PASSED IN THE SECOND SESSION OF THE FOURTH PROVINCIAL PARLIAMENT OF UF-PER CANADA, MET AT YORK, ON THE FOURTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, IN THE FORTY-SIXTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF OUR SOVEREIGN LORD GEORGE THE THIRD, AND PROROGUED ON THE THIRD DAY OF MARCH FOLLOWING.

CHAP. I.

An ACT to make Provision for sertain Sheriffs in this Province.

[Passed 3d March, 1806.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

THEREAS it is necessary to make fome provision for such Sheriffs in this Province, who have no Salaries established by Law; may it please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Counciland Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and affembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the Rates and Duties already raifed, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raifed, levied and collected, to and for the uses of this Province, there shall be granted annually to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, the sum of three hundred pounds laries to the Currency, out of the Provincial Treasury, from such monies now remaining, Eastern & Wes-

tern Diffricts, of the Districts of London, Niagara, Newcattie and Johnstown.

or which may hereafter come into the Receiver General's hands unappropriated, which faid fum of three hundred pounds thall be appropriated and applied for the payment of Salaries, to the perfons hereafter mentioned, in manner following, (Finat is to fay) to the Sheriffs of the Eastern and Western Districts, and the Sheriffs of the Districts of London, Niagara, Newcastle, and Jonnstown, for the time being, the sum of fifty pounds respectively.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefait, That the Sheriff of each and every District in this Province, shall give a Bond jointly and severally with two sufficient Sureties, to his Majesty, his heirs or successors, in the sum of one thousand pounds, with a condition, that the same shall be void if the said Sheriff shall pay over all money which he may collect, either to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, or to any person who may be entitled to the same. Provided however, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to debar any person or persons from having his, her, or their remedy against such Sheriff or Sheriffs, for any breach of duty, in such manner as is or may be provided by any law or usage now in sorce.

III. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the monies hereby granted to his Majesty, shall be paid by the Receiver General in discharge of such Warrant, or Warrants as shall for the purposes aforesaid, be from time to time issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person Administering the Government; and the said Receiver General shall account to his Majesty for the same, through the Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as his Majesty shall direct.

HEREAS it would very much advance the general prosperity of this Province, if the public Highways and Roads already laid out in the several districts thereof were amended and repaired, and new and additional Roads were laid out and opened in certain parts of the Province, to which at present there is very difficult access, and certain Bridges are also become indispensibly necessary, the want of which at present much endangers the lives of the King's Subjects; and whereas the rates heretofore imposed, and the duty by Law required to be performed, on the faid public Highways and Roads are altogether inadequate to the several purposes aforesaid, and the imposing additional burthens by levying District Rates sufficient for the several purposes asoresaid, would, in the present circumstances of the Province, be found inconvenient, and the necessary provision can only be made out of the surplus of certain duties and taxes as yet unappropriated: Be it Enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, conflittited and affembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "an Act to repeal certain parts. of an Act, passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "an Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That an Act passed in the forty-fourth year of the reign of his Majesty, intituled, "an Act for granting to his Majesty a certain sum of money out of the funds applicable to the uses of this Province, to defray the expences of amending and repairing the public Highways and Roads, and building Bridges in the several districts thereof," be, and the same is hereby repealed.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the due application of the faid lum of money, pursuant to the directions of this Act, shall be accounted for to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as his Majesty, his heirs and successors shall direct.
