fireat suecess of the Canadians.-Col. Gibson carries off the Pince of Wales, prize-Chandian Cadets to beallowed British Commissions.

Lendon, July 19.-At Wimbledon to day Canada won a great success. Col. Gibson carried off the Prince of Wales prize, consisting of $£ 100$ and a badge. He scored 94 points at three ranges, of two, five, and six hundred yards, the highest possible score being 105 points. The score next to Col. Gibson was 91. Corporal (iray, with a score of 80 points, wins a $£ . \bar{j}$ prize. In the St. George's prizes Lieutenant Hunter with a score of 51 points, wins £3; Assistant-Surgeon Liken, 27 points. $£ 2$. In the last series of extra 1 irizes Private Ogg and AssistantSurgeon Aiken, with a score of 33 points, took the thinteenth and fourteenth prizes respectively. On all sides the Canadians are congratulated. Col. Fibson's success is very pronounced. His score is a remarkably good one.

The Duke of Cambridge visited the camp to day. Sir Leonard Tilley, Sir John Kone, Ladies Wharncliffe and Macdonald were among those present. The Dukn inspected the Canadian team, and $1 \cdot x p$ insed great pleasure at seeing them vagain. He congratulated them upon winning the Prince of Wales' prize, the second most important contest at the meeting. England, he said, did not gruige the Canadians the honor they won, for they formed part of the same empire, engaged in the same duty of defence. He concluded by assuring the Canadians that they would be always welcome here. Sir Michael Hicks-Beach joined in the congratulations offered by Hi- litace the Duke of Cambridge, and expressed the pleasure it afforded him to see the team again engaged in the contest.
