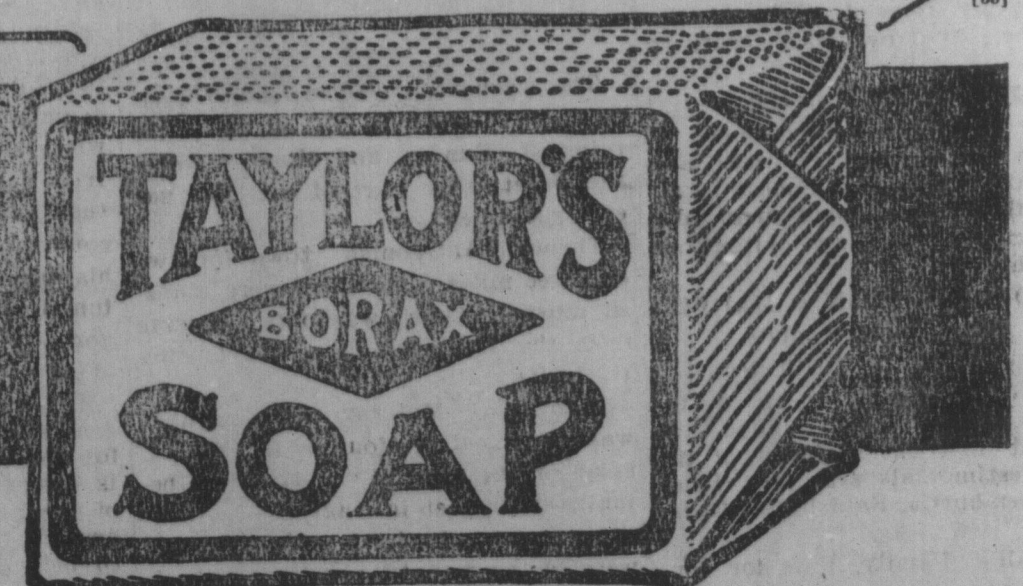

ELECTRIC CURRENT FROM KING DIRECT TO TUBERCULOSIS INSTITUTE ESTABLISHED IN MONTREAL.

Montreal, Oct. 21.—When King Edward, in the library of West Dean Park, Chichester, today pressed the button which unfurled the Royal Standard and flung wide open the doors of the Kind Edward Institute for Tuberculosis here, there was communitated on this continent an electrical maneuver never before attempted through Chichester to the institute in Belmont Park, Montreal, by means of automatic repeaters in one of the Commercial Cable company's cables at Waterville, and then re-translated at Canso into one of the C. P. R. telegraph wires, which was continued on to the institute.
