. A.. Convener of the Committee on Sabbath Schools, gave in the Report for the past year. On motion of Mr. Gustavus Munro, duly seconded, the Report was received and adopted, and the thanks of the Synod tendered to the Convener and Committee for their diligence, and the report transmitted to the Convener of the Assembly's Committee on Sabbath Schools.

LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Mr W. S. Ball gave in the Report of the Committee on the Licensing of Students, recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Stratford to take Mr. James Ballantyne on trials for License; and to the Presbytery of Huron to take Mr. R. M. Craig, on trials for license. The Synod granted the leave asked, in both cases.

During the discussion of this question the hour of adjournment, arrived, and the Synod adjourned, to meet again at 2.30 p.m.

SIXTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, St. Thomas, April eleventh, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, half-past two p. m.

The Synod again met, and was duly constituted, Rev. A. D. Mc Donald, Moderator; Mr. W. A. McKay, at the request of the Moderator, engaging in prayer.

MINUTES SUSTAINED.

The Minutes of former Sederunt were read and sustained.

The Synod resumed consideration of the overture on Psalmody, from the Presbytery of Chatham.

The following motion, moved by Mr. D. D. McLeod, and seconded by Mr. J. L. OVERTURE ANENT ORDAINED MISSIONARY SUPPLY.

An overture from the Presbytery of Hamilton, anent ordained missionary supply in aid-receiving congregations, was read, and Messrs. Yeomans and Goldsmith heard in its support. After consideration, it was agreed to transmit the overture simpliciter for the consideration of the next General Assembly.

OVERTURE ANENT TIME SERVICE IN THE ELDERSHIP.

An overture from Mr. Lyle, requesting the Synod to overture the General Assembly in favor of time service in the Eldership, instead of their being elected for life, was read. Mr. Laing, who had been requested by Mr. Lyle to explain the nature of the overture, was heard. The overture was received. On motion of Mr. McMullen, seconded by Mr. Cuthbertson, the following motion was adopted: The Synod having heard an overture by Mr. Lyle, and being informed of his necessary absence through sickness, express sympathy with him, and agree that the overture be laid on the table for fuller consideration next year, it being, however, understood that Mr. Lyle's liberty to overture the Assembly be not hereby interfered with.

PRESBYTERY RECORDS.

The Committees appointed to examine the records of the Presbyteries of Hamilton, Paris, London, Sarnia, Chatham, Huron, Stratford, Mattland and Bruce, reported the same as carefully and correctly kept, and the Records were ordered to be attested in accordance with said Reports.

TREASURER'S ACCOUNTS.

Mr. Thompson (Sarnia), Convener of the Committee appointed to examine and audit the Treasurer's books, reported that they had done so, and found everything correct. The report was received, and the thanks of the Synod tendered to Mr. Rutherford, the Treasurer, for his efficient service during the year.

RECORDS OF STRATFORD PRESBYTERY.

Mr. Laing, from the Committee appointed to examine the records of the Stratford Presbytery, gave in their report, which on motion was adopted, and ordered to be engrossed in the Minutes.

After full examination of the record, and explanations from the representatives of Presbytery, the Committee find

1. That the minutes of six successive meetings, from July 5th to January 12th, are engrossed before those of two meetings held in April and May preceding; and that while this misplacement is noted in the margin of the record, there are no such notes at the close of the minutes of January 12th and May 11th, showing their chronological order and connection, which makes it very difficult to follow the chronological order of the business, especially in that part of the record which embodies the Decision of the Commission of Synod.

2. That the decision of the Commission of Synod is engrossed on page 216 of the Record.

3. That the minutes which the Presbytery was instructed to delete have not been deleted; but that the Presbytery evidently wished to comply with the instruction of the Synod, and the Committee recommend that the Presbytery be instructed to put a marginal note on the record, at the commencement of the case disposed of by the commission, directing attention to the decision on page 216, and that the minutes referred to be scored over with red ink.

4. That considering the fact that the Minutes were not attested last year, the attestation for this year shall include the substance of this report.

OVERTURE ON RAISING MONEYS.

The overture in regard to modes of raising moneys, referred by the Assembly to the Synods, was allowed to lie on the table until next meeting of Synod.

VOTES OF THANKS.

It was moved by Mr. Thompson, of Sarnia, duly seconded, and unanimously carried, that the thanks of the Synod are due to the minister and office-bearers of Knox Church, St. Thomas, for the use of their building, and the excellent arrangements made; to the christian people of the city, for their generous hospitality, and to the Grand Trunk, Canada Southern, and Credit Vallcy Railways, for reduced fares to the members of Synod.

ADJOURNMENT.

The business of the Synod having beer concluded, the Moderator declared the Synod adjourned, to meet in the First Presbyterian Church of Seaforth, on the second Monday of April, eighteen hundred and eighty-four, at half-past seven o'clock in the evening.

The Moderator then pronounced the benediction.
