DECREASE IN NUMBER OF TUBERCULOSIS CASES SINCE DISPENSARY WAS OPENED

Good Work Needs More Support, However—Contributions During the Last Year Not Numerous—Efficient Nurse in Charge, and Many Cases Are Being Treated.

Wednesday, Nov. 26. In the absence of Mr. Justice, Mr. Knowlton, the retiring president, Mrs. D. McLellan was in the chair at the annual meeting of the St. John Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis...

We are glad to be able to record that, after considerable agitation and much discussion, since our last meeting a special commission, called the Commission of the St. John County Hospital, has been appointed and is proceeding to build on the site selected.

The executive of the St. John Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis beg to present their annual report of the work done since the last annual meeting held in November, 1912.

At that time you were informed that an up to date dispensary had been opened in the Water and Sewerage building and the work has been carried on steadily during the year under an efficient staff of doctors and an experienced nurse.

The dispensary has been open 136 days during the year and there have been 588 attendances of which 446 were children, and 888 prescriptions were filled, seventy-eight new cases were reported during the year.

Referring to the advantages of the government controlling extension, he said that often a company extended a line into a new district, and for some years it produced little revenue as the district was gradually filling up.

When there was no government control of rates it was a public advantage to have two or three competitive carriers to keep down the rates, but with government control it is better to restrict to the one line in any territory.

Our dispensary is now one of the examining centres for the River Glade Sanatorium and Doctor Townshend is there the first Thursday in every month for that purpose.

Anyone interested in the work would be a welcome visitor at the dispensary.

Miss Sutherland, our present nurse, who has been with us during the year, has proved most efficient and has done a large amount of work and as the dispensary work increases as it has done during the last year there is no doubt that a second nurse will be a necessity.

With regard to funds our aim is to have 1,000 annual subscribers at \$1 each and at the present time we have only 293.
