preventing the undue Colleging and Delivery of Letters by Pzivate Polls, Carriers, Piglers, Watermen, Drivers of Stage: Coaches, and other Persons, as all other Francs to which the Revenue might otherwise be liable; which cannot be well and properly done, to answer the Ends aforesaid, without Authosity of Parliament in a Mew Aa to be made for the faid Office, and for the Revenues to arise thereby: The therefore Pour Pajesties most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Commons of Great Britain in Patliament Allembled, Do most humbly be-Former Acts in feech Pour Pajelly, that it may be Enaded; And be it Enaded by the Queens most Excellent Pajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this present Parliament Assembled, and by Authority of the same.
