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


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

JUNE BUILDING OPERATIONS.

In Toronto, for the month of June there were 571 building permits issued, the estimated value of which is \$1,350,142. This makes a total of \$6,195,470 for the first six months of this year, showing an increase of \$1,701,144 in value of buildings erected, as compared with the same period of last year.

In Montreal, there were 166 permits for new buildings granted, of an estimated value of \$2,343,579. For alterations 55 permits were issued, valued at \$72,585. The estimated value of buildings erected there up to the end of June totals \$4,990,375, showing an increase of \$2,126,536 over last year.

In Winnipeg, there were 416 building permits issued valued at \$1,285, 250. This shows a decrease of \$739,150 as compared with June of 1905.

In Hamilton the value of buildings for which permits have been taken out for the first six months of 1906 is \$760,000, an increase of about \$30,000 over the record of the same period last year.

In Vancouver permits were issued in June to the value of \$296,000, whereas in June of 1905 their value was \$131,500.



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
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
