

WHO SHALL BE MINISTER OF EDUCATION?

It may be accepted as settled beyond all doubt that the Hon. Adam Crooks will never again undertake the task of administering the education department.

Our recommendation is that Mr. Mowat himself should assume the educational portfolio. That department is by far the most important in the public service.
