BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor, Aldermen and commonalty of the City of Fredericton, as 1. So much of sub-section nine of section one of "A Law to regulate the issue of Miscellaneous Licenses in the City of Fredericton," passed and enacted on the 30th day of June, A. D. 1876, as relates to the vending or canvassing for sale of marble or stone monuments or ornaments, be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof any person vending or canvassing for sale of marble or stone monuments within the City, shall pay a license fee of twenty dollars, such fee to entitle the person paying the same to a License for one year from date of payment, or until he may be assessed as a resident of the City.


