Persistent Rumors at Vera Cruz that He Will Quit

FEELING AGAINST HIM STRONG IN THE CAPITAL.

Peace Envoys Ask U. S. and presentatives to Washington-Carranza Refuses to Cease War on Federals.

The disappearance from the Mexican cabinet of Portillo Y. Rojas, the foreign minister, coupled with reports that there is a growing undercurrent of feeling in Mexico City against the Huerta government, is interpreted here as foreshadowing a change in the situation in the federal capital. Some of the closest observers here of the government's situation express an inclination to the view that Senor Portillo's resignation may clear the way eventually for the appointment of a foreign minister who underthe Mexican constitution could succeed General Huerta as president. In these quarters it is pointed out that while Carranza declined to treat with Huerta he might consent to enter into negotiations with his successor and thus facilitate mediation.

The effect of the continued rebel victories in the north, and the out come of the pending attack on Tampico may, according to well-informed nopinion, bring about a rapid change in Mexico City.

Huerta Fooled People by False Rev

Mexico City, May 1—It is reported here that a tripartite agreement to an armistice was signed here this morning by representatives of the United States, the federals and the rebels. Jose Manuel Cardoso De Oliveira, the Brazilian minister, confirmed the report, except as to the actual signing of the agreement.

Veha Cruz, May 3.—Persistent reports continue to circulate here that General Huerta intends to retire from the provisional presidency of Mexico on conditions that he be assured a safe conduct to a port and placed on board a foreign warship.

It is declared in some Mexican quarters in this city that General Huerta was ready to resign a week ago but was prevented from doing so by internal dissensions in his cabinet.



ADVISES AGAINST FANTASTIC VAGARIES

London, May 4.—Prince Arthur of Connaught withheld the Royal approval from futurist art in a speech at the Royal Academy dinner on Satun day night. Responding to the Roya toast, after allusions to the visit of the King and Queen to Paris and the losses the academy had sustained by deaths, he expressed his opinion of the high standard of British art at the present moment.

"In England," he said, "we move slowly and do not easily take up new ideas, but herein lies the safety of the fruter of art in this country. I hope I am not treading on dangerous ground and I do not wish to curb legitimate originality or true inspiration of artistic sense, but would it not be prudent for some of the new schools of art to follow more closely in the cotsteps of the great masters instead of indulging in fantastic vagaries such as are seen occasionally in exhibitions of modern art."

The Prince added the hope that the sound sense of the academy would teep the rank and file of artists from indulging artistic license to an externe.







Mullin's Big League Debut made 12 years ago today.

George Emmett Mullin, who was once, and that not so very long ago, one of the pitching stars of the American League, made his debut on the rubber in a Detroit uniform twelve years ago today. The twirling recruit was sent out on the mound to replace Blever, who was becoming wabbly, and pitched so effectively that the Tigers defeated Cleveland by a score of 2 to 1. Mullin was born in Toledo in 1880, and played his first ball with St. John's Academy in his native city. He was only seventeen when he became a professional player with Wabash, in the Indiana State League. In 1900 he played with South Bend, and in 1901 he wore a Fort Wayne uniform. There he was discovered by scouts of both the National and American leagues, which were not so friendly then as now, Just to be on the safe side, Mullin signed with clubs of both leagues, Brooklyn in the National and Detroit in the American. After weighing the pros and cons, he decided to cast in his fortunes with the new organization, and on May 4, 1902, appeared on the mound with a Tiger uniform clothing his six feet and half an inch of manly form.
