It was named in honor of Lord Madoc of Wales, England. Its settlement commenced about 1830, and the first stone house was erected by the present highly esteemed Presbyterian minister, Rev. Mr. Waisac, whose energy and enterprise have done much to stimulate enterprise. From its association with mining interests it is better known throughout the Province than most of the other villages. There are many fine homes, and those who imagine it is a place with houses of a primitive character, dumped down occasionally on the rocks, will be disappointed. The minds of this, as the reality is a well laid out, smart looking, progressive village, with fine buildings and stores with place class fronts and modern in all their appointments. As fine stocks are kept as in any town in the Dominion, and the business men are rated as financially sound. In the neighborhood there is undoubtedly a good deal of land under cultivation, but there is scarcely 100 acres on which a man and family cannot make a comfortable living. Originally it was a pioneer country, and after lumbering was exhausted the settlers turned their attention to making a cash from the hardwood. After that they tried wheat, and since have discovered that stock raising and dairying is their natural and most profitable vocation. As a cheese producing section it has a high and wide celebrity, and Madoc is now the centre for 35 cheese factories. In no section can finer herds of cattle and horses be found. There is a large stock station, and very valuable. This has largely been brought about by the influence and efforts of Mr. Cox. This statement can be verified by a visit to the Madoc Central Fair.

The section abounds with minerals of various kinds, including iron, gold and copper ores, mica, etc., and is destined to become one of the greatest mining sections in the province. The first mine was opened by Mr. Seymour, father of the present Mr. Seymour, who owns a great portion of the surrounding lands, and he also started a small mine, but under circumstances were not favorable and efforts seemed to die out. In 1873 a man named Lloyd came and induced a company to build a road to the Seymour mine, but the road was not completed, and Mr. Cox also opened a mine and after a time sold it out. It was in 1886 that gold was discovered, and a boom commenced equal to the recent one at Okibwa. Men came in all sorts of modes and scrips rigs and the farm houses were filled with them. They were all over, and everyone directed his eyes towards the gold fields in the region. The gold was not there, but there is no question, as a mine is steadily operated at Plintons, 15 miles distant, and has all through proved a comparative success. Sixty to eighty tons of gold are produced daily, and paying all expenses a margin is left of \$5 or \$6 a day. No iron mine was worked in the locality at present, but various mines, among them the Huron, Hamilton, Deferia and Dominion will be valuable properties when the market opens.

The village is on the North Hastings Railway from Belleville to St. Catharines, 8 miles north, connecting there with the Central Ontario Railway. At North Hastings Junction connection is made with the Grand Junction Railway running to Peterborough. The C. P. R. runs six miles to the south. The Toronto and Ottawa Railway runs through the village and the rails are laid to Bridgewater, 10 miles distant. This portion of the road is utilized to draw lumber and other freight.

The town hall is a two-story brick building with bell tower and accommodates all municipal departments, including a lock-up.
