

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th NOVEMBER, 1861.

In submitting the usual statements of the business for the past year, the Directors have much pleasure in congratulating the Stockholders on the favorable results they present.

The particulars of the several accounts in detail which have been duly examined and certified by the auditors and submitted herewith, will, the Directors trust, be found satisfactory.

The receipts for premiums how an advance of about thirty-eight per cent on that of any previous year.

The following, in abstract, presents the business for the year:—

Of the Funds on hand at the close of the last, and received during the current year, there has been added to the Investments of the Company, viz.:--

Loans on Mortgage, interest 8 per cent. \$12,600 00 County Municipal Debentures, interest 6 per cent. 5,116 00

During the year two dividends equal to ten per cent. have been declared, leaving an ample reserve to meet the ordinary contingency on outstanding risks.

The disastrous fire at Lindsay forms about one-third of the whole year's losses. The several claims resulting from this calamity were, on the usual proofs of loss, settled without delay.

The business at the several Agencies has been carefully examined, with a view to more perfect efficiency—and new Agencies opened where such were considered advisable—the result has so far been on the whole most satisfactory. At Montreal a Board of Local Directors has been established, which, for the short time the office under this arrangement has been in operation, promises to add materially to the extension of business in that city.

Your Directors do not consider it necessary to allude specially to any other matter in their Report, but will have much pleasure in supplying any further information that may be desired. It will then remain to proceed to the Election of Directors for the current year.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

To the President and Directors of the Western Assurance Company:

Gentlemen,—We have respectfully to report that we have this day completed the Audit of the Books, Accounts, &c., &c., of the Company, for the fiscal year ending 30th November, 1861, and we have pleasure in repeating the statement made last year, that every transaction with its accompanying record in the books, and its corresponding voucher has been found regular and correct, reflecting great credit upon the officials of the Company in general.

As the result of our labors, as Auditors, we herewith report various statements in detail, all of which will be found embodied in one general statement, exhibiting in a comprehensive form, the business transactions of the Company during the past year, and the condition of its affairs at the present time. All these documents have been carefully compared with, and checked by, the books of the office, after the same had been first duly audited. As these several statements sufficiently explain themselves, we submit them to your consideration without further remark on our part.

Notwithstanding the severe losses, amounting to not less than \$17,600, which the Company sustained through the calamitous fire at Lindsay, the Auditors have pleasure in observing that the increased business done during the past

year has enabled the Directors—preserving at the same time due regard for the security of the Policy-holders—to declare a dividend of ten per cent. for the year on paid-up capital; a result which cannot fail to be satisfactory to the Shareholders, while at the same time it reflects much credit on the continued good management of the Directors and Officers of the Company.
