AN APPROACH IN THE COMMONS.

RUSSELL WAS PROTESTING AGAINST THE BEING COERCED. When some said, "What the Devil are you talking about?" And then the Row began. The Amendment to Repeal the First Clause of the Irish Bill Defeated.

LONDON, May 12.—The House of Commons, sitting as a committee of the whole on the Home Rule bill, to-day resumed the debate on the motion made yesterday by Mr. George Bartley, Conservative member for North Lillingdon, to strike out the first clause of the measure, a motion which practically means to reject the whole bill.

The debate was marked by several scenes of excitement, the most prominent of which occurred when Mr. T. W. Russell, who represented the south division of Tyrone, had the floor. "What the Devil are you talking about?"

Mr. Russell, who, though a Liberal, is opposed to Home Rule for Ireland, was protesting against Ulster being coerced into acquiescing in the establishment of an Irish Parliament, when a voice was heard saying, "What the devil are you talking about?"

Mr. Russell at once stopped his protest and accused Mr. John A. MacDonnell, a well-known anti-Parliamentary, with making the objectionable question.

Mr. MacDonnell emphatically denied having asked the question, and insisted that Mr. Russell applied for accusing him of having done so.

Mr. MacDonnell, Conservative, declared that he had heard Mr. MacDonnell utter the words attributed to him by Mr. Russell.

Mr. William Macarty, Conservative, who represents the south division of Antrim, said that it was Mr. Thomas Sexton, the well-known anti-Parliamentary, who had asked the question.

Mr. Sexton denied this statement and added that he had not uttered a word. A general squabble ensued between Mr. Russell and Mr. MacDonnell.

MOTOR CARS FOR THE EAST.

THE DON CROSSING DIFFICULTY HAS BEEN SETTLED.

And Electric Cars Will Be Running Within a Day or Two.—The Street Railway Company Consents to Acquire the Right of Way From the Decision of the Railway Committee As To Liability.

William Laidlaw, Q.C., and Dalton McCarthy, Q.C., met yesterday afternoon and agreed upon the form of an order upon which the Toronto Railway Company will proceed to acquire right of way across the G.T.R. tracks east of the Don, and electric cars will be running to the eastern terminus in a day or two.

Under an interim arrangement the electric service will be continued across the Don, and the return of the Ministers from the west, when a final order for the costs, etc., will be made by the Railway Committee.

The question of the relative merits of the various kinds of street pavements is still a dubious and unsettled one. Among the very first ones that man ever did in this world must have been the making of a road. One would think that by this time there would be little difference of opinion as to best kind of roads to make to suit any possible condition of circumstances. But there still exists difference of opinion, and much of it. The Municipal League of the city of Philadelphia offers a prize for the best essay on the question of street paving for that city. We hope the day is not far distant when the levelling of horses from the city streets will materially alter the street paving question. What we particularly want in regard to our streets in cities is the removal of dirt, noise and unhealthy emanations. Some grants should be made to the subject and give us something new and original.

Improve Our Public Schools. The outlays for educational purposes are continually being increased by the Ontario Government without increasing the grants to Public schools or improving their character. In 1871 the expenditure on account of education was \$351,300. In 1881 it had risen to \$392,922. In 1891 it had reached the sum of \$846,115, and the estimates for 1893 call for \$928,740, an account of education, with an additional sum of \$19,950 for the department, making a total of \$948,695, and still the grants to Public schools remain stationary. But this is not the worst feature, as Mr. Ross is now striking at the Public schools and lowering their efficiency.
