How to Make Fire-Proof Buildings. [From the Industrial Monthly.] Thoroughly burned bricks which are made of a good quality of clay, laid up in a lime mortar made of caustic lime and clean sand, will make a wall which will en dure, with little or no injury, all the heat that can be produced by burning any dwelling house or other building close to its side. Let us contemplate for a moment the intense heat to which the brick wall sof a drain tile kiln, of an earthen pottery, of a drain tile kiln, of an earthen pottery, is exposed. The brick walls of such kilns are exposed for several days and nights to a heat more intense than would be produced by the burning down of a large edifice; yet such walls continue servicable for a long time. In addition to substantial brick walls, a building cannot be considered fireproof unless the windows are provided with outside shutters which will endure the intense heat of a burning building. Shutters made of thick sheet fron or plate iron, even half an inch in thickness, would soon be heated to redness, so that the wooden casings, bars, and stiles of the window-asahes would readily take fire. Fireproof shutters could be made of brick clay, say three or four inches in thickness, which would be a perfect security against any fire that might occur outside the walls of a building. The clay for sun shutters could be moulded in flasks hooked together at the conners, so that the parts could be removed without marring the edgee and corners. One side of the shutters—or even both sides—could be moulded to represent panels, stiles, and bars. As iron hinges would melt if of east iron, or would bend if made of wrought iron, when exposed to a great heat, the proper way to provide for hinges would be to make holes in the clay near one content at he bottom and top for iron dowel-pins, one end of which should enter a hole in a large shoulder piece made of burned elay, set in the wall with the bricks. By this arrangement, such clay shutters could be thrown open and be made to turn back flatly against the wall; and, when closed, they would cover the window-ways and doorways so completely that the sashes, glass, and doors would not be injured by a fire outside. Intense heat might crack some of the shutters; yet they would protect the woodwork from boing burned, and the cash cost of new ones would not equal the expense of woodens whatters.

A fire-proof roof is not so readily made as the walls; yet the asbestos roofing material, which is employed extensively for roofing purposes, will endure an intense heat unharmed. Perhaps there is no other roofing material now in use that will stand the fury of a raging fire so long as this; yet a roof may be rendered thoroughly fire proof by first covering the foundation with felting and asbestos, then laying a course of hard bricks in good cement mortar over the entire roof. Brick tiles one foot square would be preferable to bricks. It would be utterly impossible for any fire from an adjoining building to damage the roof when covered by brick-tiles two inches thick.
