FIRST EDITION. LONDON'S NEW MYSTERY.

DETECTIVE OF A WELL-KNOWN DOCTOR'S DEATH.

It may be a case of Murder—Dr. Knowles Townsend and his wife were to have sailed from London yesterday for New York. He has a brother living in Virginia and he wishes to visit him.

NEW YORK. The week winds up a tragic poisoning case which possesses every element of mystery and romance. Whether it is murder or double suicide, London does not know today, though possibly the inquest, which is to be held to-night may shed some light. So far the police refuse to divulge any facts in their possession. What is known is the result of the individual efforts of reporters. Dr. Knowles Townsend, living in Lewisham high road, and Mrs. Townsend were booked and managed on the Ludgate Hill, which sailed from the Thames today for New York. Townsend had sold his practice and was going to Virginia to join his brother. In order to be near the vessel and get his baggage aboard early they took a motor car to Park road, near the docks, last night. Townsend left his wife in the room to send the baggage, while he went to the vessel to receive it. Less than one hour after he left, two men drove up to house in motor car, and the other a friend who had come to assist. They were admitted and proceeded to the bedroom. Entering the room, Townsend was taken to the bed, fully dressed, apparently asleep, and another man in an inebriated condition half-way under the bed. One of the men called attention to the peculiar odor of the man's skin and felt his pulse which was still. He expressed the opinion that he was dead. The attempt then made to arouse Mrs. Townsend was unsuccessful. There were no marks of violence, no indication of a struggle.

Inquiry revealed that soon after the husband left Mrs. Townsend was visited by William De La Motte, a Frenchman, who was a friend of her husband. At that time he had always been treated more as a brother than a friend, and though always an ardent admirer of Mrs. Townsend there had been no indication of anything improper.
