A LARGE and influential meeting of the electors of Red Point, Lot 46 and adjacent settlements was held on the 7th inst., when matters of general interest were discussed. A resolution was unanimously passed calling upon the Dominion Government to construct a harbor of refuge at Red Point, and also urging upon the Imperial Government, in case no new trade relations with the United States be negotiated, the necessity of strictly protecting the rights of our fishermen, and of rigidly enforcing the provisions of the Convention of 1818 between Great Britain and the United States.

Farnell at Tipperary. Farnell addressed a meeting in Tipperary last week evening. He said, the men of Tipperary asked him to unfurl the banner of the league there. The movement had become historic and had proved of great service to the Irish people. A similar point in the history of Ireland had now been reached. What agitation had already gained was infinitesimal, as compared with the full reward to be secured by it. Farnell said he believed that the great power of franchise reform conferred a much larger extension than the present day rents of the land country, which meant bankruptcy, would give them. Landlords would soon disappear when really fair rents were obtained. He looked forward to the extension of the franchise not to give laborers a share in their national heritage, and advised the tenant farmers in justice to the laborers, to avoid taxation. It was impossible, he declared, for home rule to be long delayed.
