which was on an average 48 per cent. higher than our original cable. It was a marvelous thing that in the Supreme Court there were found only 16 votes out of a total voting strength of 100 to oppose the recommendation, notwithstanding that at the time the old premium rates were giving us from \$25,000 to \$40,000 of a surplus each month...

That they were wise in their course is fully shown by the fact that the National Fraternal Congress adopted and recommended a table of rates which was practically identical with the new I.O.F. rates, and to-day some of the states of the United States are enacting laws refusing to permit any new fraternal society to do business within the State unless it complies with the National Fraternal Congress, while a number of other States are doing the same at the present time to enact similar laws.

So much for the order. Let me now very briefly direct your attention to the public history of the I.O.F. in America, and you will see that it continued under American auspices for seven years.

After its organization its progress was every day more rapid. It took us five long years to secure the first 5000 members and the first \$50,000 of surplus. We were so proud of this achievement that we made the password for the then current term "Fifty thousand dollars."

But we had the satisfaction of having some of the public journals of the country begin to show stones and sticks at us. For instance, in 1887, The Monetary Times in quite a lengthy article, intended to do us wrong, said among other things:

"During the year, from July, 1881, to July, 1886, it took us five long years to secure the first 5000 members, and only \$10,000 for the following year ending July 1, 1884. But from August, 1884, to June 30, 1885, a period of only five months, no less than \$12,000 has been called for, being at the rate of \$25,000 per annum, or nearly three times what it averaged hitherto. We recommended the 'big bang' at the head of the new movement, and our little tomahawk cut out that 'Old Mortality' down."

As a matter of fact, I had already taken the advice of The Monetary Times by placing Dr. Millman in charge of the medical department, with the result that the mortality of over 10 in the 1000 existing in the order the year before reorganization was reduced, ten years afterwards, to 4.60 in the 1000. I need not tell you that we were very proud of such a cutting down of the mortality, and we supposed that rock bottom had been almost reached; but judge of our gratification when we discovered that the death rate dropping still lower, to 2.25 in the 1000. When, however, we got the figures for the following year and found the death rate to be only 0.47 in the 1000, we began to think if this thing went on much longer we should reach a time when deaths in the order would disappear altogether.

It is a source of real pride and satisfaction to me to know that I initiated Dr. Millman into the order, and that I gave up the position of medical referee to an capable and efficient successor as he has proved himself to be, although I am bound to tell you that the death in the order averaged only 3.1 a month while I was in charge, and they now number about 80 or 90 per month, and now even to the present time we are cutting "that old mortality down" in its progress in the order, as pointed out by C. H. E. Row, F.R.S., F.R.S.E., A.A., the distinguished British actuary, of London, England, who said in a recent letter:

"I have been very much interested in the actual mortality recently experienced by the order, as below the expected by the H. M. table, 25 per cent. below the expected by Millin's table, 10 per cent. below the expected by the new N.F.C. table. It was about the end of the first septennial period after the reorganization of the order that we felt strong enough to go to Parliament and ask for an Act of Incorporation. It is needless to say this aroused the most bitter opposition on the part of the managers of the old line companies, and a committee of these managers was present before the Banking and Finance Committee of the House of Commons doing their best to defeat the Foresters' Bill. But they failed ignominiously. The Act as it appears in the book of the constitution and bylaws of the order was passed by Parliament and assented to by the Queen on the 2nd May, 1889. The warfare of the government was now carried into the daily press, but the only result of these attacks was that the order received thousands of dollars' worth of free advertising. During the next to third septennial period the order grew to a membership of 84,020, with the 'surplus' fund in the treasury had increased to the princely sum of \$1,969,375.46. It was about this time that the Executive Council decided to go again to Parliament and ask for certain enlarged powers, and a general election coming on, my colleague, Mr. John A. McMillan, our Supreme Secretary, was asked to contest seat in North Ontario in order that we might have a friend at court. It is a matter of history how he 'walked' through North Ontario to Parliament with a majority of over 700. The first bill as introduced by the Executive Council of the I.O.F. not only limited the maximum policy of the order to \$2000, but it also provided provisions for a deposit with the Government and for proper inspection of
