

Supports the cause of Architecture, rather than that of Architects.

Supports the establishment of a proper course of Architecture at the University with other facilities, such as an Architectural Museum, Library, etc., as will assist the Student to attain the University standard or develop his abilities to the utmost.

Supports the founding of Societies of Architects having for their object the cause of Architecture, to which members shall be admitted by reason of their ability and reputation and not by examination.

Supports the establishment of proper building laws for the protection of the public against badly constructed buildings.

Opposes the idea of a close corporation of Architects as establishing an inferior standard of qualification and not affording due protection to the public.

The Toronto Society of Architects

A BOUT ten years ago, January, 1899, some of the younger architects of Toronto arranged to meet at lunch time once a week, and talk about architecture.

In getting together they had no intention of pursuing a definite policy, but before many meetings had taken place, they came to the conclusion that their interests lay in whatever affected the cause of architecture rather than in what interfered with the privileges of architects.

In 1899 the Architectural League of America was formed in the United States, and an invitation sent to Toronto asking the architects of the city to send a representative. This invitation was passed on to the President of the O. A. A., but they declined it. The younger architects came to the conclusion that it would be a mistake to miss the advantages to be obtained by being in intimate touch with architects of all the different States of America, therefore, they formed themselves into a club, and sent Mr. J. P. Hynes as a delegate to the first convention of the Architectural League of America, held at Cleveland in June.

In the Fall of 1899 a constitution was devised and adopted, and the Club named The Toronto Architectural Eighteen Club, limiting its membership to eighteen. Since then the Club has sent representatives to every convention of the League.

The next important business affecting the welfare of architecture discussed at the meetings of the Eighteen Club was the action of the Architectural Association of Ontario, who, under a charter obtained from the Government of Ontario, sought to compel any one using the name of architect to register as a member of their association. They were unable to obtain that privilege, but obtained the right to call themselves "Registered Architects," which distinction very few, if any, of their members in the last ten or fifteen years seem desirous of advertising.

The members of the Club considered that the examination which the O. A. A. established to examine the qualification of architects for registration, put before the public such an imperfect idea of an architect that it became a serious obstacle in the way of obtaining a desirable system of architectural education, and so, instead of being a power to raise, really threatened to lower the standing of the profession in the community.

Therefore, the Club decided to make the first object of its existence the obtaining of better education for architects, for they believed that while it was practically impossible to invent a scheme of examination which would guarantee that those it passed were architects fit to practice, yet it was possible to devise a good scheme of architectural education.

In January, 1900, when the Ontario Association of Architects held its annual convention, they invited the members of the Club to attend and criticize. The Club embodied its ideas in a paper, and read the paper at one of the meetings of the convention. This paper was published in the February number of *The Canadian Architect* for 1900.

At the second convention of the League in Chicago in the following year, June, 1900, the different clubs were asked to report on the work they had done in the previous year; with the report from Toronto, Mr. Hynes read a paper on "Education" by Mr. Eden Smith.

The Circuit Exhibition of the Architectural League of America is a selection from a collection of architectural drawings contributed for exhibition at the annual exhibition of the different clubs of the League. These drawings are sent on to such of the other clubs of the League as wish to include them in their own exhibitions. At the Chicago Convention Mr. Hynes secured the circuit drawings for 1901 for exhibition in Toronto.

Several times during the year of 1900 a joint committee of the Ontario Association of Architects and the Toronto Architectural Eighteen Club, met to discuss a scheme of education. The discussion came to nothing, as at this time no architectural discussion on any matter ever got beyond the proposition for compulsory registration.

In January, 1901, the Club held its first exhibition of Architectural Drawings. Beside the circuit drawings of the Architectural League of America, the Club obtained the drawings of the Pan-American Exhibition proposed to be held at Buffalo in 1902; a lecture on "Municipal Improvement" was read by Mr. A. Kelsey, and other entertainments given.

The convention of the Architectural League of America this year (1901) was held at Philadelphia. Mr. Hynes and Mr. Rae attended as delegates from Toronto, and invited the League to hold its next convention in Toronto, which invitation was accepted. In this year the first studio classes were commenced in the Academy rooms, but were given up after a few seasons principally on account of the inconvenience of the rooms.

In 1902 the Club held its second exhibition and at the same time the Architectural League of America held its annual convention in Toronto.

The third exhibition of the Club was held in January, 1903, Mr. W. Rae being then president. The exhibition was principally one of photos of

architecture. During this exhibition Mr. R. A. Cram gave a lecture on Church Building.

The fourth exhibition held by the Club was in 1905. In the Fall of this year a deputation from the Club waited on the University Commission to advocate the establishment of a special course in architecture at the University, and that a plan be made outlining a comprehensive scheme for grouping the University buildings. (See letter at end).

During this year joint committees of the Ontario Association of Architects and the Club met to discuss such changes in the constitution of the Ontario Association of Architects as would make possible an amalgamation, but the changes proposed by the Toronto Architectural Eighteen Club were considered too drastic and this matter was dropped. (See report at end).

1907—This year the Club decided to make provision to increase its membership and in order to do so changed its constitution and at the same time its name to the Toronto Architectural Club. At the League convention this year held at Washington, Mr. J. P. Hynes was elected president of the Architectural League of America, and the Toronto Architectural Club became the executive club of the League till the next convention held in Detroit in September, 1908.

In January, 1908, the Ontario Association of Architects sent a deputation to the Toronto University to ask the University to undertake the business of examining candidates for registration with the Ontario Association of Architects. The Club obtained permission to put its views before the University on the same occasion. Mr. Eden Smith, Mr. J. C. B. Horwood and Mr. J. P. Hynes, representing the Toronto Architectural Club, gave a clear statement of the idea of the Club on education. The University decided that it could not examine where it did not educate, and so far this matter fell through.

Later on in 1908 the Ontario Association of Architects made arrangements to get a bill through the Provincial Legislature demanding the licensing of architects. Before the bill came to the Legislature the Club interviewed Dr. Pyne, the Minister of Education, and put its views on this subject before him, and sent representatives, as also did the University of Toronto, to oppose the measure when it should be brought before the Parliamentary Committee on Bills. The bill was withdrawn at the request of the committee till the architects should agree.

In January, 1909, the Ontario Association of Architects again put the subject of Architects' License Bill before its members at the Convention in Toronto. Mr. J. C. B. Horwood, Vice-President of the Club, was asked by the Ontario Association of Architects to read a letter he had written to the Editor of *Construction* on this subject.

The members of the Ontario Association of Architects did not receive the reports of the Committee on Architects' License favourably, or support the proposal to obtain legislation compelling registration. THE COURSE IN ARCHITECTURE

THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO COMMISSION:

SIRS :-

When we appeared before you we brought to your attention the need, first, of a special course in Architecture; and, secondly, of a comprehensive plan for grouping of the University Buildings.

Our position rests upon the broad ground that Architecture is one of the great educational and refining influences in life; it is therefore entitled to a place in the curriculum of the University, and also to consideration when the buildings of the University are being designed and given their place in the University property.

First. "A special course in Architecture." This is required, as there are now within reach of the University a considerable number of Architectural students, who having started in offices, are unable to leave them and give four years to University work; indeed for some time to come, students in Architecture will find their way into offices before awakening to the value of an academic course of study.

In Toronto, Architecture has not been studied hitherto as an art but rather as a science. This is very forcibly illustrated by the University of Toronto Calendar for 1905-6, page 239. In contrast we quote the following from Columbia College Calendar:—

"The University thus recognizes that Architecture is primarily a fine art, although requiring for its practice a considerable amount of scientific training." Page 9, Bulletin, June 3rd, 1905.

Columbia, Pennsylvania, Cornell, Harvard, and other Universities have special courses in Architecture for students who have spent some time in Architects' offices. The University of Toronto might inaugurate such a course, so arranged that students could attend lectures early in the morning and late in the afternoon as do those now attending Osgoode Hall.

These Universities have also ateliers or studios. We cannot too strongly recommend the establishment of a studio at the University of Toronto. The studios at the Universities mentioned are in a measure independent of the University course in Architecture, they are generally in

charge of a practising Architect, who sets problems that the students study under his criticism and guidance.

In the course proposed here the student should have Junior Matriculation in Mathematics, should have spent two years in an Architect's office, and should be eighteen years of age. He should attend early morning and late afternoon lectures on subjects which are best taught in this way, and in the evening he should work in the studio.

In Toronto to-day there are more than sixty-five students in Architecture, whose only opportunity for study is the mathematical classes conducted by the Joint Committee of the Ontario Association of Architects and the Toronto Architectural Eighteen Club. In the offices they simply do the routine work, which might be called the craft of Architecture, while the art of Architecture is left to the mercy of chance. The result of this state of affairs is deplorable, and can be rectified by the course we suggest.

Second. "A comprehensive plan for the grouping of the University Buildings." Since Architecture is admittedly an educational and refining influence, the University is the place above all places where the greatest effort should be made to maintain a high standard of it.

European Universities have never failed to recognize this truth, and Oxford has given the inspiration to the men who have recently erected the buildings of high Architectural merit at Pennsylvania and Princeton.

The University of Toronto is extremely fortunate in having as its original building a recognized achievement in Architecture. Unfortunately this model has not been followed.

The Hon. Mr. Edward Blake, when Chancellor of the University, in his address at the opening of the so-called course in Architecture, referred to the original building as an inspiring example, and to the School of Science building as "An example of what not to do."

It is not sufficient that each building in connection with the University should be in itself a creditable Architectural structure, but that it should also harmonize completely with its fellow buildings; moreover, the same economy should be shown in the arrangement of all the buildings on the University property as is shown in the design of each.

The importance of prompt action in the systematic arrangement of the University grounds cannot be too strongly emphasized at the present moment, since the proposed residences may be placed so as to cause greater difficulty in carrying out a comprehensive scheme.

It is essential to the University in preparing its members for well ordered and beautiful lives to show order and beauty in its external appearance.

REPORT OF JOINT COMMITTEE

Moved by E. Burke, seconded by W. L. Symons, that in connection with the proposed amalgamation with the Eighteen Club, that this Association instruct the Council to arrange with the Club on the basis of the following amendments to the Charter of the O. A. A., and also to apply to the Legislature for such amendments.

Proposed revision of the Charter of the Ontario Association of Architects as amended by a Committee of the Association and of the Toronto Architectural Eighteen Club.

Omit preamble and substitute the following:

"Whereas it is deemed expedient for the furtherance and advancement of the Art of Architecture in the Province."

After section 4, insert section 4A as follows:

There shall be three grades of membership entitled, respectively, "Associates of the Ontario Association of Architects" (abbreviated A.O.A.A.).

"Members of the Ontario Association of Architects" (abbreviated M.O.A.A),

"Fellows of the Ontario Association of Architects" (abbreviated F.O.A.A.).

ASSOCIATES.

Associates shall be admitted as such upon proving to the Council any one of the following qualifications:

Those who have passed the prescribed examinations of the Association;

(2) Those who are graduates of any recognized school of architecture, and who have served at least three years in the office of any reputable architect, either in the province or elsewhere;

(3) Those who hold a title of equal standing from another body of architects;

(4) Those whose qualifications are not covered by the foregoing clauses but who give other evidence of their fitness. A 7/9 majority of the Council shall be necessary for their election.

MEMBERS.

Members shall be enrolled as such, being:

(1) Those who have been associates for a period of at least ten years;

(2) Those who have been in active practice as principals for a period of not less than ten years outside of the province, and have given satisfactory evidence of their ability and experience, may be elected by a majority vote of the members on the recommentation of the Council. The election may be held at the Annual Meeting, or by letter vote at any other time.

FELLOWS.

Fellows shall be elected from the Members of the Association for the excellence of their executed works or for distinguished services to the Art of Architecture.

The nomination shall be by unanimous open vote of the Council, who shall give the members one month's written notice prior to date of the Annual Meeting.

The election shall be by open vote at the Annual Meeting, and shall require a 4/5 majority of the members present.

Omit clause 22, sub-sections (1) and (2), on page 4 of the Act, and substitute the following:

"All members in good standing of the Ontario Association of Architects, and of the Toronto Architectural Eighteen Club, on the coming in force of this amendment to the Charter shall become members of the Association."

In clause 23, omit the words "as an architect," substituting "in the Association."

Omit clause 24 and its sub-section, and insert a clause in by-laws, after consultation with the Eighteen Club.

In clause 25, omit the words "registered architect," and substitute the words "this Association." $\,$

In clause 25, omit the word "Architects," and substitute after the word "Register," "of the Ontario Association of Architects."

In clause 29 omit the words "registered architects," substituting the words "member of the Association."

Mr. Burke's motion was carried.
