Locast of Labrador.—The following remarks and information relating to the coast of Labrador, between Cape St Charles and Sudwich Bay, are by Navigating Lieutenant George J Tenlin, of H M S Edipse, 1873:

Round Hill Island, about 35 miles to the northward of Bel'e Isle, is the best land fall to make on this part of the coast of Labrador, it being detached, remarkable, and the east side clear of all danger.

The Coast—the islands between Round Hill Island and the main are incorrectly laid down upon the chart No 266; the good passage there shows only break when a high sea is running.
