PLANETS.

MERCURY will be in its greatest Eastern elongations March 13, July 11, and Nov. 9; greatest Western elongations, May 1, Aug. 25, and Dec. 15. When in its greatest Eastern elongations it may be seen in the West a few minutes after sunset; and when in greatest Western elongations may be seen in the East a few minutes before sunrise.

VENUS will be the *Evening* Star until July 18, after which it will be the *Morning* Star.

MARS will be a *Morning* Star until July 14, after which it will be an *Evening* Star.

JUPITER will be an *Evening* Star until July 31, after which it will be a *Morning* Star.

SATURN will be a *Morning* Star until Feb. 11, after which it will be an *Evening* Star until Aug. 23, and thereafter a *Morning* Star.

ECLIPSES.

There will be four Eclipses this year—two of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. January 22. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in North America, but may be seen at Cape Horn and in the South Pacific Ocean.

II. February 6. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, visible in all parts of North America :

This Eclipse will be central and total in Oregon, northern part of British America, Spain, and the Barbary States. It will be partial in all North America, most of Europe, and part of Africa. More than half of the Sun's disc will be obscured at Halifax.

This Eclipse will be visible in China.

Magnitude of the Eclipse (Moon's diameter = 1) 0,443.

Eclipses take place every half year, and at each period there may be one, two, or three ; if only one, it must be an eclipse of the Sun ; if two, there will be one of each luminary ; and if three, there will be two of the Sun, with one of the Moon between them. Eclipses of the Sun are caused by the interposition of the body of the Moon between our eyes and the Sun ; and eclipses of the Moon by a real deprivation of light from the Moon occasioned by the shadow of the earth.

EASTER DAY, on which the rest of the Moveable Feasts and Holy-days depend, is always the first *Sunday* after the full moon which happens the next after the twenty-first day of *March*; and if the full moon happens upon a *Sunday*, *Easter-Day* is the *Sunday* after.

ADVENT SUNDAY is always the nearest *Sunday* to the feast of *Saint Andrew*, whether before or after.

DIRECTIONS FOR FINDING THE TRUE TIME.—The sun is on the meridian at 12 o'clock on four days only in the year. It is sometimes as much as 15 minutes before or after 12 when its shadow strikes the noon mark on the sun dial. On each calendar page of this Almanack is shewn the exact time at which the sun reaches the meridian; and in order to set a clock or watch correctly, it must, when it is noon by the sun dial, be set at the time indicated in the Almanack. Thus, on the 25th January, when the sun is on the noon mark, the watch must be set 12m. 30s. past 12, which will be the true time. The practice of setting time-pieces by the rising or setting of the sun or moon is not strictly correct, as the unevenness of the earth's surface and intervening objects, such as hills and forests, near the points of rising and setting, occasion a deviation, in every place, from the time expressed in the Almanacks, which time is adapted to a smooth level horizon. The only means of keeping correct time is by the use of a noon mark or a meridian line.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

Column LEFT HAND PAGE.

- 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.
 3 “ 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
 5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.
 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or a quarter before eight o'clock in the morning at Halifax.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time; and there are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing; namely, about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.
 7—Days' length in hours and minutes.
 8—The rising of the Moon.
 9—The setting of the Moon.
 10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.
 11—The symbols in this column indicate the Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- 1—Contains the days of the month.
 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.
 4— “ “ Pictou, N.S. and Cape Tormentine, N.B.
 5— “ “ Annapolis, N. S., St. John N. B., and Portland, Maine.
 6— “ “ St. Johns, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L'establisement du port*—is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland, 11h. 14m.; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h., and at St. Johns, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.

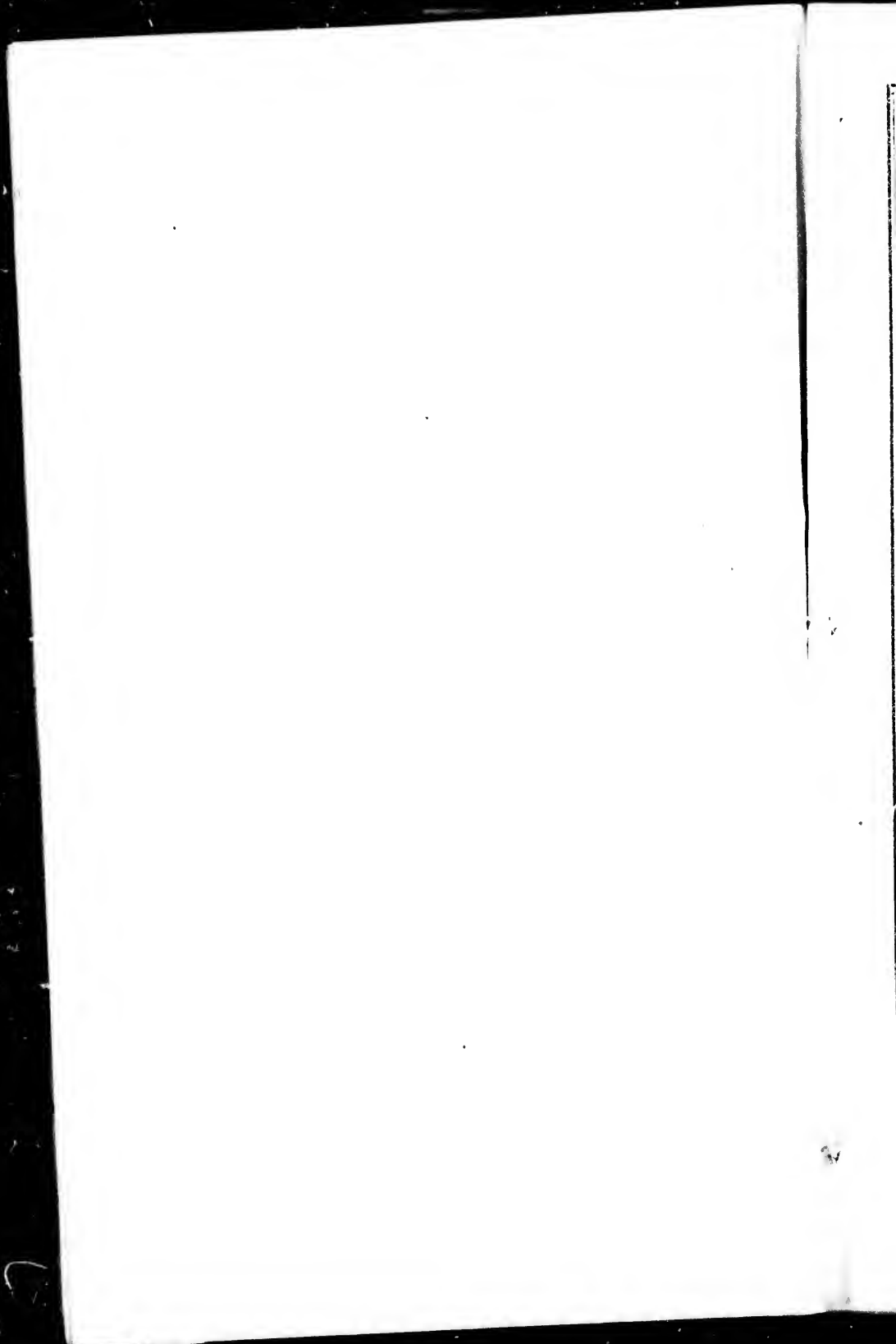
THE EPHEMERIS OF THE PRINCIPAL PLANETS.—The hour of *meridian passage*, *right ascension* and *declination* of each of the principal planets is given for the 1st and 15th of each month. For any other day than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate of 3m. 55.91s. per day, reckoned from the nearest given day—to be added for an earlier day—subtracted if for a later day.

TRAIN the mind to right reasoning. There is a class of persons sully deficient in this important faculty. Rising up early and sitting up late, and laboring hard, they can scarcely keep free from pressing want. The fault is not in their labor, but in their plans—in the arrangement of their business. They do not adopt the best method to perform their labor, and consequently work to disadvantage. It is of no kind of use to be "hurried to death" from early in the spring till late in the fall. Sit down and calculate, taking all things into consideration,—see how much you can plough, plant, hoe and harvest, and then go to work systematically. Not only estimate the amount of your labors, but to do everything the best way, and do one thing at a time. It is folly to commence a piece of work and leave it half finished for something else, to be left incomplete. What ought to be done should be finished, and what ought not to be done should be let alone. Look around you and see the various methods in which your neighbors perform their labors. Do not suppose that you know more or can calculate to better advantage than others. Make your observation and experience available for your future improvement.

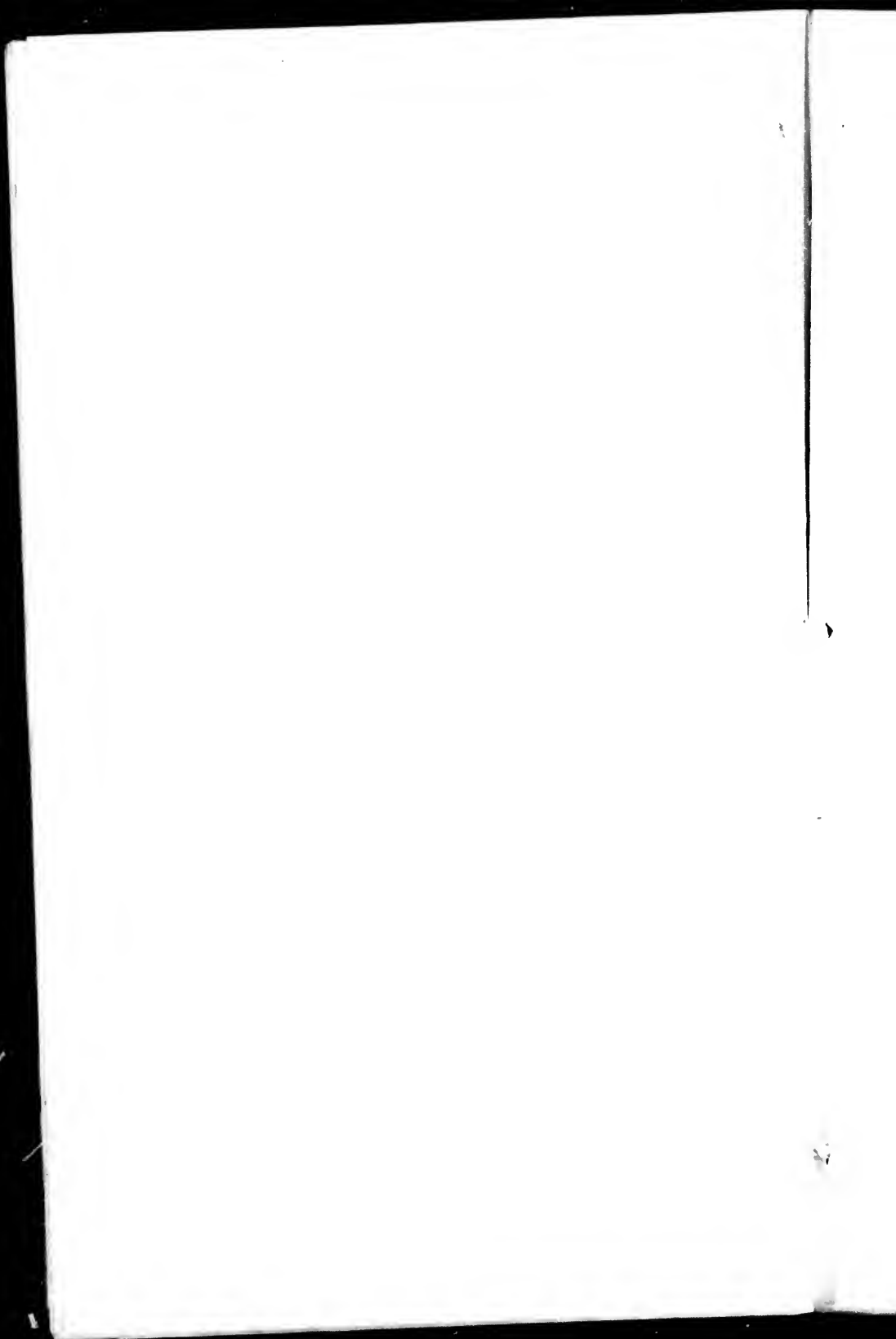

No amount of extra labor in the after culture can compensate for a defect in the ploughing of the ground; and he is an unwise farmer who will allow his grounds to be imperfectly broken up in the preparation for a crop. Much might be said of the propriety of deep or shallow ploughing, but as there is not space in this article, we can only remark that it is generally considered that deep ploughing on almost all soils is beneficial, especially after that portion of the subsoil turned to the surface has been sometime exposed to the action of the frost and the meliorating influences of light, heat, &c. It is not certain that the first crop is always benefited by deep ploughing, but that the soil is permanently improved by such process there cannot be the slightest doubt. The subsoil plough is the article best adapted to improve our heavy and retentive soils, and the time is probably not far distant when it will be in common use as much perhaps as the common plough. It may not, and perhaps will not, be found necessary to resort to deep stirring of the soil every year, but as often as once in every course of crops, or every three or four years, great benefits would be derived from this operation. That there has been a manifest improvement in the practice of farmers in ploughing their grounds, we have the best evidence in the fields everywhere presented to our view.

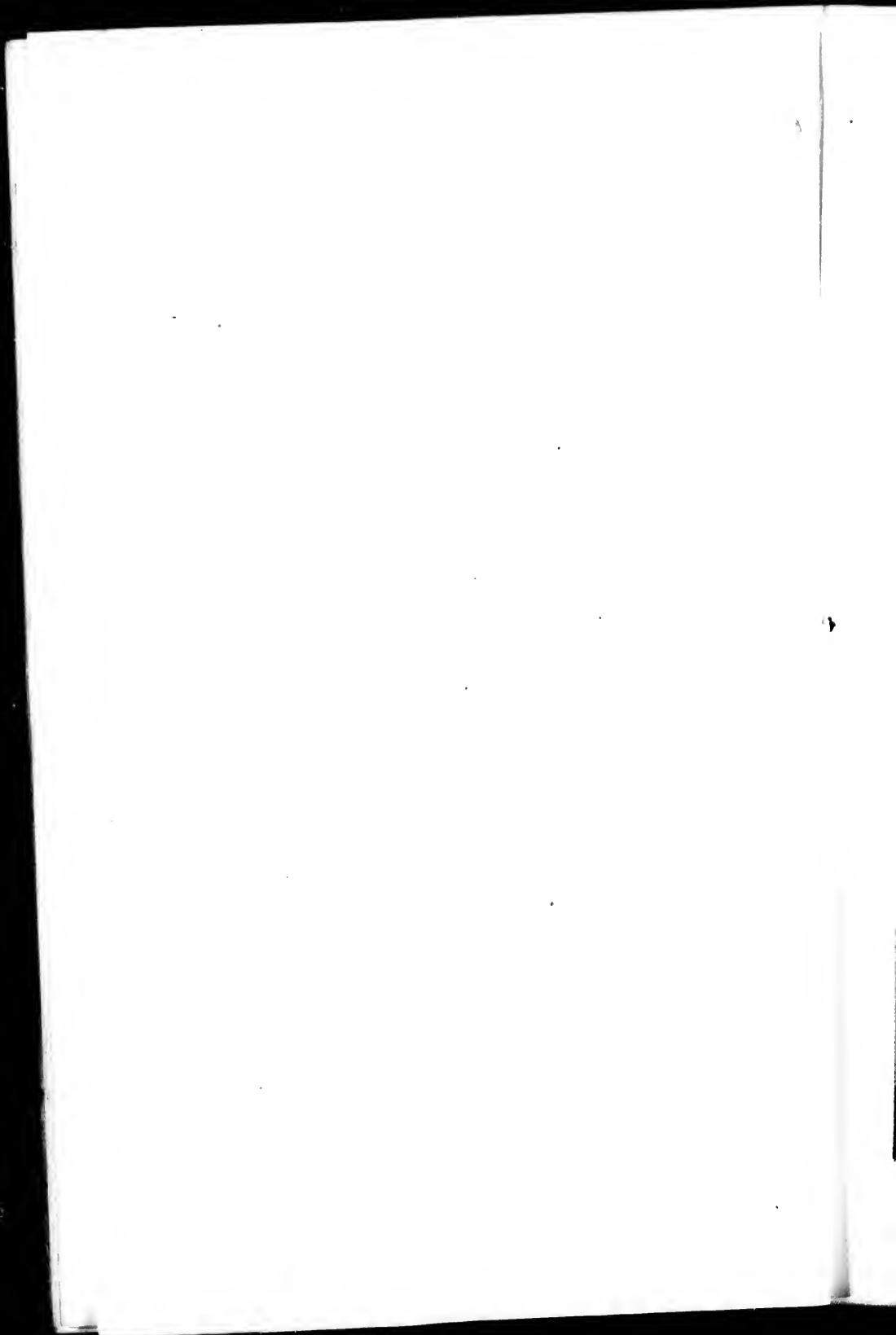

We need not here go into a minute examination of all the various items of good and bad management, but we may merely recall a few things to remembrance. The loss of hay and other food of sheep and cattle, by their exposure in open fields to cold winds in winter, causing a consumption of nearly double the amount needed for them in warm places, would in a single season, be enough to erect good and cheap shelters, to say nothing of the improved condition of the animals, and security from loss by death. A great saving would often result by taking fine animals to breed from. A fine and handsome animal is as easily raised as a bad and ugly one, and frequently commands a double price in market. A similar advantage would result from selection of seed. Many days labour may be annually avoided, by procuring the very best tools, where there are such as are much in use. A vast amount of valuable time, and some fretting, may be saved by having a place for everything, and everything in its place, and habits of leaving things out of order, which are very hard to conquer, and which like all kinds of carelessness, are the bane of fine farming, be prevented.

This mode of propagating the potato-tubers is somewhat peculiar. A large onion, set in the ground early in spring, breaks into several (6 or 15) separate onions, which grow in a cluster of three or four good sized bulbs at the bottom, and a number of small ones lying on the top. These last vary in size from that of a nutmeg to that of a small hen's egg. The small ones are the seed for the next year's crop. The smallest will grow into very large, single bulbs; while the larger ones will grow into two or three middling sized,—the average annual increase, taking large and small together, is about tenfold. This description readily suggests the proper mode of cultivation,—which is to set out the small onions for the purpose of producing the large ones for table use, and to set out a sufficient number of large ones for the purpose of producing the small ones for seed. The first should have a moderately rich soil, the last a soil rather barren. They should be put out as early in the spring as the season will admit—put them in rows far enough apart to allow a hoe to pass between them, and three or four inches apart in the rows—just cover with earth—they may be stuck in the ground with the thumb and finger.

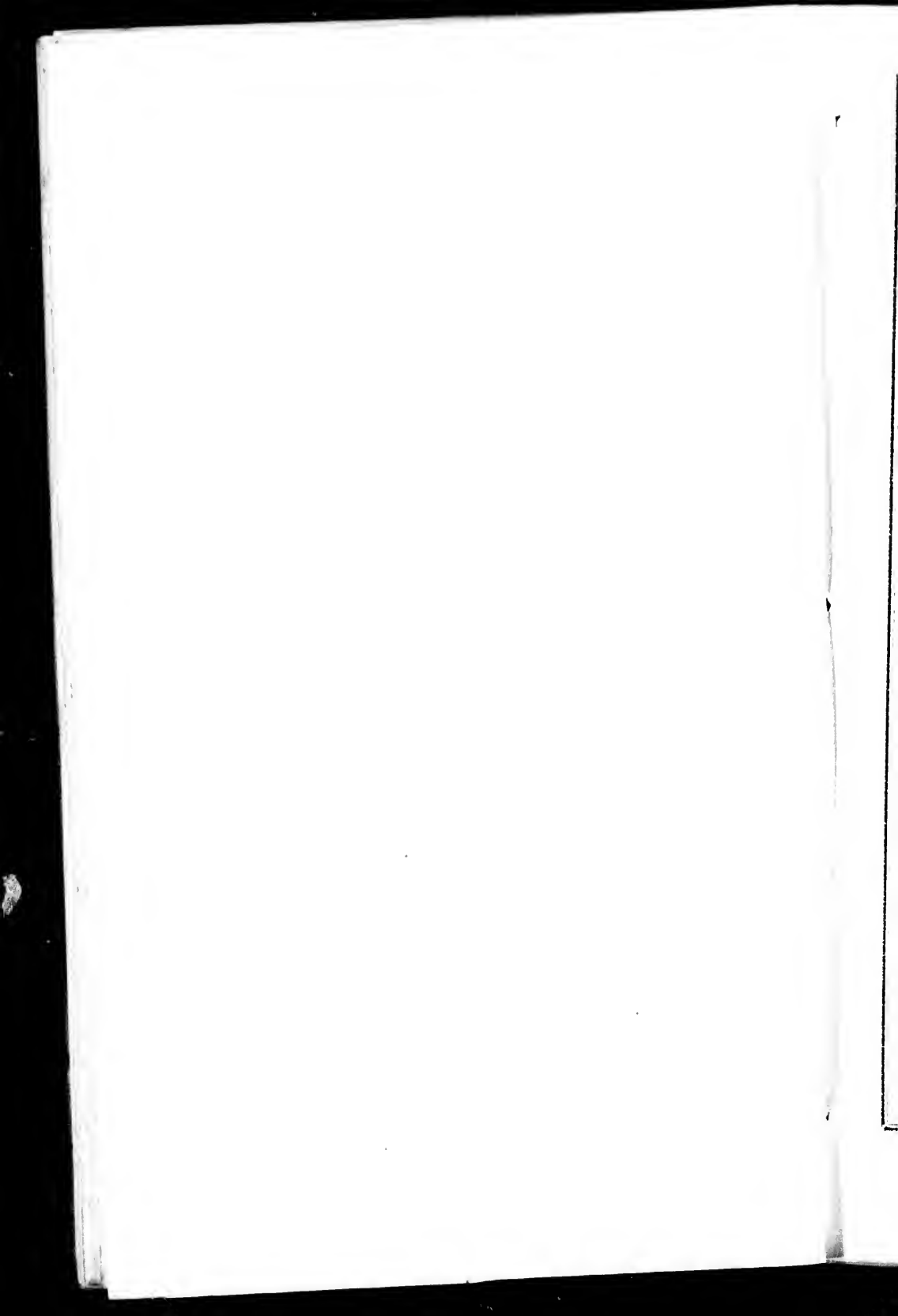

The advantage of free admission of light, and free circulation of air, to the growth of plants, are in a good degree obvious to persons of any experience in agriculture. So important are these influences to Indian corn, that an advantage is known to result from giving the widest space to rows running north and south. This more readily admits the light and heat of the sun, than rows running in a contrary direction. It has been suggested that planting corn and potatoes in alternate rows, or in alternation of two rows each, would give a greater aggregate product for a given extent of land, than if each crop were planted entirely by itself. Experiments relative to this point have been made and the results indicate considerable advantage in favour of the mode of mixed planting: from an half acre of corn alone was harvested 42 Bushels; and from half an acre of potatoes alone 136 Bushels; and from half an acre in alternate rows of corn and potatoes was harvested 22 bushels of corn, and 79 bushels of potatoes,—from which there appears to have been a gain in mixed planting of 10 bushels of corn to the acre and 26 bushels of potatoes.

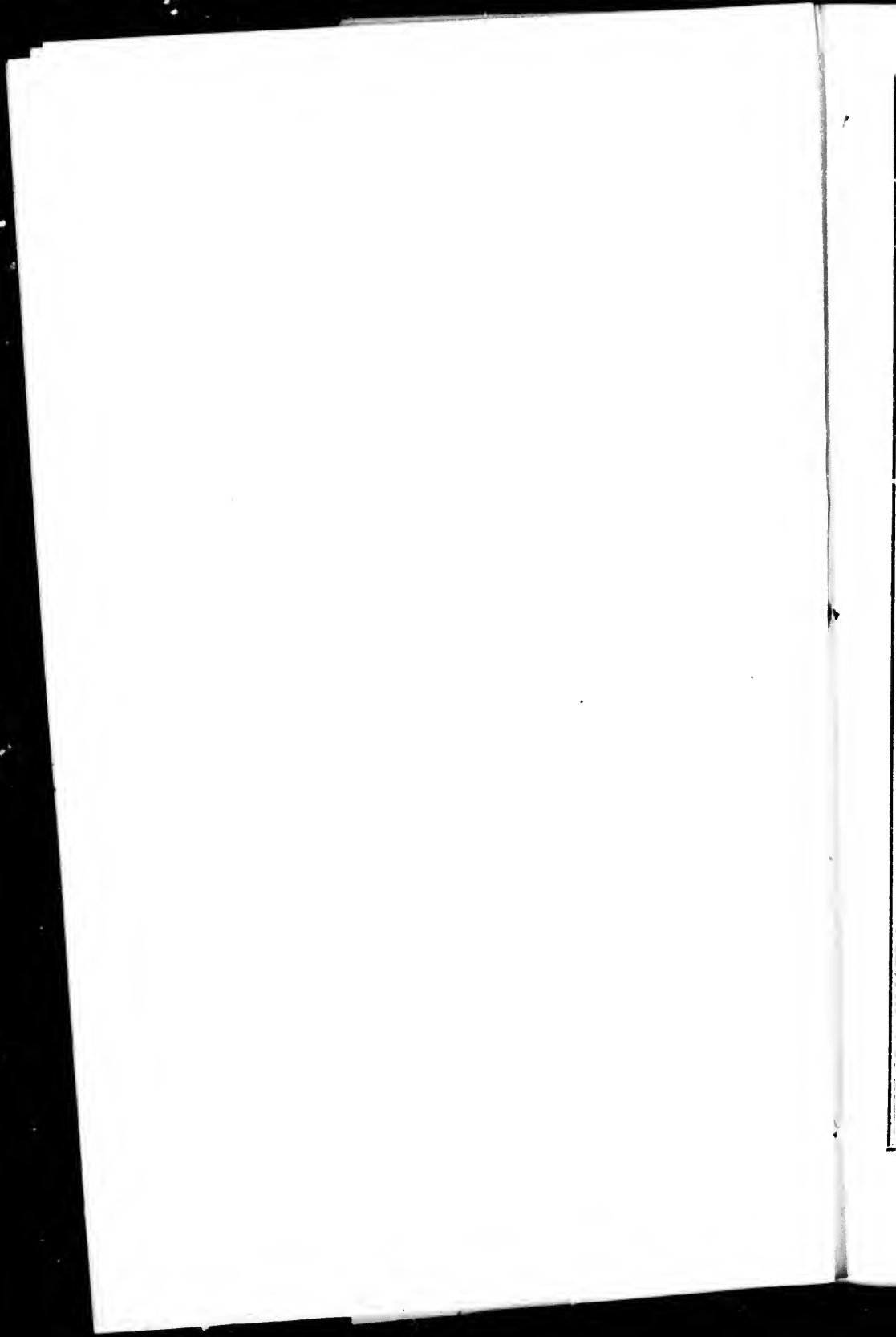
The present month is one of the most rapidly growing seasons of the year. The farmer's crops not only make great progress, but weeds too are ever vigilant in thrusting up their heads and asserting their claims. If they once get the upper hand for a week, the crop may feel the injurious influence for the whole season—let them then be attacked at the very outset. Weeds among root crops and corn, are destroyed with one half the labour otherwise required, if taken when about one inch in height. In a week or ten days they will be five or six inches high, will cost three or four times as much to destroy them, and will have exerted a seriously injurious effect on the crop. Hence it would be cheaper to hire a man at five shillings a day, at first, than at half that sum afterwards. A large portion of the failures in raising ruta bagas, beets, and other root crops, have resulted from the heavy growth of weeds during the early part of the season, which are not unfrequently suffered to attain a foot in height before they are destroyed. The stunting effect on the crop and the labor of weeding are obvious. Repeated ploughing and harrowing of the ground for some weeks before sowing roots, to clear it effectually of weeds, is a very economical operation and saves much labor.

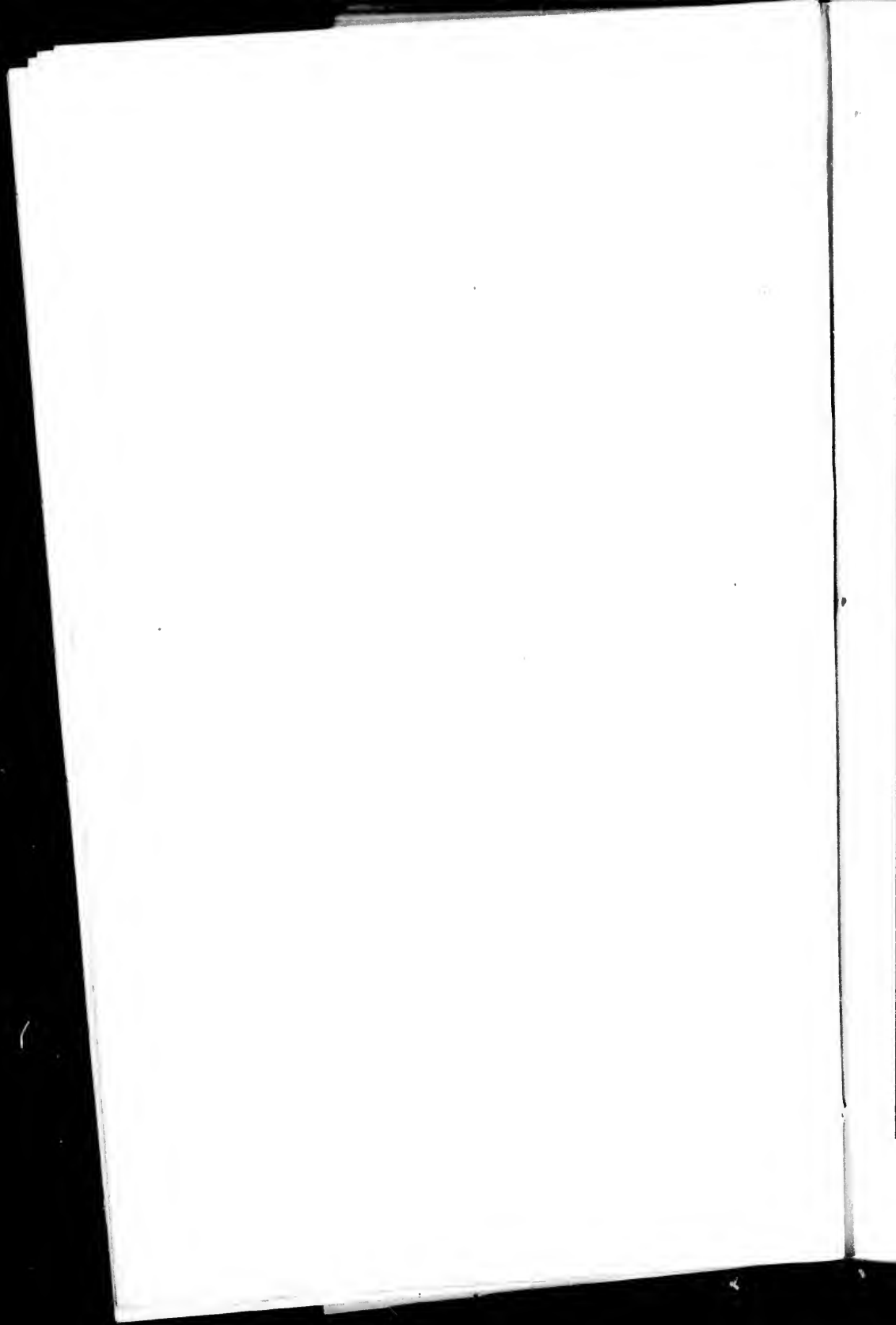
Rice. Loamy ground, will bear a good crop of English flat, or the Norfolk bullock turnip, after a crop of grass has been cut. Turn the sod over nicely, spread on some rotted manure, compost, or leached ashes, harrow well with a light sharp harrow, and sow the seed with a machine, or by hand, in rows 18 or 20 inches apart, and when the plants are fairly out of the way of insects, thin them to 8 or 10 inches in the row, if intended for stock: if intended for the market, they should be thicker, to prevent their growing too large for the table. Four to five hundred bushels, and sometimes even twice that quantity, may be grown to the acre, and they are good food in connexion with straw, for cattle and sheep, till the middle of the winter, when they become so corky that the value is much lessened. The crop may be cultivated without much expense, if the weather only happens to be favourably moist at the time of sowing, and till the plants get into rough leaf. A very small harrow, with sharp knives so set as to cut the surface of the ground clean after the harrow teeth, is the best tool for cultivating turnips on light land.

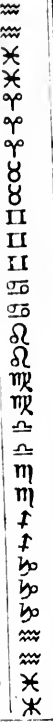

PEAT or bog earth or black mud, designed for compost, or for spreading on cultivated fields, is much better for being dug sometime before being used. The action of the air, the frost, and the rains, dissipates its sourness, and a partial fermentation or decomposition takes place, by which it is pulverized, and brought into a good state to be applied to the land. If the ground is too soft and mry to admit of a team going on it, let the muck remain where it is first thrown out till winter, when the ground becomes frozen sufficiently to bear a yoke of oxen and sled; and then the muck can be easily cut into junks and carried off. The banks of ditches should be hauled to the barn yard or piled on dry land. The process of improving land by *paring* and *burning*, though seldom practised, might be adopted in many cases with excellent advantage: the operation consists in cutting a thin slice from the surface of sward or old grass lands—the sods are dried and burnt, and the ashes spread over the land. It is most beneficial to clayey soils and those impregnated with iron.

WHEN the meadows fall from whatever cause, it is generally advisable to plough them up in the fall, and cultivate them thoroughly for 2 or 3 years, with corn, potatoes or other root crops, manuring them heavily, and seeding down again when the white daisy and other weeds have been destroyed and the old turf has entirely disappeared. Meadows have been greatly improved by simply scarifying the sward in the fall by means of a heavy harrow and then sowing from 8 to 16 quarts of Timothy, red-top and eye-grass seeds, equal parts, to the acre. The best time to top-dress all meadows that are not of too light or porous a nature, is in the fall. In England nothing was more common, 20 years ago, than to make a compost with barn yard manure and old headlands, and after it was well decomposed, to cart it on the meadows during the winter months—the effect was very beneficial—unmixed manure was seldom used. Since the introduction of Guano, the practice of composting old headlands has, to some extent given way to top-dressing with bright artificial manures.

AUTUMN is a favourable time of the year for making improvements on the farm. After the Hay, Wheat and other grains have secured, there is a lapse of time before the latter harvest demands attention, which furnishes a good opportunity for cleaning fields of stumps and stones, improving meadows and pastures, making fences, reclaiming swamps and wet lands, digging peat and muck for manure, &c. Moist grass lands, whether in meadow or pasture, are liable to be more or less injured by the growth of bushes, rushes and wild, worthless vegetation of various kinds. The most effectual remedy for this is thorough drainage, which should therefore be the first object—bushes had better be pulled root and branch—they generally grow in stools, raised a little from the general bed of the field, and may be readily torn up with a root-claw, or in default of that a plough, to which oxen are attached. When the bushes are large they should be cut in order to give a chance to get at the roots. Do not be in too great a hurry to dig your potatoes: the roots often grow bigger and better after the tops are considerably decayed.

The indifference which many display in regard to keeping the roads in good repair, and their unwillingness to do their proportion of work has often been matter of surprise. For months and months farmers are ploughing through rough, racking and muddy places, with injury to wagons and harness, when a very little work would have removed the whole difficulty and the cause of it—but then others would have been benefited by their work as well as themselves, and therefore, though directly in sight of their own windows, and though passing it several times every week, the ugly obstruction which has been the dread of many a traveller on the road, stands unrepaired for months to the disgrace and inconvenience of a whole neighbourhood, and especially of him who lives close by it. It is now quite time to barricade your premises against *Jack Frost*. Your cellars and other repositories under ground, or on the ground floor, should now be made frost proof by *banks*, more useful as well as more stable than some other things with the same name, but which farmers should deal with as little as possible.

Cold weather gives cattle and other stock sharp appetites, and this and the next month is the best time in the winter to feed our fodder. Give it to the stock in small quantities at a time. It is not good policy to make *witch cows* eat too much poor fodder—it had better be fed mostly to the young cattle—such as steers and two year old heifers. During the latter part of winter and the beginning of spring stock requires more attention than at any other season. There is usually much stormy weather about that time, and under the changes from heat to cold, and from fair to foul, the appetite of the animal is very irregular.

Those of our readers who have not lived in the country cannot imagine how charming country young ladies are. Brought up in the pure air, under the shadow of their apple tree, they gather all their knowledge of the world and of life from books. Solitude, freedom and study, soon develop their feelings and passions in a manner unknown to the light minded beauties of the city.

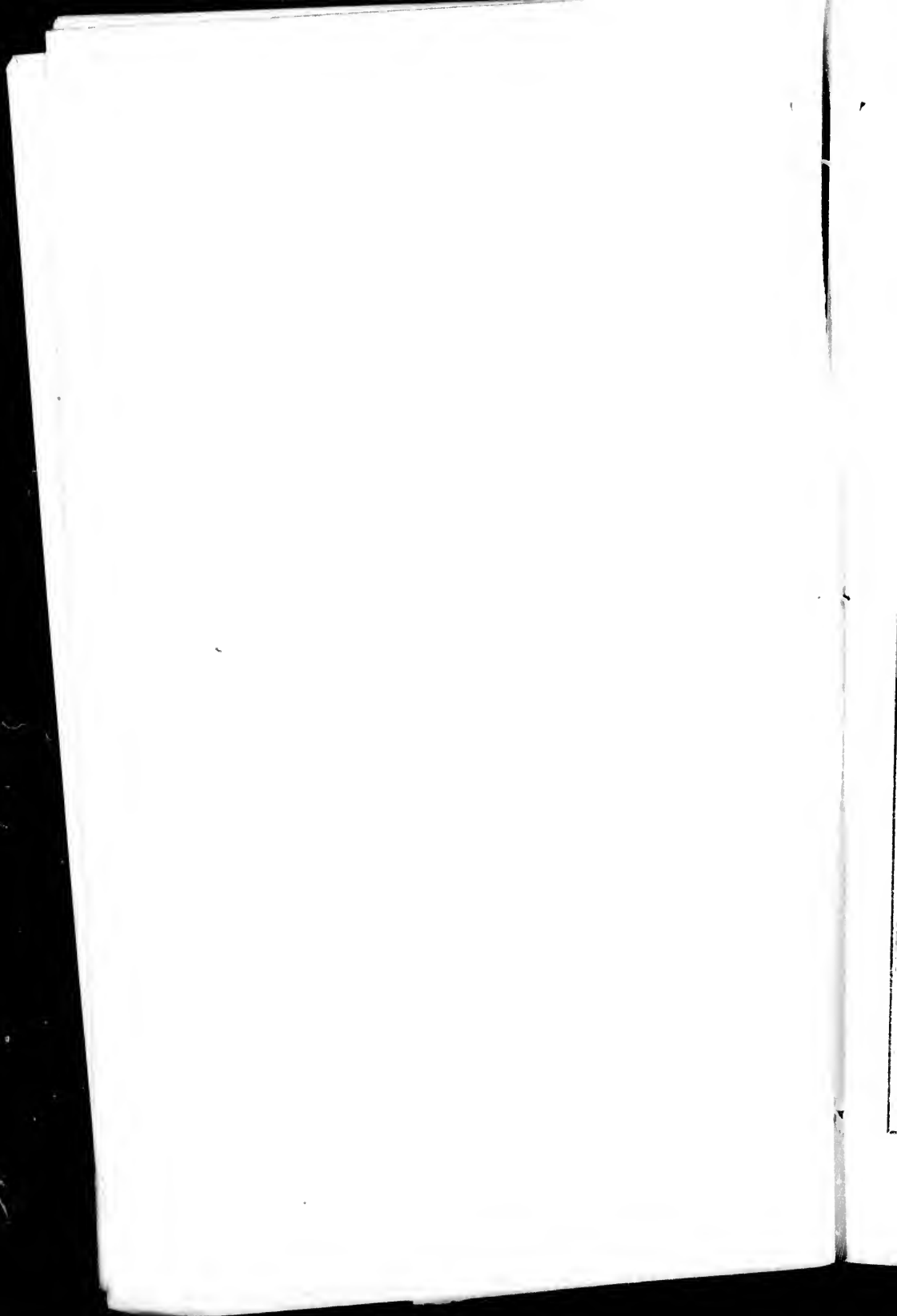

LIGHT HOUSES

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New-Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race, N. B.; Gulf and River St. Lawrence; and Strait of Belle-Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH.—East Side Halifax harbour. *A fixed light.*

SAMBRO ISLAND.—Western entrance Halifax harbour. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND.—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbour, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

CROSS ISLAND.—Entrance to Lunenburg harbour. *Two lights—flash light above; fixed light below.*

LIVERPOOL.—South end of Coffin's Island. *A plain, revolving light.*

FORT POINT harbor light, at the head of Liverpool harbour, southern entrance of the river. *A bright, fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand, when entering the harbour.

PORT MEDWAY.—Beacon Light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the port. Building square, painted *white*, with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides, *plain white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

SHELBURNE.—McNutt's Island. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON.—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. *A flash light*, of fifteen seconds.

CAPE FORCHU LIGHT.—On Cape Forchu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth harbor—*A plain revolving light*, visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. Building painted white, and is elevated 135 feet above the level of the sea.

CAPE SABLE, SEAL ISLAND.—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South point of Seal Island. *A plain, white light*, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain, white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of forty feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. *A fixed, white light*.

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) **BEACON LIGHT**.—Building square and painted white,—exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles *a white light*, and on nearer approach *a green light*. Port Williams is distant from Digby light-house, E. 25 miles, and from Black Rock light-house, W. 27 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT.—Building square and painted white,—exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles *a white light*, and on nearer approach *a red light*. Margaretville is distant, E. 37 miles from Digby light-house, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock light-house.

These lights in the above beacon lights distinguishes them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed, white light*.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Mines, 95 feet above sea level, high-water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted white; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blomelon), and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An Octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits *a plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—Basin of Minas. The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shews *a plain white light*, about 75 feet above high-water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and buildings painted white. Bearings and distances: Cape Blomelon, N. 70, W. 26 5, 10 miles; Brick Kiln Ledges, N. 52, W. 7 5, 10 miles; Economy Point, N. 36, W. 3 9, 10 miles.

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to La Have River. *A bright, flash light*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy feet above sea level.

RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR LIGHT—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting *a clear, fixed light*, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in Lat. 43° 39' N., and Long. 64° 66' W.

PRINCE HARBOR LIGHT—A Beacon Light on the S. E. side of the en-

trance to Pubnico Harbor, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A fixed, red light*, on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high-water level, (rise and full twelve feet), and stands fifty fathoms from low-water mark. The point of beach is bold.

A FOG BELL has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute.

EASTERN BEAVER OF WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A revolving light*.

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other.

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU—*A fixed light*.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light*.

PICTOR LIGHT—On the south-east side of the entrance of the harbor. *A fixed light*.

PICTOR ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, fifty-two feet above high-water mark.

ARICHAU BEACON—A Light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, thirty-four feet above the sea-level.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light*.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbor. *A fixed light*.

SEA-WOLF, OR MARGERIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly mid-way between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a-half miles. *A plain, white light*. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island, the light may become observed by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from the Margerie and North Canseau lights.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high-water; rise and fall, six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, off the eastern coast of Cape Breton. Lat. 49 degrees, 11 5 N., and Long. 59 degrees, 45 50 W., and exhibits a *bright, flash light*, every fifteen seconds, visible from all points

of the compass. The light is sixty-five feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of twelve miles.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND—*A fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end.

SCATTARIE ISLAND—*A revolving light*, on the east end of the island.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT.—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white, flash light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light, in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and the southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull—this may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—*Two fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high-water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, (British or American). Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be, then, not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the E. of the lights.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain, *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white* with a *red cross* on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS—Upon this projecting headland, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are *fixed and white*. Building painted *red and white*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

PATRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. *A fixed, white light*. The building painted *red and white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. of Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white and black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUEVO LIGHT—*A revolving, white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quevo Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white and red*, in horizontal stripes.

CARVE EXVOYE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmorland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain white light*.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

A **LIGHT HOUSE** has been erected upon **CAPE RACE**, Newfoundland, a fixed, white light, from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. to W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped red and white vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been ent down. The Light house is in Lat. 46 degrees 39 minutes 19 seconds N., Long. 53 degrees 2 minutes 38 seconds W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 degrees W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle:

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT—An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south west point of the island. A single fixed white light. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour. Lat. N. 51° 52' 00"; Long. W. 55° 26' 00". Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles.

POINTE AMOUR LIGHT, Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Forteau Bay, Lat. N. 57° 27' 30"; Long. W. 56° 53' 40". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 18½ nautical or 21½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme point west end of the island of Anticosti—Lat. N. 49° 52' 30", Long. W. 64° 35' 00". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZAR LIGHT—East coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. 48° 51' 00", Long. W. 64° 15' 00". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 16½ nautical or 19½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

Signals will be given at or near each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

The Royal Mail Steamers leave Boston for Halifax and Liverpool, G. B., every alternate *Wednesday*; arrive at Halifax on *Thursday* evening or very early the succeeding morning, leaving Halifax immediately after receiving the Mails.

Letters to or from the United Kingdom, 7½d.; *prepayment compulsory*.

Letters dropped into the letter box unpaid, will be returned to the writers. Letters on Service addressed to any of the Imperial Public Departments are exempted from the regulation requiring prepayment. Registered letters, 7½d.; to Australia, &c., foreign countries, and other places, passing through the United Kingdom, 1s. 3d., in addition to the postage. Newspapers free.

The Postage on Books from Great Britain to Nova Scotia, or *vice versa*, is for a packet not exceeding 4 oz., 4d.; 4 oz. and not exceeding ½ lb., 7½d.; ½ lb. and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s. 3d.; and so on, increasing 7½d. for every additional ½ lb. or fraction of a ½ lb. Printed or lithographed letters addressed to any part of the UNITED KINGDOM can be sent like other printed matter, as follows: for a single letter or packet of letters, open at the sides or ends, not exceeding 4 oz., 4d., and so on, according to the scale above for charging books. One book package may contain separate Books, Publications, Almanacks, and Maps and Paper, Parchment or Vellum; the latter three materials may be written or printed on—the package may contain the name and address of the sender. Roller may accompany prints and maps, and markers may be sent with books. No letter must be sent with or written on a book package, and no such package must exceed *two feet* in length, width, or depth. The Postage must in all cases be *prepaid* by Stamps.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* United States are made up at Halifax to meet the steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York*." Letters, 10d.; Newspapers 1d. each.

The Mails for the United States *via* Boston, per Royal Mail Steamers are made up on *Tuesday Evening* of the week in which the Packet from England is due, at 8 o'clock. Should the steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, *supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the steamer from Liverpool arrive previous to Tuesday night—the Mails as heretofore will close *immediately on her arrival*.

A closed Mail for Canada is made up and forwarded at the same time in charge of the British officer. Letters so forwarded must be specially addressed "Closed Mail for Canada;" postage 7½d.—*prepayment optional*.

The Mails for Bermuda and the West Indies are made up *finally* at Halifax on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston, at 8 o'clock.

Letters 5d.; when posted in the interior, 3d. additional, this must be prepaid. Newspapers 1½d. each, to be prepaid by Stamp.

Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda for Chagres and the Pacific, Chili and Peru, Havana, Honduras, Lagayra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands.

Postage to Foreign West Indies 5d.; 3d. additional when posted in the interior,—*must be prepaid*. Newspapers 1½d. each, *to be prepaid by Stamp*.

The Mails for Newfoundland, (and Cape Breton, during the Summer months,) are made up at Halifax, *once a month*, during the months of December, January, February, and March; and *once a fortnight* during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November, closing *finally* on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston.—Postage 5d.; when posted in the interior 3d. additional. Newspapers 1½d. each, to be prepaid by Stamp.

The Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded to Sydney, C. B., from whence they are despatched by the French packet during the summer months, and from Halifax direct in the winter months. Letters 5d.; when posted in the interior, 3d. additional,—*prepayment optional*.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 3d. on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America. To any part of the United States 6d.; to Oregon and California 9d.

Letters posted in any Town within the Province for delivery in the same Town, are liable to a rate of *one penny* for every $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce.

Newspapers pass *free* to any part of the Province, British North America and the United States when sent by *land Mail*—to be put up in covers open at the ends.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Hanbills, and other printed matter of a like description, put up in covers open at the ends, and without any written communication, may be sent from any part of the Province to any place within the same, as well as through Nova Scotia, at the rate of *one penny* per oz.,—*prepayment optional*, except when addressed to the United States, in which case the postage must be *prepaid*.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals, or books, bound or unbound, done up in covers open at the ends, unaccompanied by any written communication, may be transmitted as above mentioned through the Mails in this Province: not exceeding 2 oz. in weight—*free*; 2 oz. and not 3, 4, 5 oz. and not 1, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ l.; adding $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every additional oz. up to 48 oz., beyond which weight they cannot be sent.

Parliamentary papers pass *free* through Nova Scotia; if forwarded by packet, 1d. for every 4 ounces.

British reprints of copyright works from the United States, by *land mail* or *steamer*, charged letter postage.

For Dartmouth, *daily*—postage *ad*.

For Musquodibit Harbor, every Tuesday morning, at 9 o'clock.

Return Mail due on every Monday afternoon, at 5 o'clock.

For Prospect, on Saturday afternoon, at 2 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday morning, at 11 o'clock.

For Ketch Harbor and Sambro, on Friday evening, at 10 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday.

Letters for *Registry* must be posted half an hour previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be forwarded, and the *postage*, as well as the registration *fee*, must be *prepaid*.

Letters *prepaid by Stamps*, and dropped into the Letter Box any time during the night, and up to 5 o'clock, A. M., will be forwarded by the mails despatched same morning.

When the mails from England arrive before 9, P. M., they are delivered the same evening, and after that hour, at 7 next morning.

All other Mails arriving before 7, P. M., will be delivered the same evening,—if after that hour and before 8, at 6 o'clock,—and if after 8, at 7 o'clock the *following* morning.

The Postmaster-General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.

The Postmaster-General has the exclusive privilege of receiving and conveying letters within the Province—any person receiving and conveying letters will incur a penalty of 5s. for every letter so conveyed; except, 1. Letters sent to be mailed in the first Way or Post Office; 2. Letters addressed to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a pri-

vate vessel not being a packet boat; 3. Letters sent by a messenger on purpose, concerning the private affairs of the sender or receiver; 4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Post Office; 5. Letters of merchants, owners of merchant vessels, or cargo sent by such vessels, and delivered to the person to whom addressed without charge or pay. No person is obliged to send any pamphlet, printed book, or newspaper, by post. Masters of vessels arriving in the province are entitled to a 1^d. for each letter they deliver to the Postmaster at the first office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate when inward bound.

PARCEL POST.—Parcels closed at the ends and sides may be posted at any Post Office in Nova Scotia, for conveyance to any other Post Office (not Way Office) in the Province. No letters to be enclosed, and the parcel not to contain any explosive substance, glass, liquids, or other matter likely to injure the ordinary contents of the mail. Weight of parcel not to exceed 3 lbs., nor the size to exceed one foot in length or breadth, or 6 inches in thickness. Under 1 lb., 1s. 3d.; more than 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs., 2s. 6d.; more than 2 lbs. and not exceeding 3 lbs., 3s. 9d. Must be prepaid by *Postage Stamps*. If the number of Stamps affixed be insufficient to prepay the proper rate, the deficiency will be rated unpaid, with a fine of 6d. in addition. The parcel must have the words "By Parcel Post" plainly written over the address—to be put up strongly, and legibly addressed to the Post Office address of the intended receiver, and also the County in which the Post Office is situated. The following example of the mode of address is recommended:

The name and address of the sender being written on the parcel, it will, if delivery should fail from any cause, be returned unopened, on payment of an additional rate of 1s. 3d. for the return conveyance.

POST OFFICE MONEY ORDERS are given for any sum under and up to Five pounds. Charge for the same, *seepence*,—to be paid by the applicant for the Order. The following offices only are authorised to issue and pay Money Orders: Amherst, Antigonish, Annapolis, Arichat, Baddeck, Digby, Guysborough, Halifax, Kentville, Lunenburg, Liverpool, Pieton, Port Hood, Shelburne, Sydney, Truro, Windsor and Yarmouth. Other offices will be added to this list as the public convenience may require.
