We observe by the speech which the New Brunswick legislature was opened last week that the government of that province proposes to add in the establishment of cold storage warehouses at certain points in that province.

This question of cold storage is one of very great importance. It seems to be desired that most of our surplus produce should find a market in England; and, such being the case, the question of facilities for shipping there in good condition becomes one of vital importance.

It is, of course, not the duty of our local authorities to assist in establishing cold storage for steamers. That would appear to be one of those matters relating to trade and traffic which have been given to the care and control of the federal authorities; but, the erection of cold storage warehouses at a few central points in the province is a matter which might very properly be aided by the provincial government.

There is, no doubt, some force in the contention of our correspondent. Where information is laid for a first offence, and the Inspector feels reasonably well satisfied in the strength of his evidence, it would seem that the services of a legal gentleman ought not to be required.

Still, we presume the people of the county do not want to make a profit out of Scott Act cases. He thinks it rather peculiar that every year the entire amount collected in fines should be required to pay for legal services in connection with the prosecution, while the salary of the Inspector has to be paid by the county, and he intimates that our Inspector and Sundry Magistrates ought by this time to be thoroughly well acquainted with the law to be able to dispose with the services of a lawyer.

It looks a little generous to pay a lawyer ten dollars for his services of an afternoon and throw in railway and hotel expenses besides.

For corn two mixtures are used. One is a mixture of bone meal and marlate of potash. The other is bonemeal and marlate of potash. There is little choice between them. Everything is broadcast for corn, except that when tobacco stems are applied and ploughed in one of the above mixtures is used in the drill.
