When country people come to the city they sometimes wonder that city people do not take more advantage of the many opportunities for education and amusement that the city holds out. But, as a city bred person, I must say that I think it still more remarkable that the country people do not take more advantage of the opportunities for sports that the country holds out to them.

A woman who was spending a month in a beautiful winter resort to which people come from all over the country for snowshoeing and skiing and skating, was obliged to call a nurse for a few days and was supplied with one from the nearest small town. This nurse had never skated and had never even seen anyone on snowshoes or skis. And yet she had lived all her life in the heart of a district thickly fitted by nature for the enjoyment of all these sports.

Many Country People Never Hike.

Again, one seldom finds people in the country who realize the infinite joys of tramping. The whole countryside is open to them, they do not have to go through a tedious preliminary of travel before they can find the open road, and yet hiking remains an unknown sport to nine-tenths of them. Where I spend the summer, on the shores of a beautiful lake, I find many of the country people who have never boated in it or swum in it.

So Many Simple Pleasures Free.

I suppose it is inevitable that the greatest adventures should be those that we go afar to seek. But the adventure only comes now and then, and daily life is always with us.

Surely country folks would greatly advantage themselves if they learned to sweeten that daily life all they can with the simple, healthful pleasures that are free to them. And one would think they would exult in the thought that want the city dweller must pay (and often pay high for) is theirs for the taking.

Household Notes.

Excellent succotash can be made with dried lima beans and dried corn. Milk must be kept covered to prevent molds from the air getting into it.

Onions cooked with milk, cheese, or a meat flavor, make a satisfactory dish.

When the stock that you have is not enough or seems not to have sufficient flavor add one can of a good manufactured soup.

Scalloped potatoes with an onion in the seasoning make a very savory dish.

IMPROVING THE HANDS.

There are two methods of giving the hands sufficient sleep. One is to allow them to lie in the lap and rest. It may be difficult to do this but it should become a fixed habit.

Another way is to put them to sleep in a pair of leather gloves at least two sizes too large, like a pair of men's gloves. Before putting them on the hands should be coated with a coating of some good skin food. This sleep should be given the hands, not only when you are asleep, but at any time of the day when you can find it convenient to give them rest.

This does not mean idleness for the hands, for to be healthy every member of the body must have exercise. There is a vast difference between moving them in work or exercise and the habit of idling. Hands may be exercised and improved by performing the housework, so long as too great a strain is not given them and precautionary measures are adopted.

For instance, there is dishwashing. The prevailing idea is that to wash dishes is to destroy the beauty of the hands. This is not necessarily so and if the hands are properly protected there will be no ill effects from this work.

Before beginning the dish washing, the hands and nails should be thoroughly coated with cold cream, rubbing it well into the pores. They can then be put into soapy water without fear of injury. As soon as the task is completed the hands should be carefully washed with a mild toilet soap and warm water, carefully dried and another coating of the cream rubbed in. Remove any cream that remains on the surface of the skin with a soft cloth, using considerable friction.

Draft all Men Under 18 for Offensive

WAR SUMMARY.

The second phase of the great battle along the Somme which the Germans began on Thursday last has died. It lasted less than three days and the fighting has resolved itself into more or less isolated engagements in which the French and British Allies have more than held their own. The attention of the Germans at the present is mainly directed at the lower end of the battle zone which apparently they are attempting to enlarge for the purpose of getting elbow room in which to move their vast masses of troops. Meanwhile General Schuler, commander in chief of the British, is hiding his force, meeting the German assaults with great resistance and here and there conforming to the line to the necessities of the battle. It is confidentially stated at Paris that he will not be drawn into any plan to move, but will strike with his reserves at the proper moment. At the onset of the German offensive, when it was sweeping the Allied front, notwithstanding their tenacious resistance, Emperor William, it was announced officially from Belgium, was in supreme command. The announcement was regarded at the time as evidence that the Emperor would take a complete and decisive victory, then, however, British and French and American reinforcements came up. The British on Sunday engaged in sharp local fighting at various points and repulsed German winter attacks launched in the neighborhood of Bucquoy. West of the line, a German detachment which had gained a footing in the French lines was forced out by the French. German efforts along the Oise to enlarge their present gains, were contained in the sector between Chauny and Barisis. The Germans apparently have been successful in their operations in this sector and have pushed down south from Chauny and Ferrière, capturing the village of Barisis and Polembray, the latter in the southern outskirts of the river Coucy Wood. They report a capture of 1,400 prisoners and heavy French losses. The official news of the events of Saturday when the British infantry forces storming the German positions around Beaumont Hamel and Albert, and French divisions attacked the Germans on the western bank of the Aisne. These engagements, according to the German report, resulted in failure for the Allies. Haig reports that a German attack on the British lines was repulsed and the British attacked in Aveluy Wood, which placed the British in positions of far more danger ground.

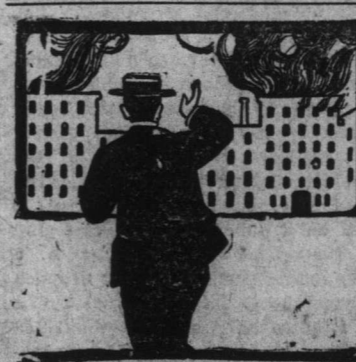
