Canada will exhibit at Chicago next year, and some further particulars in reference to this gigantic specimen of our dairy pro-ducts are now given. The cheese was made at the Dominion experiment dairy station at Perth under direction of Prof. Robertson, dairy commissioner, and will certainly rank as the mammoth cheese of the world. It weighs over 22,000 pounds and contains the card of a day's milk from 10,000 cows. A gigantic oaken press was erected for the purpose of constructing the cheese and 200 tons of pressure was applied. The mould or hoop is made of steel boiler plate, five sixteenths of an inch thick.
