For each additional person	0.15
For each passenger to or from any railway station in the City, between 8 o'clock a.m. to 9 o'clock p.m.....	0.25
For each passenger to or from any railway station in the City, between 9 o'clock p.m. and 8 o'clock a.m.....	0.50
By the hour, from any point within the City limits to any other point or points within the said limits, for the first hour	1.00
For each additional hour	0.50
Unless the number of passengers exceeds two adults and one child over the age of 14 years, in which case the charge for each additional hour shall be	1.00
From any point within the City limits to any point without the City limits, but not more than three miles beyond the same, per hour	1.00

Any time over the hour to be charged in half hour fractions at 25 cents per fraction. And any licensed cabman or driver exacting or taking any greater price or rate than the foregoing, except as in the By-law relating to cabmen provides, shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of the By-law, and shall be dealt with accordingly.
