Montreal Stock Market.

MARKET GENERALLY FIRM — WAR EAGLE SOARS BUT REACTS SHARPLY — GAS VERY STRONG — BUSINESS IS WELL SPREAD OVER THE LIST.

A good speculative demand was the cause of a strong market, when manipulation is so largely accountable for advances it is very difficult to read a market. The inclination to accept profits is small, and there is certainly no selling movement in sight; in spite of this those having good profits should allow new comers to have a chance, and not expect the "last cent." Greed has caused handsome profits to dwindle into thin air. The leading stocks are well held, and no immediate anxiety need be entertained by holders, but the above course is worthy of consideration.

Canadian Pacific was quiet at yesterday's prices. As the earnings for this month will compare with small months for last year large increases may be expected and when these are realized on the other side the stock will surely go up. All sales this morning were at 85½.

Montreal Street was only steady at 294, small sales were made at 294½. There is very little profit taking in this stock even at the advance.

Montreal Gas was a prime favorite and sold up to 211, a broken lot selling at 211½, the latest sales were at the best prices and it closes steady. 1735 shares changed hands.

Toronto Railway was largely dealt in at 109½ down to 109. There seems a disposition to realize on this stock. Sales made at these prices may show a profit, but it is not wise to sell this stock on chances of getting it back much lower.

War Eagle resumed its upward flight but reacted a point and a half closing at 321 to 322. A large business was done and higher prices are spoken of. The current figures discount a great deal, the stock is high enough and the pace has, of late, been too great to last. Over 12,000 shares changed hands.

The rest of the business was spread over about ten issues but did not result in much change as to prices. Dominion Cotton was higher, as was also Com. Cable of which 87 shares changed hands.
