s. sforal series of ererilizer experiments in connection with the use of completet fertiizers compared with the results
from materias which contain but one elment of plant food only more particularly Nitrate of Soda and Acid
Phote. These experiments have covered a large number of cases and we have laid particular emphasis on a 25 year
xperiment on a rotation in crops in Ohio. Experiments of one year and of two and three years are as a rule of very little importance as most soils
be reang reanably ietile may respond to certain treatment for a year or two but if this treatment is continued ior
a series of five, ten or fifteen years the results then may be entirly different. This is one of the most timportant considerations ine the use of fertitiizer as a farm cannot be renemed. like
a building in a single season and above all it must be used in such $a$ way as to increase its fertility rather than to
deplete it. These experiments are the most comprehensive we can find and all point to the same conclusion wbich is
that the best enutlts on any crop are obtained by the use of a complete fertilizer containing Ammonia, Phosphoric
Acid and Potash. Another series is reported in a bulletin from Pennsylvania covering an apple orchard. These cover six-
different experiments over a period of five years divided into groups of three plots each. In the first of the series:
