CAN THEY BEAT SEAGRAM?

THORNCLIFFE HIS MOST DANGEROUS OPPONENT. About Lochivar's Trials on the Fast Hamilton Track—Apart From These The Chicago Aims Has a Chance—The Field in the Historic Queen's Plate Contest Will Number From 12 to 15.

If the Ontario Jockey Club is only fa- vored with fine weather for its meeting, which begins next Tuesday week at Woodbine Park, a great week's sport is in store for the lovers of the thorough- bred. While it will no doubt prove an attractive society event, some good racing will be provided, with the Queen's Plate as the sporting feature of the opening day. As to the result of this historic event, which is arousing unusual interest through the country, Mr. Seagram again appears to hold the trump card in his entry list, which includes Vicar of Wakefield, Millbrook, Confection- er and Bonfield. Which one of the quartet the stable wants to win with is doubtful, but it is more than likely Mr. Seagram would prefer winning with the Vicar, he being the oldest, and it is certain that Lewis will have the mount on the best one, while three of the four will most likely sport the yellow and black in the race this year. The field, though it may number from twelve to fifteen starters, will have many a bad one in the bunch, and with the exception of Lochivar, Thorncliffe and Chickie, formerly Red Cap, there is no one to be counted on to have a chance of capturing the coveted prize. Good accounts come from Hamilton regarding the Hendrix candidate, who is said to have worked very fast, but it must be remembered that the track is certainly two or three seconds faster than Woodbine, if not more, and this should be taken into serious consideration. In fact, it takes a good race horse, at the present time, to work over Woodbine, close the mile, where the cutthroat has been used, in 1.50. Mr. Seagram's most dangerous opponent is no doubt Thorn- cliffe, who trainer Burgess is credited with saying, is "not up to much," though those who know Mr. Davies' trainer say that it is just the time to look out for him. It is no secret, however, that Thorncliffe is vastly improved over last season, and he races up to expectations, should be hard to dispose of. Chickie is coming along nicely, and if she races as well as she works, should have a good chance, and a victory for Mr. Duggan would certainly be a popular one.

Visitors to the track this year will find many improvements both to the course and enclosure. The entrance will be changed from its present location at the west end of the betting ring to just east of the ring, and will be enlarged considerably. Everything is bustle and activity, and the stables are beginning to fill up. C. W. Parker, with his string of five, will arrive to-day from New York, while Mr. Dunsingh Lovely is expected from Buffalo in a few days. Yesterday was an off day with training, and little fast work was done. NO REPLY TO NEWFOUNDLAND

PREMIER WHITEWAY URGES CAN- ADA TO NAME TERMS. The Legislature Adjourned For a Week To Receive Word From Ottawa—Whiteway Strongly Opposes Confederation—He States It Is Not Possible Retrenchment and Re- organization Will Be the Order of the Day.

St. John's, Nfld., May 9.—The Legisla- ture met this afternoon and adjourned for another week. An important debate oc- curred, in which the prospects for con- federation were considerably enhanced. Premier Whiteway made an official an- nouncement of the condition of the con- federate negotiations. He announced that the delegates had not yet received a reply to their ultimatum from the Do- minion Government. Premier Bowell last Tuesday night, urging the necessity for a prompt reply. Premier Bowell announced that he would cable his answer at the first possible moment. Premier Whiteway believes it unwise to terminate the negotiations at this juncture. He urged the immense impor- tance of the subject, its bearing on the future of the country, and the difficulties of the present position. He stated that it was the unanimous decision of the Do- minion Government, in its capacity of government party to prolong the period of waiting, so as to give the Dominion Cab- inet time to arrive at a decision. Mr. Whiteway avowed himself an ardent confederate, and had been so all his life. He believed that confederation on advantageous terms the best thing pos- sible for the country at this juncture. At the same time, he said, if nothing is received from the Dominion Govern- ment the next week his government is prepared to bring in a scheme for drastic retrenchment, providing eco- nomies in every department of the public service. It is intended to in- crease the tariff so as to provide re- sources for meeting all indebtedness. The introduction of this, he intimated, would constitute the virtual abandonment of confederation, and further, stated that the colony would not submit to insol- vency and that it would strive to work out its own destiny.

Goodridge Wrecked the Colony. Mr. Morris, one of the delegates, cor- roborated Mr. Whiteway, and accused the late Government of wrecking the colony's affairs. He said that the White- way Government was prepared to accept the fullest responsibility of the position. Mr. Scott, Receiver-General, followed in a similar strain, and charged the Goodridge Government with expending nearly half a million dollars without legal authority, also that the public ac- counts show a disgraceful squandering of public money by that Administration. These charges were denied by the representatives of the late Govern- ment. Neither Premier Whiteway nor Mr. Scott would say whether the ques- tion of Confederation will be submitted to the electorate. This disinclination con- firms the belief that the Dominion will finally force a measure through the Legislature requesting England to de- nounce the Royal Commission.
