A DOG-IN-THE-MANGER POLICY.

In yesterday's Globe Mr. Pearson, managing director of the Consumers' Gas Company, answered The World's editorial of the previous day, which showed that the public was entitled to a reduction in the price of gas. From Mr. Pearson's statement it would appear that the company had about all it could do to make both ends meet. But in spite of his pessimistic view of the company's business, the fact remains that the company has such a plethora of funds on its hands all the time that it does not know how to get rid of them. The annual statement that is published by the company is apparently intended to conceal the profits of the business, which are enormous. But Mr. Pearson, as we are aware when he states that the question of reducing the price of gas will be discussed in the spring when the contracts are made for coal and oil. We are led to believe that if the price of these commodities does not rise very much by that time a reduction in the price of gas will be declared. According to the company's annual statement the cost of coal and oil for the past year was \$194,000 in round numbers, and the sale of coke, tar and ammonia amounted to \$64,000, making the net cost of coal and oil about \$130,000. This is just 20 per cent of the amount received from the gas sold. The company's raw material costs just 20 per cent of its receipts, so that a moderate rise in the price of these materials would not materially affect the cost price of gas. Shareholders in the company cannot receive more than 10 per cent dividends. This is the measure of their interest in the company. It would pay the city handsomely to guarantee this dividend to the shareholders and take over the gas works and have the business run in the interest of the people. Under municipal management the price of gas would soon drop 25 per cent, even allowing the shareholders their 10 per cent. The directors of the company are playing a dog-in-the-manger policy, neither being in a position to benefit themselves nor allowing the public to participate in the profits of the business.

THE LANDSOWE CROSSING.

The decision of the Railway Committee, insisting on the construction of a subway or overhead bridge at the Landsowe crossing is a satisfactory ruling as far as the railways are concerned, but it is not at all acceptable to the city of Toronto. If the city is to be called upon to diminish the number of grade crossings the most dangerous ones should be proceeded with first. There are other grade crossings in the city much more important and dangerous than the Landsowe crossing. There are several such in South Parkdale, where the grade crossings at the Don and farther east on Queen-street are much more dangerous on account of the large vehicular and pedestrian traffic at these points. If an overhead crossing or a subway is necessary at the Landsowe crossing, much more necessary is a subway at the C.P.R. crossing, Yonge-street. Under the circumstances a better decision would have been to allow a grade crossing at Landsowe-avenue on condition of the abolishing of the really dangerous and extensive crossings in other sections of the city. We believe in the gradual elimination of all grade crossings, but the most dangerous ones should be abolished first. If the city is obliged to spend \$75,000 or \$100,000, let it be spent where it will do the most good. Such a policy would be in the interest of the railways and the city.

THE CITY OF HALIFAX.

The Board of Trade, Halifax, are circulating a special edition of The Industrial Advocate, descriptive of the advantages of Halifax as a shipping and commercial centre. The distribution of the volume throughout Canada cannot fail to prove of advantage to the city. One thing the Halifaxians keep constantly in view is the selection of their port as the Canadian terminal of the fast Atlantic service, which is bound to become a reality in the course of a few years. Halifax is undoubtedly the best harbor on the North Atlantic coast, if indeed it is not the best harbor in the world. It is open every day in the year and every hour in the day. The course across the Atlantic to Halifax is perfectly clear, and a steamer can sail at highest speed from the time she reaches the open ocean from British ports until she comes within less than half an hour's run of Halifax. It would be quite easy for a steamer sailing at the same speed as steamers now sail between Liverpool and New York to make Halifax in four days. From Halifax the time to the rest of the continent could be greatly reduced, so that it would be possible for a train to reach Montreal, Boston or even New York under twenty-four hours, while the great centres of the Middle West and the West could also be brought within a comparatively short journey in point of time by making sharp connections with the fast trains which run between various important American centres. The advantage of this would not be a saving of time only, for it would cut off a large part of the ocean journey, which most people would desire, especially those who have not been much accustomed to travelling by water.
