# CONSTITUTION

OF

## The Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto.

INCORPORATED BY THE STATUTE OF CANADA.

7 VICTORIA, CAP. 68,

FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS :

**FIRST**—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church, in the said Diocese.

**SECONDLY**—For the encouragement of Education, and for the support of Day-schools and Sunday-schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

**THIRDLY**—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.

**FOURTHLY**—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.

**FIFTHLY**—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment and maintenance of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church, in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage-houses; the setting apart of Burial-grounds and Church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowments.

### I.

That before the Society shall enter upon business at any of its meetings, the following Prayers be said :—

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help ; that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O God, from Whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign, Queen VICTORIA, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory.

Prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries, who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O MERCIFUL GOD, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live; have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels and Heretics, and also upon all those Heathen Nations on whom the light of Thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone: especially the Indians of this Continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

OUR FATHER, which art in Heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, As it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil: For Thine is the Kingdom, The power, and the glory, For ever and ever. *Amen.*

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED:

ALMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, we Thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving-kindness to us and to all men: more particularly, for the providential support by which this Society hath been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of Thy sacred truth. But above all, for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world, by Thy blessed Son, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory, which Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to Whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God; and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. *Amen.*

II.

That all those who now are, or who shall hereafter become Members of the Association, and who shall subscribe Ten Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute as much as Five Pounds in one sum, shall be associated Members of the Society, and shall be eligible to be Members of the Corporation.

III.

That every Incorporated Member subscribe not less than One Pound Five Shillings annually to the funds of the Society, or contribute not less than Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings in one sum, or lands to the value of Twenty-five Pounds; and that the Standing Committee be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether associated members or not, to be elected into the Corporation as Life Members, who shall have contributed through any of the Parochial Associations in connexion with the Society, in money, the sum of Twenty Pounds, or in land to the value of Thirty Pounds, for any of the following special purposes: To be invested or held in trust for the endowment of a Church, Rectory or Living within the Diocese. To be invested or held in trust for the Widows and Orphans' Fund, or to be invested or held in trust for the endowment of a Church, School, or, to be applied to the building of a Church, the building or purchase of a Parsonage House, or the building of a Church School.

## IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the Members appointed by the Charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by ballot members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation for its stated meetings. Provided always that the whole number of members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

## V.

That the Standing Committee of the Society, to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

## VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese shall be Vice-Presidents.

## VII.

That the Society shall, at their Meeting on the first Wednesday in June in each year, choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents, in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Treasurer or Treasurers; two or more Auditors: one Secretary and one Assistant Secretary; and such other officers, ministers and servants, as shall be thought convenient, to serve in the said offices for the year ensuing.

## VIII.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in July, a list of seven Members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing; that at that Meeting any Member be at liberty to propose another list of seven Members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the standing Committee; and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in August.

## IX.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a Meeting, to be held at the usual place of meeting of the Society, at such time as shall be specified in the notice of such Meeting: and that such Members of the Corporation as shall be present at the Meeting, or a majority of them, shall and may choose an officer or officers in the room or place of such person or persons so dead or removed, as to them shall seem meet. Provided, that it shall not be necessary for any such Meeting to be called for supplying a vacancy in the office of Vice-President: but the President may do so in his discretion.

## X.

That the Society shall and may, on the first Wednesday in every month, for ever hereafter, and oftener if occasion requires, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or at such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or Standing Committee have power to call a Special Meeting of the said Society at any time.

## XI.

That no act done in any Meeting of the said Society shall be valid and effectual, unless the President, or some of the Vice-Presidents, shall be present at such Meeting.

## XII.

And with regard to all Meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering, or repealing any By-Laws, Rules or Regulations, at such meetings, it is to be specially noticed, that by the Act of the Legislature incorporating this Society, (7 Vic. ch. 68.) it is enacted that no act done in any such assembly or meeting of the Corporation shall be valid or effectual, unless six persons of the Corporation, at the least, shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto.

And further, that no Constitution, By-Law, Rule or Regulation, of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change, or alteration of the same, shall be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese, for the time being, by writing under his hand.

## XIII.

That a Standing Committee, consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer or Treasurers, Secretary and Assistant Secretary, and not more than twenty other Members, (three of whom shall be a quorum), be appointed to prepare matters for the consideration of the Monthly Meetings.

## XIV.

That Minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each Meeting of the Society the Minutes of the preceding Meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

## XV.

That the Accounts of the Society be closed on the thirty-first day of March in each year; and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

## XVI.

That the Treasurer manage the receipts and expenditure, under the orders of the Society; and that he keep his accounts in such manner as shall from time to time be directed by the Auditors, subject to the control of the Society.

## XVII.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take Minutes of the proceedings of the General Meetings and Committees, and prepare the Annual Report of the Society.

## XVIII.

In connexion and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts (as shall be approved by the President,) into which the Province is by law divided; the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the same, and all other members of the Church who shall contribute in aid of the Society's funds; the Archdeacon, or senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall, *ex-officio*, be Chairman of such District Branch Association, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, the Clergy of the several Parishes or Missions within the bounds of such District, and one or two Laymen from each of the same, a Secretary and Treasurer.

A general Meeting of each Branch District Association shall be held in each year, at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management,—not less than five to form a quorum,—shall be held, for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Branch Association.

In order the more fully to carry out the objects of the Society, each Parish, in the person of its Clergyman and Churchwardens, shall be a Sub-Association, in correspondence, through its Chairman, (the Clergymen), with the District Branch Association, and may be denominated *The Parochial Committee of the Church Society*. The Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods, as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the Parishioners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every means in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All moneys raised to be transmitted to the Treasurer of the District Association.

One-fourth of all moneys paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the District Committees respectively, shall be transmitted to the Treasurer of the General Society, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining three-fourths of all such Collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of the Society,—the allotment to be made at the Quarterly Meetings of the District Branch Association. All moneys not required to be expended for local purposes, and remaining unappropriated at the General Annual Meeting of the District Association, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto.

The District Associations, through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute statement of all receipts and expenditure within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a Report, once in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual Meeting of such District Branch Association.

## XIX.

That four Sermons be preached annually in the several Churches, Chapels, and Stations in this Diocese, in aid of the funds of the Society, at such times as the Lord Bishop shall appoint; that of these collections the proceeds of one

shall be for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen deceased ; that the proceeds of two of the said Annual Sermons shall be devoted to the maintenance of Travelling or Resident Missionaries in this Diocese ; and that the proceeds of the fourth shall be appropriated to any other object embraced within its Constitution, as the Society may from time to time direct.

## XX.

That the Charter and these By-laws do together form the Constitution of The Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and that nothing which is contained in the Constitution of the Society established on the 28th day of April, 1842, or in any By-law, Rule or Regulation, amending or altering the same, shall apply to, or be in force in respect to, the Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, except such provisions thereof as are above continued in force.



EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF  
**The Incorporated Church Society**  
OF THE  
DIOCESE OF TORONTO,  
PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AT TORONTO,  
HELD ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 5TH, 1850.

---

THE continued prosperity of the Society, whose eighth Anniversary we have met to commemorate, whilst it serves to keep before us our infinite indebtedness to the Divine Head of the Church, may remind us also of the reflection expressed with inspired wisdom in the familiar words of the Royal Psalmist,—“Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity.” The advantage of confederation, even for secular purposes, has passed into a proverb; but the strength which union gives is never so apparent as when it assumes the form of Church fellowship; when its object is the highest object that immortal beings can have in view,—to spread the Gospel of Christ in the communion of that Church in which “the Lord hath commanded the blessing, even life for evermore.” Union for this purpose—a purpose which is one and the same with the commission of the Church—is something more than expediency, and it is on higher grounds than those of human foresight, energy, and skill, that success may be confidently expected. It is because the designs of this religious and charitable Corporation fall in, as we believe, with God’s revealed plans for the conversion and salvation of sinners, that we feel ourselves entitled to take comfort from all the commendations in Holy Scripture pronounced upon, and all the promises made to, that happy state when “believers are of one heart and of one soul,”—inspired with a common ardour in one great enterprise, and, with common cordiality and zeal, contributing of their worldly substance to promote it. Surely, then, it is not exceeding the bounds of a pious and rational trust in Divine Providence, to devoutly apply to our own under-

taking the Psalmist's significant metaphor, and to express our conviction that upon that undertaking—so long as it shall be conceived in faith and nurtured with prayer—God's grace will come down, "as the dew of Hermon, and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion,"—to refresh, fertilise, and adorn,—invited by our unity, and, at the same time, renewing its strength and expanding its affections.

It is fruitless, however, to eulogize the Institutions of the Church, or even to set ourselves about working them out, unless we study to do all in the spirit of the Church. It is the Church which we are labouring to build up, and the Church herself, under her Divine Head, has both furnished us with the materials which we are to use, and instructed us as to the manner in which we are to use them. For this reason, because our efficiency depends so much upon our conformity with the principles and even with the machinery of the Church, it is a matter of congratulation that, during the past year, increased attention has been given to the Parochial subdivision of labour, in the formation of Parochial Committees. The organization of these Committees in Toronto was noticed in last year's Report, and in this City the most beneficial results have accrued from them. Since that time the same course has been pursued in various Parishes in the Home District and elsewhere. This we must regard as a most judicious movement towards fully carrying out the Constitution of the Society, and it is hoped that no long period will elapse before a Parochial Committee has been similarly established in every Parish or Mission within the Diocese. The wisdom of the Church's Parochial system has been proved by the experience of centuries, and it is certain that there is nothing on which we could depend for doing the work of the Church with the same regularity,—the same even, steady, and constantly-growing efficiency. We wish, therefore, to enlist the full vigour of this admirable system in behalf of the Church Society to the greatest possible extent of which the circumstances of the Diocese will admit. It is not saying too much to affirm that the Church, except in a position purely and entirely Missionary, could not prosper without it; and every one must feel that the Societies of the Church will thrive just in proportion as they contain those integral elements of spiritual life and power which are essential to the Church itself. It is a great point gained when we can bring a brother-churchman to say:—"This Parochial Association commends itself to my affectionate support as a Parishioner. I do not feel myself any more at liberty to neglect this object, than I am to neglect the Church in which I worship. Included within the limits assigned to my Pastor as his particular cure of souls, I consider it a duty to frequent that House of God in which he has been ap-

pointed to minister; and, on the same principle of Parochial communion, I hold myself bound to sustain, to the utmost of my ability, such a Parochial Institution as this Branch of the Church Society claims to be: to both of these duties I am pledged as a Christian man, and both, with God's help, I am resolved to perform." This, it is true, may be considered as taking low ground, since, in the bosom of a Church which holds fast to the glorious title "Catholic," it is appealing to mere local sympathies, and working upon local interests; but local attachments are censurable only when they are carried to excess and become selfish; when they check or extinguish our solicitude for other portions of the Church Catholic, and hinder us from compassionating, as we ought to do, the destitute and alienated condition of the world at large.

The present is the first Anniversary of the Society at which our venerable Diocesan has not presided. If His Lordship's absence were caused by any personal affliction or calamity it would, indeed, be a subject for deep regret, and the "garment of praise," which God's unmerited mercies have allowed us to put on, would be superseded by a "spirit of heaviness." But, when we consider the importance of the mission which has deprived us of his presence on this occasion, and taken him to England; when we have the gratification of remembering that he parted from us in good health and spirits, fully strengthened, as we believe, for his arduous undertaking; and since welcome tidings have reached us of his safe arrival in our Mother land, and of the promising first-fruits of what we hope will be an abundant harvest of Christian offerings,—we feel that, under these circumstances, we can be reconciled to his absence, and cheerfully resign him to the gracious keeping of that God "whose he is, and whom he serves." We have not forgotten, moreover, that his present exertions are devoted to one of the objects contemplated in the Constitution of this Society, viz, "the encouragement of education in conformity with the principles of the Church." His Lordship, it is true, has not invited the Church Society to make any movement in the enterprise which is now engaging his attention; but, on the contrary, has commenced, and is pursuing, that enterprise through means which are quite distinct from the Society's operations. The Society, however, cannot but be deeply interested in the efforts which their venerable and beloved President is now making at Home,—efforts which have been prompted by a spirit peculiarly zealous and intrepid, and will, we trust, secure to the Church in this Diocese the equitable right and privilege of training the minds of her own youth to the pursuit and acquisition of human learning in the way which is most consistent with her own principles, and most conducive to the well-being, both temporal and eternal, of her children.

## INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

The following is a brief statement of the Society's income for the past year:—

From this statement, compared with that of last year, it appears that there has been a falling off in the Income of the Parent Society of £286 13s. 2d; but on the total receipts of the Society, including Branches, there has been an aggregate increase of £359 3s. 2d.

## THE ANNUAL SERMONS.

Only three Sermons have been preached during the year on behalf of the special objects provided for by the 19th Article of the Constitution.

## DEPOSITORY.

The issues from the Depository, including grants of books to the value of £50 13s. 6d., have amounted to £916 1s. 1½d., which is £102 13s. 1d. less than last year. This decrease has arisen from the fact, that the books purchased for the Depository during the year, have been to a much less amount than formerly.

## PROPERTY INVESTED IN STOCK.

The sum of £90 16s. 10½d. has been paid on instalments upon Building Society Stock held on behalf of the Widows and Orphans' Fund. The sum of £26 17s. 6d. was paid as a first instalment on lands in Ameliasburgh, and £2 10s. 0d. on lands held for the benefit of Students in Divinity. A call was made by the British America Fire and Life Assurance Company, upon which the Society paid £125, which has been charged to the temporary investment fund.

## DISTRICT BRANCHES.

From most of the District Branches, during the past year, favorable reports have been received. The District Branches are now *eleven* in number,—the Eastern District Branch, which formerly comprehended the Eastern, Johnstown, Bathurst, and Dalhousie Districts, having dissolved itself, and assumed a different organization in two separate District Branches, under the names and titles respectively of the Johnstown Deanery District Branch, and the Bathurst Deanery District Branch,—the limits of each of these Branches corresponding with the territorial divisions of the respective Deaneries.

The District Branches, as at present constituted, are, therefore, as before stated, *eleven* in number:—

*Newcastle District.*

It is most satisfactory to be able to state that the operation of this active Branch continues still as vigorous and efficient as ever. Notwithstanding the severe commercial depression from which the country, at large, has been suffering, the Managing Committee report a considerable increase in the revenues of this District Branch during the past year, and we are rejoiced to receive from them the assurance that there are good reasons for believing that this increase will be progressive. Meetings in behalf of the Society have been held in the following places, viz:—Darlington, Cartwright, Manvers, Cavan, Port Hope, Seymour, Percy, Colborne, Grafton, and Cobourg. Since the last Annual Meeting, the Townships of Seymour and Percy have received the benefit of a resident clergyman; and the Reverend C. Bower is now engaged in extending the ministrations of the Church in those parts. In the Township of Seymour, an effort has been auspiciously commenced to accomplish the erection of a Church, the sum of £65 having been subscribed at a preliminary meeting held with reference to this object. The parishioners of Grafton have made a most laudable demonstration of Christian zeal, in procuring a Parsonage-house for their Minister, at an expense which, when we take into account the circumstances of the Parish, must be deemed considerable. There are now in connection with this Branch, twelve Parochial Committees, whose united income for the past year is £176 4s. 8d., which exhibits an increase over the previous year of

£43 19s. 4d., and is a larger amount than was ever before raised within the District for this purpose.

(*Extracts from the last Annual Report of this District Branch.*)

**DARLINGTON ASSOCIATION.**—The first of our Parochial meetings in connexion with this District Branch, was held in the village of Bowmanville, on the 8th January, at which the Rector of the Parish presided. The Report was highly favourable, shewing that the Churchmen of Darlington were fully alive to their responsibilities, and desirous of cordially co-operating in the designs of the Society. The Treasurer's account shewed a balance in hand of £5 7s. 9d., which, together with the proportion of £1 17s. 6d. paid to the Travelling Missionary, gives the sum of £7 5s. 4d., the total amount collected by this Parochial Committee during the past year.

**CLARKE.**—The Report from this Township was also considered satisfactory, the sum of £11 6s. 6d. being in the Treasurer's hands after paying over the sum of £1 17s. 6d. towards the Travelling Missionary's allowance. At the village of Newton there is a strong desire to build a Church, a site having been kindly granted by a gentleman in the neighbourhood, and it is hoped that this good work will be vigorously prosecuted without any needless delay. The Townships of Clarke and Darlington are rapidly improving in value and importance; and from the increasing number of Churchmen every year settling in that part of the District, they will require the labours, not of one, but of *four* clergymen, before the lapse of many years.

**CARTWRIGHT.**—A Parochial meeting was held in this Township on Wednesday, the 9th Jan., at which the venerable the Archdeacon of York presided as Chairman. This meeting was numerously attended;—but exclusive of a small contribution towards paying the expense of horse hire, it does not appear that anything has been done in furtherance of the objects of the Society, or any remittance made to its funds. We observed, however, that a church had been commenced, the frame of which had been already erected, and the roof enclosed, and an arrangement had been made with the contractors for the performance of the remainder of the work within a specified time.

**MANVERS.**—At Manvers a meeting was held on Thursday, the 10th Jan'y, which was also well attended. But as in the case of Cartwright, your Committee found with regret that nothing had been done since the last annual meeting.—However, the people of both these Townships were strongly urged by the clergy who addressed the meetings, to shake off their supineness, and make one general and united effort to raise a sufficient amount to entitle them to receive a Missionary, as soon as the Bishop could send one; which your Committee earnestly hope may be found practicable at the next Ordination. We feel persuaded that the inactivity of these Churchmen arises, not so much from any unwillingness to contribute of their means, as from the absence of a resident Clergyman, who would not only advocate and explain the objects of the Society, but organize and carry out the measures necessary for its support.

The Churchmen of Cartwright and Manvers are very numerous, and manifest a strong desire for the services of a resident clergyman. They are at present visited *alternately* once a-month by the Assistant Minister from Cobourg, who occasionally spends a week amongst them, stirring them up, and visiting their families, and so endeavouring to keep them steadfast in the faith. Their

allegiance to the Church of their fathers does not as yet appear to have suffered much deterioration, the rampant spirit of Sectarianism having happily not made much progress amongst them. But still, unless these scattered sheep of the wilderness are gathered into the fold of a settled pastor, the worst consequences are to be feared. The Rev. Ephraim Patterson, the Assistant Minister at Cobourg, has laboured most assiduously amongst these, otherwise spiritually destitute, people; and from the Journal kept by that Missionary, the average congregation at Cartwright appears to be about seventy, and in Manvers eighty; but on one occasion in the latter place it rose to 100. Since October last there have been twenty-two Baptisms; and the Holy Communion has been twice administered, once in Cartwright, by the Rev. T. S. Kennedy, to fifteen persons, and once in Manvers, by the Rev. S. Armour, on which occasion there were twenty-three communicants.

This shews what might be accomplished by the exertions of a settled Missionary in these two townships.

CAVAN.—Meetings were held in Cavan on the 10th and 11th January, at which four of the clergy of the District were present. That at St. John's Church was pretty well attended; but in consequence of the heavy and continued rain, the meeting at St. Paul's was very small. It does not appear that these Parochial Committees have as yet collected anything during the past year, but fresh committees were appointed, a subscription-list opened, and resolutions adopted for proceeding with the work with vigour.

PORT HOPE.—Your Committee, after these meetings in Cavan, proceeded to hold the annual meeting in Port Hope, on Friday, the 11th January. There were four clergymen here also, and doubtless but for the very unfavourable state of the weather, the attendance of the laity would have been much larger.

The Secretary's Report stated that, from various causes, especially from the scarcity of money, the collection on behalf of the Parochial Committee, last winter, was only one-half what it had been the preceding year. It further appeared that three shares had been taken in the Building Society, for the purpose of accumulating a fund to build a School-house; but from the difficulty of making the regular payments, these shares were subsequently sold out, and a new and more profitable investment made for carrying out the same object.

The Report concludes in these very significant words:—"If the Church Society, in its Port Hope Parochial Committee, were supported as it ought to be, and as it might be—if the congregation acted up to their duty as professing Christians—we might soon be enabled to enlarge this Church, and thus to obtain what we so much require, and what, if we do not obtain, the congregation cannot be expected to increase as it should do, namely—*room and revenue.*"

The Port Hope Parochial Committee have been enabled to raise, during the past year, the sum of £33 4s. 1d., from which the sum of £5 has been paid towards defraying the expenses of the Travelling Missionary in this District.

SEYMOUR.—Since the last Annual Meeting, the Townships of Seymour and Percy, have received the benefit of a resident clergyman; and the Rev. E. C. Bower, is now engaged in extending the ministrations of the Church in these parts.

A meeting was held in this township, on the 19th February, as well for the purpose of advocating the claims of the Society, as for taking into consideration

the necessity and importance of building a Church, as soon as the requisite means can be raised for that purpose. The attendance, though not numerous, was very respectable; and but for a calamitous fire which occurred in the neighbourhood at the same moment, by which the meeting was somewhat disorganized, it is believed that many more would have been present. However, those persons in attendance, appeared to be animated with the best possible spirit; and it is confidently hoped that this work of God will prosper in their hands. A building committee was appointed for the purpose of selecting a site, obtaining a plan, and soliciting subscriptions. Before the meeting separated, the few persons present subscribed the sum of £65, which, under the circumstances, was a very fair beginning. The Churchmen of Seymour have long been without a Church; and now that this want is generally felt and acknowledged, your Committee trust that the work will be prosecuted with vigour; and that the exertions of our brother Churchmen in this fine township, will be crowned with complete success.

**PARENT.**—A meeting was held here also on the 19th February, and although the attendance was very small, yet arrangements were made for appointing a Committee to collect subscriptions for the past year. The same was done in Seymour; and your Committee trust that before the closing of the Parent Society's next Annual Report, the result of these applications may be known, and some addition to the Society's funds be obtained from both these townships.

**COLBORNE.**—The Annual Meeting of this Parochial Committee was held on Wednesday the 20th Feb., and proved very satisfactory. Through the active exertions of the worthy Secretary, the sum of £12 10s. has been already subscribed and paid in, and it is believed that this amount will yet be increased before the final close of the accounts. One-fourth of this amount has, as usual, been paid over to the Treasurer of the District Branch, to be forwarded to the Parent Society, and the further sum of £1 17s. 6d. paid towards the expenses of the Travelling Missionary.

There appears a growing and increasing interest among the members of this Parochial Committee for the continued prosperity of the Church Society; and the Secretary declared that he never felt more happy than while collecting, from house to house, the contributions which, in every single instance, were freely and cheerfully paid.

**GRAFTON.**—The Annual meeting of this Parochial Committee was also held on Wednesday, the 20th, and your Committee are happy to state that nothing has occurred during the past year to damp the energies or to cripple the resources of this little Association. The parishioners of Grafton, though neither numerous nor wealthy, have always evinced a becoming zeal in the cause of religion, and have proved their attachment to the Church by properly valuing its ministrations, and contributing to its support. Within the past year this congregation has raised the sum of £100, which has enabled them to procure a Parsonage-house for their minister, as a permanent endowment for the parish. But so far from permitting this noble and praiseworthy effort to be any excuse for withholding their contributions from the general cause of the Church Society, they have raised, within the last few days, for this purpose, the handsome sum of £20. This is a much larger income than that of previous years, and proves what may be done by combined exertion, within a narrow sphere, even with limited means.



The amount thus obtained was raised by a Committee of ladies, and reflects the highest credit upon their united exertions, and Christian zeal in this good cause. From this amount the sum of £5 has been paid over to the District funds, and the further sum of £1 17s. 6d. towards defraying the expenses of the Travelling Missionary.

**CONVOCA.**—This Association, from its commencement, has always set a noble example of Christian zeal and munificence in furthering the cause of the Society; and your Committee are happy to state that every succeeding year shews an increase in its funds, and a large addition to its list of contributors. This large and flourishing parish, foremost in the District in point of numbers, respectability intelligence and wealth, will long remain, we trust, equally conspicuous for its hearty zeal in the service of God, and its generous and united co-operation in promoting the cause of Christ and His Church. The income of this Parochial Committee for the past year is £100 0s. 3d. From this amount, the largest yet obtained by your Committee, the sum of £23 17s. 1d. has been paid into the District funds for the general purposes of the Parent Society, and the further sum of £12 10s. to the Travelling Missionary's allowance. The remaining sum of £59 1s. 2d. is available for local purposes, to be invested by the Committee for the benefit of the parish. The investments in the Building Society are regularly attended to, and the amounts duly paid in, so that there is every reason to expect a profitable return from this source, at the expiration of the term of the Society.

*Midland and Victoria District.*

This Branch is still enabled to maintain its engagement with its Travelling Missionary, and its annual grant of £50 to the Pittsburg Mission. The income of the Parochial Associations of the Midland District has amounted this year to £181 8s. 0d., which is somewhat more than was received during the previous year.— We are sorry, however, to see it recorded, that the expenditure during the last fifteen months has exceeded the receipts; but we doubt not that strenuous measures will be promptly adopted to provide against the recurrence of such a deficiency, and to extend the usefulness of this valuable Branch. In the Parish of Napanee a good spirit was evinced by the laity at the Annual Meeting of the Parochial Association, but from having undertaken the support of a Clergyman for the Parish this year, they are unable, and will be for some time, to contribute towards the general funds of the Society. In the Mohawk Mission (hitherto connected with Napanee,) the Annual Meeting was numerously attended, and was rendered particularly interesting by addresses and remarks delivered by the Catechist and one of the Churchwardens, in their own language.— A debt on a church erected for the white settlers in the interior of the Township of Tyendinaga precludes the Association therein established from contributing to the general objects of the Society. During the past year £25 has been contributed towards its liquidation.

*(Extracts from the last Annual Report of this District Branch.)*

The travelling Mission established in this District, and supported in part by the contributions of this Branch, shall first be brought under your notice.—The Rev. T. W. Allen, it will be remembered, has exercised the office of Missionary in our District for just one year and a-half.

There are nine regular stations for the performance of Divine Service within the Mission, including two Churches. Of these stations six are served on Sundays, and three during the week. At four of them the service recurs as often as once a fortnight, at the other five only once in four weeks. The congregations worshipping at these stations vary in their numbers from thirty to upwards of a hundred; the attendance increases at some of them, and is sustained at least in the case of all the rest.

Forty-nine persons have been baptised within the Mission, including six of riper years; and thirty-four individuals have been confirmed.

With reference to Barrielfield and Pittsburgh, your Committee have important and gratifying intelligence to announce to you.

The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts has undertaken, in its capacity of administrator of the Clergy Reserve Fund, to advance to the clergyman of the Township an annual sum of £100 currency, on condition that an equal amount be raised for his support from local sources—as for example among his own parishioners, and by the Kingston Parochial Association of the Church Society.

This arrangement, it will be observed, increases the importance of the aid we have hitherto been able to impart to this Mission: our £50 a-year gains another £50, and so benefits the Parish to the extent £100 per annum.

The Church of St. Mark, at Barrielfield, has now been used for Divine Service during a space of more than five years; and the Kingston Parochial Association of our Society has contributed towards the support of its minister for four years and a-half. We have seen three incumbents successively occupying this station, which, as we rejoice to believe, has prospered and continues to prosper, and we trust that the same measure of assistance which has been cheerfully rendered by you heretofore, will still be continued with the same alacrity as long as it may be needed.

Your Committee would further congratulate you upon the probability that the Chapelry of St. Paul's, in Kingston, will also receive a share of the Clergy Reserve Fund.

The principle proposed by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel as their guide in the allotment of the fund seems to be simply this:—"That they will help those who will help themselves." And such a principle, impartially followed out, appears to your Committee to be well adapted to the present circumstances of the Church in this Province. It excites and rewards local exertions, accustoms congregations to the performance of their duty in contributing towards the maintenance of the clergy, and prepares them for the time which must hereafter come, when assistance from the charity of our fellow Christians in England shall cease, and the church people of Canada must undertake for themselves the fulfilment of that ordinance of the Lord, "That they who preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel."

In reference to the Depository your Committee have to report that matters

continue in a satisfactory state. A fire which occurred on the premises in January last, placed the whole stock of Books and Tracts in imminent danger of destruction: by the exertions of kind friends and neighbours, however, they were all saved. An insurance is now effected on the average value of the stock on hand.

A deed has been received from Mr. Richard Scobell, granting to the Church Society a certain parcel of land in the neighbouring village of Portsmouth, for the site of a Church and Schoolhouse.

Your Committee feel constrained to call the attention of the Association in the country parts of the District to their Local Mission Fund and to remind them that the maintenance of a Travelling Missionary is an object of general concern; a work in which the country and the town should take an equal share, and feel an equal interest. Moreover, there is a present necessity that we should do more than merely provide for existing engagements.

Your Committee learn that the Archdeacon and Rector of Kingston desires to obtain the assistance of another Clergyman for this city and neighbourhood, where, as it is understood, he may find ample occupation, especially in visiting among the poor, and among the depraved. Here then is a good work proposed to you to help forward. Let the Contributors to the Kingston Parochial Association of our Society be immediately and largely increased; let those members of our Church who contribute something already, consider how much more they can give; let those who heretofore have given nothing, become subscribers to our fund from this time forward—in a word, let every one only give according to his several ability, and this important object can be accomplished; the moderate income required for the support of a Clergyman can at once be raised.

The condition to which all public education in the Province is now reduced, the entirely irreligious character given to it by legislative enactment, appears to call for immediate exertions on our part.

Church people must provide their own children with the means of receiving a Christian and distinctively Church-like course of education; and the Church Society possesses powers under its constitution which would enable it to take the lead in this great work.

Thus, while much has been already accomplished, we are still ever incited, by all that has been hitherto unattempted, to form larger schemes and to use more diligent exertions for the future. And may God give us all a truer understanding of the privileges and blessings we possess, in having it in any measure in our power to labor in the cause of "Christ and the Church."

PORT TRENT.—The contributions from this Association have amounted to £7 18s. 4d., of this sum three-fourths have been appropriated for local purposes. An Association has also been formed at Frankford, but no report has been received owing to the short time which it has been in operation.

NAPANEE.—At Napanee the Annual Meeting was held in February, which was well attended; four Clergymen were present when the claims of the Society were ably brought before the meeting, and a good spirit evinced by the Laity, but from having undertaken the support of a Clergyman for the Parish this year, they are unable, and will be for some time, to contribute towards the general funds of the Society.

**TYNDEENAGA.**—In the Mohawk Mission (hitherto connected with Napance) the Annual Meeting was attended by several of the Neighbouring Clergy, who took pains to explain to a large and attentive audience the objects and claims of the Society. The interest of the meeting was increased by addresses delivered by the Catechist and one of the Churchwardens, in their own language.

A debt on a Church erected for the white settlers erected in the interior of the Township precludes this Association from contributing to the general objects of the Society. During the past year £25 has been contributed towards its liquidation.

*Prince Edward District.*

In Marysburgh the members of the Church have subscribed amongst themselves £50 sterling, together with the rent of a Parsonage House, in order to procure a resident minister among them. The churchmen in the Township of Hillier, have also subscribed £50 sterling, for the same purpose. The income of the Parochial Associations amounts to £21 7s. 6d.

*(Extracts from the last Report of this District Branch.)*

**MARYSBURGH** is an example. For was it not a noble and spirited exertion which the Churchmen in that township have made, when, after having built two churches, they were yet, having tasted and known that the Lord is gracious, so anxious for the truth as it is in Jesus, that though scattered and far from wealthy, they yet subscribed among themselves £50 sterling, together with the rent of a parsonage-house, in order to procure a resident minister among them. One gave a little, and another gave a little, and so the lump grew, nobody seemed to know how, but the blessing of the Lord was evidently with it, and at length after many days they reached the requisite amount, when the Bishop of the Diocese found the rule complied with, so that a suitable clergyman was selected and planted there, to be seen like an angel or guard, for the watch over that flock, to heal the desponding, correct the sinners, and train all to righteousness.

**PICTON** furnishes another feature in the works of our Church Society. For two years the young ladies of the parish, under the guidance of one of the grave matrons, have undertaken the task of collecting money, by single pence, monthly, from each Church individual, and applying the aggregate sum of each month for the purposes of piety. They perform the part of ministrasses of the parish; all receive them kindly, take the hint to do their duty, and hence all the bonds of a happy society are strengthened.

**HILLIER** also can afford sufficient testimony to the efficiency of the Church Society, in the increase of piety in its congregations. There, two acres were given for the site of a Church, and the inhabitants have built a neat edifice thereupon. They have subscribed £60 sterling, payable yearly, to secure Divine Service among them. During the past year they have, without any aid from abroad, done much towards finishing the church; especially in painting it throughout very tastefully, so that, through the goodness of God and their liberality, the people of Hillier now have a comfortable and commodious house of prayer. They have also provided a suitable Communion Service, that the Sacrament might be administered among them with propriety. A Parochial Association in connection with the Prince Edward Branch of the Church Society, has also been

established, and although the sums subscribed thereto are small, they are sufficient to show the interest felt therein, an interest we trust to see much increased and strengthened in a short time.

NORTH PORT has awakened in others, as well as shewn by itself, on its own behalf, much concern for the regular services and ministrations of religion. One gentleman promises land, as a site for a church and parsonage-house, as well as £2 10s. per annum, towards the sustenance of a clergyman. And if the hearts of others can be stimulated to do likewise, it cannot but be hoped that they will, at no distant day, secure for themselves the precious privileges of the glorious gospel.

CARRYING PLACE.—The Parochial Association in this parish has collected £8 7s. 6d. for the general objects of the Society.

*Johnstown Deanery District Branch.*

It is to be regretted that, during the past year, there has been a falling off in the income of this very efficient Branch of the Society. The total amount last year was £432 13s. 0½d.; the amount reported this year is only £321 16s. 3¼, being less than the previous year by £101 16s. 9d. To a small extent this can be accounted for by the division of the Eastern Branch which has been already noticed. The plan of a visiting Committee, which has been found so advantageous in other quarters, will be adopted here "to stir up the congregations to greater zeal in the cause of the Church."—There are to be for the future two Travelling Missionaries in the Johnstown District.

*(Extracts from the last Annual Report of this District Branch.)*

The Report of last year commenced thus: "This Branch of the Church Society appears to be, through the blessing of God, in a most prosperous condition"; but such is not now the case, for, from whatever cause arising, there is a very great falling off in the sum total of this year when compared with that which the Secretary had to report at the meeting held in Prescott in February, 1849. With the exception of Cornwall, and the mission of the Rev. Mr. Plees, the collection in each Parochial Society has been much less than usual; in Prescott by £32 9s. 1d. in the mission of the Rev. Mr. Watkins, by £20, in Brockville by £32 15s. 1¼d. In Williamsburg and Matilda not more will be collected than sufficient to pay the promised portion of the salary of the Rev. Mr. Plees. The total amount last year was £423 13s. 0½; the amount to be reported now is only £321 16s. 3¼, being £101 16s. 9d. less.

A portion of this deficiency, £14 17s. 6d., arises from a division which has been agreed to, in what we may now call the *late* Eastern Branch of the Church Society. A falling off in the total amount to a certain extent might reasonably have been expected, donations amounting to £68 being included in the last report from Cornwall, and it is not likely that liberal contributions of that kind will be made every year. But by the kind providence of God, the falling off is not occasioned by this, for there is a donation in the same parish of nearly equal amount this year. Whatever may have occasioned this greatly to be lamented deficiency, it proves the necessity of greater efforts being made to retrieve our

character as being the district society, which shews the largest amount collected in any one year—the amount reported last year being much larger than that reported by any district society, as collected within the same period. The Secretary, therefore, begs leave again to recommend to the careful consideration of the members of this society, a plan already put into practice in other places,—this is that the clergy, and as many of the laity as can be prevailed upon to accompany them, visit once in each year, every parish within the limits of this society, for the purpose of endeavouring to stir up the congregations to greater zeal in the cause of the Church. This course, as stated above, has been pursued by the clergymen of one or two other district societies, and there can be no good cause assigned why it should not be adopted here. The time of the clergymen amongst us is not more precious nor more occupied, than that of clergymen above; and it would be a sad reflection on us if our not doing so should be occasioned by, or laid to, a want of proper exertion. A resolution upon this important subject will be laid before the meeting for its approval.

One cause of thankfulness and congratulation has to be mentioned, which is, that an arrangement has been made by which the arduous duties of the Rev. Mr. Watkins, will be much lessened. There are to be, for the future, two Travelling Missionaries in the Johnstown District: the Rev. Mr. Tremayne has removed from Hawkesbury to take the duties of the second, Mr. Watkins still continuing as the other Travelling Missionary. Mr. Tremayne's late situation has been filled by the Rev. Mr. Lewis, a clergyman lately from Ireland.

That the labours of the Rev. Mr. Watkins needed to be divided will be apparent from the following extract from his report: "My labours," he says, have been chiefly confined to the following stations, viz: Newboro', Portland, Singleton's corners, Sly settlement, Smith's Mills, New Boyne, Kitley, 10th Concession in Elizabethtown, rear of Leeds, rear of Lansdowne, front of Lansdowne, Lyndhurst, Ballecauen, Beverly, and South Burgess.—These stations are so arranged as to supply the undermentioned townships with the ministrations of the Gospel monthly, *i. e.* North Crosby, South Crosby, Bastard, Leeds, Lansdowne, Kitley, Burgess, Young, and the rear of Elizabethtown. "Kitley," he adds, "is now included in the charge of the clergyman at Smith's Falls; this will relieve your Missionary of that part of his labours." In allusion to the appointment of a second Travelling Missionary mentioned above, he says, "That nearly £100 per annum has been pledged towards the expense incurred thereby:" and further, that the falling off in his collections last year has been occasioned partly by bad crops, and the expense brought upon some of his people by the building of *four* new churches.

The Rev. Mr. Plees, our Travelling Missionary in the Eastern district, reports that, during the last year, he has ministered at eight regular stations in the townships of Edwardsburg, Mountain, Winchester, Finch and Roxboro', and that in most of these the prospects are encouraging. Early in the year 1849, a branch of the Church Society was formed in this mission. In Edwardsburg, in addition to the collections made for the Missionary fund, about £20 have been expended upon the church, principally in the purchase of a seraphine. That in Mountain the congregation has assisted liberally towards a small parsonage, and the completion of the interior of the church. He adds: "The congregation at this place (Mountain) take the present opportunity to express the deep obligations they are under to Mrs. Mountain, of Cornwall, for the interest she has so

frequently shown for the welfare of this mission, and at whose cost a very neat service of communion plate and linen have been provided for this church." In regard to Finch he says: "The inconvenience felt for want of a suitable place for the performance of Divine Service has led the congregation to the laudable determination to build a church at Chrysler's Mills, this Spring. The cost of the building, (stone) is estimated at £175: a site of four acres has been selected, and will be transferred to the Church Society. More than half of the materials necessary for the building, has been furnished by the members of the congregation, who have pledged themselves for the remainder. Upwards of £30 has been subscribed by the adjoining townships. It is confidently hoped that, with the blessing of God upon the work, a small but church-like edifice will be fit for use early in the ensuing summer."

*Bathurst Deanery District Branch.*

The income from this Branch during the past year has been £51 0s. 0d.

*Niagara District.*

Public Parochial Meetings have been held at various places in this District with great advantage. The income of the past year is £357 18s. 4d., exceeding that of the previous year by the considerable sum of £75 16s. 6d. This increase has been realized, as the Managing Committee state, under circumstances peculiarly adverse to the Society's progress.

*(Extracts from the last Annual Report of this District Branch.)*

At the time of the last Annual Meeting; the District was without a travelling Missionary, in consequence of the removal of the Rev. C. L. Ingles to the parish of Chippawa, to supply the place of our excellent Chairman, during his severe and lamented illness, now so happily terminated. But on St. Mark's day, April 25th, in consequence of the urgent solicitations of our Managing Committee for a Missionary, an ordination was held in Toronto by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and the Rev. W. C. Clarke, then admitted to holy orders, was appointed the travelling Missionary for this District. Your Committee have received a full report from Mr. Clarke of his duties since his appointment, and here abstract such portions from it as will give an idea of his manifold labours, and of the great necessity that exists for maintaining the ministrations of the Church in those parts of our District beyond the bounds of the regularly organized parishes or missions:—

"The Travelling Missionary of the Niagara District, begs leave to report, that after having seen the Rev. C. Leycester Ingles, B. A., late travelling Missionary of this District, from whom he received information concerning, and letters of introduction to, the different parts of his large Mission, he commenced his labors early in the month of May.

"His work was in a great measure, laid out for him by the recommendation given in your Annual Report for 1846, and which your Missionary carried into effect, with regard to his Sunday Services, on the 13th and 20th of that month, the two first Sundays he was in his Mission. At the suggestion, however, of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who was then on his confirmation tour, that all the

destitute portions of the District were entitled to a share of the Missionary's services, (still leaving the distribution thereof to the discretion of the Missionary,) your Missionary *extended* his work on the following Sunday; and since then, up to the middle of last October, he has regularly done duty on Sundays, once in three weeks, at the following places, viz; Point Abino, Port Colborne, Stone Bridge (Military service), Low Banks, Marshville, Junction, Canboro', Caiston, and Smithville, and for three months, at the Limestone Ridge Church, Bertie, in consequence of the sickness and lamented death of the late Rev. John Anderson, having Divine Service then at Point Abino on the previous Saturday evening.

" Since the middle of October, as the congregations in the western parts of the District were small, and the roads very bad, your Missionary has confined his work, in a great measure, to the first six mentioned stations, where there is now (as recommended in your report for 1848,) Divine Service once a fortnight at least.

" Your Missionary regrets that only in one place he has been able to keep up regularly a week-day service, and that is at Marshville on the canal, where he has had, since the commencement, regularly an evening service on Mondays, during the summer months, once in three weeks, and, since the middle of October once a fortnight. He has tried this in other places, but found it very uncertain, and, when otherwise, attended only by young people of both sexes, and from their behaviour when going home, the propriety of continuing it, seemed to your Missionary extremely doubtful.

" Your Missionary has made a point of visiting all persons, of whatever denomination, at his several stations, with the exception of Smithville, where the dissenters are very numerous, and the Church families number only four; and much cause has he to grieve over the sad amount of ignorance, and, what is worse, of error, which he has met with, and sincerely does he pray that the seed which his position necessarily obliges him to scatter so widely, and to cherish so feebly, may, by God's blessing and in His own good time, take root and grow, and bring forth precious increase.

" Your Missionary would strongly urge the appointment of another Missionary to the destitute portions of this District, and he believes that, if another was supported for one year, and stationed at Port Colborne, the inhabitants there would willingly, the second year, contribute sufficient for his maintenance, with what might be received from the Society at home, and derived from the glebe lands of Humberstone.

" The congregations your Missionary meets at his different stations are fully equal to those mentioned in the Report for 1848, with the exception of that at the Junction. However, there is a reason for the decrease there, which your Missionary trusts a little time and patience will overcome.

" The congregation at Point Abino last autumn contributed the sum of £16 5s., which enabled them to plaster the Church, and purchase a stove for it, and they look forward to be able this year to paint the church, and furnish it with a Reading-desk and forms.

" This congregation would have been much larger, but that part of it properly belonged to the Limestone Ridge Church, where there is now divine service every Sunday.

" Your Missionary begs leave to record, with many thanks, much kindness and genuine hospitality, which he has received at the different Stations of his



Mission. He has baptized 17 children; and has one adult ready and one in course of preparation for baptism, besides six infants that he knows of, that will be presented for baptism as he goes round his mission. He has solemnized three marriages; and read the funeral service over three members of the Church."

The value of such labours as are here so simply detailed, and the necessity that exists for the Church's continually witnessing for the truth, must be manifest to every well constituted mind. And though the result of the Missionary's labours may not be apparent at first; for in most cases he has to stem the torrent of error, and often to oppose deep-seated and long-cherished prejudices; whereas sectaries too often, following the tactics of Rome, suit their teaching to the popular feeling, instead of opposing it; but the result cannot be doubtful; for truth is mighty, and must prevail. The teaching of the Church is calculated, not so much to effect a sudden change, as to form the Christian character, to promote sound Christian principles, and to establish Christian habits of thought, feeling and conduct in the community. These reach beyond the feeling of the moment, and require deep planting, constant watering, and thorough cultivation. But when they grow up, the fruit they bare is not like Jonah's gourd, which sprang up in a night and perished next morning; but is firm, lasting, and precious. The system adopted and the plans pursued by one of the earliest Missionaries of this Diocese—that of catechising the young, and of travelling about from house to house for that purpose, throughout the extensive mission, might be advantageously introduced at the present day in both settled parishes and travelling missions.

Some of the fruits of that worthy Missionary's labours still exist; and they are such as we cannot doubt will prove to him, in the great day of account "a crown of rejoicing." At any rate whatever plan be adopted, it is the Missionary's bounden duty, "in the morning to sow his seed and in the evening to withhold not his hand,"—to "cast his bread upon the waters, fully believing that he shall find it after many days;" "for the word of God," duly ministered and accompanied with fervent prayer shall not return unto him void, but it shall accomplish his purpose, and prosper in the thing whereunto he has sent it.

During the last week in September and the first week in October, parochial meetings, in behalf of the Church Society, were held, according to the recommendation of your Managing Committee, in the Churches at Chippawa and Drummondville, attended by the Rev. Messrs. Leeming, Fuller, Armstrong, Shanklin and Ingles, and by the Rev. Dr. Lett, of Toronto, (to whom your Managing Committee would avail themselves of this opportunity to acknowledge the very efficient aid rendered by him on those occasions); at Port Robinson, attended by the Rev. Messrs. Leeming, Fuller, Armstrong, Shanklin and Ingles; at Thorold by the same, with the addition of Messrs. Atkinson and Clarke; and at Jordan by the same, with the addition of the Rev. Mr. Atkinson, whose service on that occasion will be long remembered by those present at that interesting meeting; and at Dunville and Port Maitland, attended by the Rev. Messrs. Fuller, Armstrong, Townley and Clarke.

The effect of these meetings, your committee trust, was good; and, as a proof of it, they would mention that at the only place where the plan was tried; double the amount of the subscription for the preceding year was obtained before the meeting separated, by having subscription books ready and by inviting

the people, who had listened to the addresses, to subscribe on the spot. And your Managing Committee would strongly recommend the trial of this plan in other places, during the coming autumn, believing that it will render the meetings more beneficial, decrease the labours of the parochial committees, and largely increase the funds of the Society.

**LOUTH.**—The Parish of Louth reports that there has been an increase of £3 4s 10½, over the contributions of the former year making in all the sum of £25 13s. 8d.

**ST. CATHERINES.**—The Parish of St. Catherines, Reports that the amount of subscriptions for general purposes is ..... £41 17 6  
Two donations for Widows and Orphans' Fund ..... 2 5 0

The above amount of subscription ..... £44 2 6  
may at first sight appear to be small; but when it is stated that the Parochial Association has recently lost by death a valuable annual contributor, and that within the last four months this congregation have contributed besides, for local church objects about *ninety pounds* exclusive of Pew-rent and Sunday collections it must be admitted that they have acted with commendable liberality.

**CHIPPAWA.**—The Parish of Chippewa Reports an increase of £7 6 10½ in the amount of annual subscriptions and donations contributed by this parochial association during the past over that of the former year, making in all the sum of £42 0s. 0d., a circumstance which the parochial committee deem rather encouraging than otherwise.

**GRIMSBY.**—The Parish of Grimsby Reports the sum of £45.9s. 6d.

**THOROLD.**—The Parish of Thorold Reports that by following out the system of making the contributions of every individual in the parish, as far as possible, swell out the amount, and, by the assiduity of the collectors, they are enabled to Report an increase of £5 0s. 1d. on that of the former year. This may seem a small increase: but when it is considered that this branch reported at the last annual meeting a increase of £20 0s. 0d., over that of the former year, the parochial committee trust that even this small increase will be deemed satisfactory. The amount contributed is £59 5s 3d.

**NIAGARA.**—The Parish of Niagara Reports that the amount rather exceeds that of last year, being in all £59 11s. 10d. Although by the death of several wealthy individuals, their subscriptions have ceased to be paid, the deficiency has been more than supplied by an increased number of smaller subscriptions. There are still exceptions in the case of several persons, who can well afford to contribute, and who may be induced to come forward hereafter.

**PORT MAITLAND.**—The Parish of Port Maitland and Dunnville reports, that from Port Maitland there has been an increase of 7s. 6d., making in all last year, £13 13s. 9d, whilst at Dunnville the increase has been from £3 0s. 0d. to £8 10s. 0.

**STAMFORD.**—The united charge of Stamford and Drummondville, in the parish of Chippawa, Report the sum of £14 11s. 8d, against £12 10s. 7½ of last year.

**FORT ERIE.**—From the Parish of Fort Erie there has been no report received.

*Gore and Wellington District.*

The accounts of this active and flourishing Branch are in a most satisfactory state, and shew that its vigour is not only unimpaired, but steadily increasing. During the past year this Branch has been enabled to achieve the comparatively large revenue of £371, being £38 more than that of the former year. Public meetings—numerously attended, and evincing, what it is particularly encouraging to observe, a warm interest on the part of the laity, have been held in the following Parishes,—Galt, Paris, Brantford, Ancaster, Dundas, Saltfleet, Wellington Square, Elora, and Guelph. These public Parochial Meetings seem to have had an excellent effect in rousing to active zeal and exertion wheresoever they have been tried.

*(Extracts from the last Annual Report of this District Branch.)*

The Committee feel much pleasure in calling the attention of this association to the Report of their Travelling Missionary, and to the success with which his zealous and untiring exertions have under God's blessing been attended—commencing his arduous duties under many and great discouragements to which it is unnecessary to allude at greater length at present; he has been enabled by a punctual fulfilment of his engagements to restore confidence in the members of the Church, and to revive the services at stations which had well nigh languished unto death. He has selected several new stations of much promise and importance, which he visits at regular intervals, and he finds at all of these that his ministrations are cordially and thankfully received. From his lucid and elaborate Report, it appears that eight different stations enjoy a monthly Sunday Service—viz: Waterdown and the Brock-road, (Flamboro' West), Mann's School house, 5th concession of Ancaster and Hawley's School-house, Township of Brantford, Milton in Trafalgar, and Richardson's Settlement, on the borders of Nassagaweya—Glanford and Onondaga Townships. Of all these stations the Missionary speaks in terms of encouragement, and of some with great satisfaction. In Waterdown, Milton, and at Hawley's School-house, there is a great desire to have churches built and the regular services of a resident Missionary—active steps have been taken to procure subscriptions, suitable sites have been granted, and there is every prospect of the speedy erection of three Churches within the limits of your missionary's labours—at Hawley's, the missionary remarks that "great praise is due to a few active and zealous Churchmen for their energy, in collecting contributions for the Church Society; and also, for their perseverance in obtaining subscriptions for a new church, about to be erected in the neighbourhood. The sum subscribed for this purpose amounts now to £200;" of Milton he remarks, "A fine field is open here for our operations as many are very favourably disposed towards the Church, and would become constant attendants in the event of a clergyman taking up his abode in the neighbourhood; contributions will this year be collected for the Church Society; a very beautiful site has been offered and an effort is now being made to secure the means for erecting a Church. There cannot be less than 300 souls belonging to our communion residing in the vicinity of Milton."

Of Waterdown the report speaks in favorable terms. "The village

contains a population of several hundred, with a fair proportion of Church people : but of the congregation which has been here collected, a great number came from the back part of the township, and are chiefly persons from the North of Ireland. The Church population of this Township must number about 400 souls. It is very desirable that a Church should be erected at Waterdown as soon as possible, and a Clergyman appointed to the spiritual care of the Township, but the former object cannot be accomplished without considerable aid from charitable persons at a distance. The people are willing to render what assistance they are able but the Irish settlers before mentioned not having yet paid for their land, cannot of course be expected to contribute so liberally, as they otherwise would—a site for the proposed Church has been secured, and a quantity of stone lies upon the ground wherewith to commence building whenever funds sufficient for that purpose shall have been procured. To erect a suitable Church will cost something over £300, and this it is hoped, an endeavour will shortly be made to collect. Every time Service is performed at this station, a collection is taken up during the reading of the offertory sentences in compliance with the rule in the Prayer Book. It is applied towards the purchase of a surplice and Service Books." The Missionary has, during the last six months, performed twenty-four baptisms, two burials, and distributed about fifty Prayer-Books.

The Committee would gladly make further extracts from this excellent report if time permitted. The Committee must content themselves with transcribing the concluding paragraph which will commend itself to every devout and religious mind. "Your Missionary has now endeavoured to furnish the Society, with an outline of his labours since his appointment. He feels that they are few and feeble in comparison with the work before him; that to the eye of man the visible result is small indeed; that the magnitude of the task is far beyond his own strength, and can only be effectually accomplished "through the might of Him that worketh in us." He desires to remember that Missionary labour does not consist alone in causing Churches to be built, or the funds of our Society increased, but that it has a higher aim and nobler object—the reformation of the hearts of men—the implanting within them a true faith and a right practice—the making them to love and honor the Church of God, that in it their souls may be won for Jesus Christ, and with these mighty objects in view, he cannot but feel his own insufficiency, and if any blessing has rested upon his labours, exclaim, "Not unto us O Lord, not unto us, but unto thy name be the glory, for thy mercy and for thy truth's sake."

Your Committee will now proceed to notice in order the several Parochial Associations, and the Reports for the past year.

**GUELPH.**—The Annual Meeting in this parish was very numerously and respectably attended, and the Report presented afforded great satisfaction.—The income for the past year was announced as £51 15s., being an increase of £1 15s. over that of the preceding,—and it must be borne in mind that this Association had reason to anticipate a diminution in its funds, owing to the erection of Elora into a separate Association, for, although this took place more than a year ago, and Elora contributed separately last year, yet subscriptions from several Church people in that place were likewise paid in to the Guelph Committee, on account of a previous year. In addition to this there were some tem-

porary donors at Guelph, whose subscriptions swelled the amount of last year's income. The result, therefore, is highly satisfactory, and it is pleasing to hear the Committee declare that "a similar result may always be secured by a very little exertion and self-denial on the part of members of the Church in this neighbourhood. And it is to be hoped that none among them will ever forget the inspired declaration,—“There is that scattereth and yet increaseth, and there is that withholdeth more than is meet, but it tendeth to poverty.”

**DUNDAS.**—Next in importance as regards the number of subscribers and the amount of subscriptions, is the parish of Dundas, where the Society continues to maintain a good reputation. The Committee have much pleasure in stating that the amount collected during the past year, £46 4s. 1d., exceeds that of the former year by £4 4s. In addition to the subscriptions to the Church Society, the members of this Association have been called upon to contribute to several objects of a local nature, but they are happy to say that these demands have not lessened the amount of their contributions to the Church Society.

**ANGAFTER.**—The twin sister of the last-named Association presents likewise a gratifying Report. The amount collected is £19 5s., an increase over former years. This amount they hope will be larger next year, as they are happy to say that the debt upon St. John's Church has been paid off, which has hitherto prevented the members of this Association from contributing as largely to its funds as they would have done under other circumstances.

**GALE.**—The zealous Association of this thriving Mission, with its usual activity, have been able to report an increase in its funds over the preceding year, although heavy demands have been met there by the members of the Church for local purposes. The amount of about £175 has been paid, over and above their income as a Church Society, which has now reached the creditable sum of £37 18s. 10½d.

**NELSON AND WELLINGTON SQUARE.**—The Church Society Meeting in this parish was attended by a crowded and respectable audience, many people coming a distance of six or seven miles to be present, and considering themselves amply rewarded by the evidences they witnessed of the activity and success of their own Parochial Association, as well as of the Society at large. The lay-speakers distinguished themselves, as on former occasions, by most effective speeches, and all were gratified to hear that the income from that branch of the Church Society was £29, a considerable increase over the former year.

**BRANTEFORD.**—A letter from the Rev. Mr. Usher announces the amount contributed as not exceeding £25, although it was hoped that a larger sum would have been collected. He adds that, "the Committee are encouraged to hope that the indications of an increased sense of responsibility in the members of the Church are such as offer the prospect of future improvement.

"The Managing Committee may add, that the meeting recently held in this parish was far more satisfactory than any previous; that the members of the Church appear to have laboured under very discouraging circumstances connected with local affairs, but as these begin to vanish they manifest a very becoming interest in the Church Society, and a determination not to be behind their fellow-Churchmen elsewhere in the good cause."

**SALTFLEET AND BINBROOK.**—The Parochial Committees in Saltfleet and Binbrook entertain the hope that no decrease in their annual contributions, but,

on the contrary, a gradual increase may be anticipated in future years. The Committee in Binbrooke regret the loss of the liberal annual subscriptions of a wealthy family who have lately removed from that township to the city of Hamilton, but notwithstanding the deficiency thereby occasioned, they are happy to report that it has been fully supplied by increased exertions among the resident members; on the whole it may be affirmed that in both townships of this mission a favourable spirit continues to be manifested to the objects and claims of the Society." The very creditable sum of £20 has been received from this branch.

**MOHAWK AND TUSCARORA.**—This exceedingly creditable Association has been enabled to increase its former liberal subscriptions to the Church Society by nearly one half of the whole of last year's income. The amount remitted to the Treasurer for the past year is £14 16s. 3d. Such facts are truly encouraging and ought to inspire small parishes or missions with the resolution, not to be deterred from doing something for the Society; because their field is small, and they have little in their power. That little, if given heartily will gradually increase, and as in the case of Mohawk and Tuscarora may soon place the contributors on a footing with more important Associations.

**PARIS.**—The prospects of the Church Society in this mission have begun to assume a brighter and more cheering aspect, and afford promise of much zeal and efficiency on the part of the members of the Church in that place. Under the blessing of God, the exertions of the present missionary, the Rev. Mr. Ruttan, have been crowned with success; the Parochial Association has been revived after several years of suspended animation, a respectable amount of £13 16s., has been remitted by the active Secretary and Treasurer, E. Macaulay, Esq.

**MILTON.**—An infant Association has just been formed at this Missionary Station, and the sum of £2 17s. 6d. been collected by zealous Churchmen in that neighbourhood, and paid over to the Treasurer with a hearty good will, and a regret that the amount is so small. The contributors, however, anticipate a respectable increase in future years. This Association owes its rise, we believe to the active efforts of the Travelling Missionary, who has been most industriously engaged in disseminating correct information about the objects and working of the Society, and thus awakening a wide-spread interest in its behalf throughout his mission.

**OAKVILLE AND PALFREMO.**—The Committee of these united Associations, it will be remembered, requested last year to be allowed to devote the whole of their collections to objects of exclusively local nature. It is gratifying, however, to find that they still desire to keep alive in that mission an interest in the Church Society, and "to encourage, by all the means in their power, its pious designs and labours of love."

**ELORA.**—It will no doubt be gratifying to the members of the Church to hear that this interesting Missionary Station has, during the last year, been erected into a separate parish, with a resident clergyman. This circumstance, however, of itself has naturally been the means of withdrawing contributions for the present from the Church Society, the heavy responsibility for local expenditure, which has fallen upon the members of the Church in that village, rendering it out of their power this year to send any portion of their funds for general objects.

HAMILTON.—The Parochial Committee of this Parish have much pleasure in announcing to the friends of the Church Society, that an increasing interest is felt every year in its high and holy objects, and although there has not been *adequate exertion* on the part of *all the members of the Committee*, the result is still satisfactory, as the annual subscriptions have now reached upwards of £108. The Committee cannot conceal from themselves the fact that many members of the Church in this parish who are *perfectly able* are not among the subscribers to the Church Society, and they only hope that if such are present at the Annual Meeting they may be brought to see the importance of the Society, and to regard a want of interest in its prosperity as a dereliction of duty as Churchmen, and as arguing great lukewarmness in the cause of Christ and His Church. It is but just to state that the local demands upon this parish have been increased to a very large amount, by the proposed erection of a new church, the contract for a portion of which is all but signed, for a sum of between £1500 and £1600. The Depository for the sale of Bibles and Prayer Books and other sound religious publications, is now under the superintendence of Mr. F. Carter, who renders this important service gratuitously, and the Committee are happy to find that the sales are rapidly increasing; that within a few months not less than nineteen Bibles, twenty-eight testaments, and a hundred and forty-five Prayer-Books, and two hundred and twenty-four other publications have been sold. The Depository must be regarded as a useful auxiliary in promoting the designs of the Church Society, and the Committee hope to be able, by judicious management, to make it productive of much more extensive usefulness.

#### *London, Western and Huron Districts.*

The only general Report which has, up to this time, come to hand, is that of the Western District Branch. Remittances have been received from the following Parochial Associations,—Sandwich, Amherstburg, Moore, Warwick, Adelaide, Goderich, and Ingersol. From the town of London we have not yet heard; so that as the revenue of these three Districts, we are only able, at present, to announce the sum of £80 0s. 0d. In consequence of local difficulties a Parochial Association has been only

very recently established in Sandwich; but its first effort has been very promising,—the respectable income of £25 having been realized during the past year.

*(Extracts from Reports of Parochial Associations in this District.)*

**AMSTERDAM.**—This Association is the oldest in the Western District, and has this year collected the sum of £21 2s. 9d. (an increase of £8 12s. 4d. over the previous year), the fourth part of which sum, namely, £5 5s. 8d., has been transmitted to the Treasurer of the Parent Society. The report gives the cheering intelligence that the collection for the past year nearly doubles what has been made at any former period.

No Report from Colchester, Mersea, Chatham, or Mr. Gunne's Mission.

**SANDWICH.**—The Report from Sandwich is encouraging. The pressure of local difficulties has hitherto prevented any collection being made, but on occasion of this their first collection the sum amounts to £25, the fourth part of which sum has been forwarded by the Treasurer of our District Branch to the Parent Society.

**MOORE.**—This Association has been but just formed, and has collected the liberal sum of £15 2s. 6d.

**GOBERICH.**—An Association was formed in this parish on the 14th of March. A large committee was appointed, and George Brown, Esquire, was requested to act as Treasurer, and A. N. Strachau, Esq., as Secretary. In consequence of its being too late in the year before the Association was formed, no Report can be sent for this year.

*Brock District.*

The Income for the past year is £80 19s. 2d. There is no Travelling Missionary at present in this District; but in the District Report, a hope is expressed that this want will be supplied at the next Ordination. This Branch has hitherto remitted to the Treasurer of the Parent Society by far the greater proportion of all their Collections.

*(Extracts from the last Report of this District Branch.)*

Your committee have to express their regret, that there should appear so great a falling off in the offertory collections at Woodstock; they, however, persuade themselves, that this deficiency has arisen rather from the pressure of the times, so generally felt, than from any lack of willingness to contribute, according to wonted liberality, towards the furtherance of the great objects of the Society. Your Committee confidently anticipate even an increase on former years, should a gracious providence relieve us from our present monetary depression. The rectory of Woodstock has, for the present, to regret the loss of the service of a Missionary Curate; several Sunday stations have necessarily been given up; but your Committee are happy to report that the Lord Bishop will supply the need at his next ordination. Your Committee suggest that £30 of the funds now in the Treasurer's hands, should be reserved by the Parent Society, towards the payment of the first half year's stipend of such Missionary Curate.

Your committee report that the Depository is now in operation under the gratuitous superintendence of Mr. Lakeman.



Your committee report with pleasure an increase in the Huntingford parochial collections, and a continued zeal in furthering the interests of the Church.

Your committee report from Burford, that no branch is as yet formed there, but that a brick building has been erected for a church, 50 feet by 36, with a tower, but is not in a sufficient state of forwardness for the celebration of divine service, it is with much regret your committee have to report the burning of the church in Norwich, in July last, it was ready for service on the following Sunday. There is no doubt of the act being wilful and malicious, as matches were found near the place.

*Talbot District.*

From this quarter no report has been received.

*Colborne District.*

No Report received.

*Home and Simcoe Districts.*

The contributions appear to have been more limited than they were last year, in regard to some of the Parishes and Stations which have taken part in the maintenance of the Society. The whole amount reported, exclusive of the City of Toronto, is £185 5s. 0½d., a slight increase on the aggregate amount collected last year. Reports have been received from the following:—

**SIMCOE DISTRICT TRAVELLING MISSION.**—The members of this Parochial Association are in an especial manner bound to offer up the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, to Almighty God, for the continuance of his mercies towards them, inasmuch as during the past year not only has the Church maintained her previous position, but her influence has gradually increased, and her children have manifested their attachment to her by continuing to contribute to the cause of Missions "to their power," and in some instances, it may be said, even "beyond their power."

The contributions in aid of the Church Society show an increase of £3 10s. 7d. over those of the preceding year from the townships of Mono and Adjala, and the part of Caledon in connexion with St. Mark's Church; but as there has been a deficiency of 10s. 6½d. in the subscriptions from Mulmur and Toronto, the net increase from the Mission is only £3 0s. 0½d.

Since our last anniversary, the circumstances of this Mission have undergone a material alteration; an offer having been made to the inhabitants by his Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese to give them a resident Minister, upon condition of raising among themselves a sum equal to one-half of his salary. The proposal was gladly acceded to, and a subscription list opened, which in a short time amounted to about £65; the subscribers pledging themselves to continue their contributions for a period of three years. Under these circumstances, his Lordship permitted the Travelling Missionary of the District to confine his services for the present year to this part of his former field of labour, in order that he might be enabled to see whether the inhabitants were sincere in their desire of obtaining a resident Minister; and if such were the case, a clergyman would be fixed permanently amongst them.

The experiment seems hitherto to have succeeded: nearly one-half of the amount subscribed has been already paid into the hands of the churchwardens; and as there is little doubt that the greatest part (if not the whole) of the remainder will be paid, the committee entertain a confident hope that this Mission shall continue to enjoy the advantages which have been conferred upon it, and that the increased number and greater regularity of the services of our Church will cause her to gain a still stronger hold upon the affection of her members.

Although the large sum thus contributed cannot but lessen the subscriptions to the Church Society, yet the committee venture to express their hope, that the benefits formerly conferred by that Society upon this Mission will not be forgotten; but that the inhabitants will continue their exertions to assist in sending to the more benighted parts of this District the blessings which they themselves so long enjoyed.

The committee feel great pleasure in referring to the rapidity with which that portion of the Church of Christ to which we belong is progressing in all parts of the world where she has been planted. In England, dissent is falling before her aroused energy and increasing activity: in parts of Ireland, the darkness of Popery is fleeing before her pure and hallowed light, and many of the Romish priests, or candidates for that priesthood, have become obedient to the faith; in some of the foreign dependencies of our native land (under her auspices), thousands of the heathen inhabitants are throwing their idols to the moles and to the bats; and in those colonies, both amongst heathen Indians and professing Christians, her influence is felt, and her power acknowledged.

**RE.**—In the subscriptions and donations for the year just ended, it will be seen that a slight falling off in amount has occurred from last year; but it ought not to be inferred from that circumstance that any change has taken place in the feeling in favour of the Church of England in this neighbourhood. On the contrary, preparations are in active progress for the building of two new churches in the immediate vicinity, to which many of the members of this congregation have contributed. Our annual meeting has been later than usual, owing to the accidentally prolonged absence of our respected Pastor; and to the same cause is to be attributed a deficiency in receipts from other sources, compelling us to retain for this year three-fourths of the subscriptions.

**LLOYDTOWN.**—The committee ascribe their success to the praiseworthy exertions of the three or four collectors, who, at the close of the last annual

meeting, so readily volunteered their services, and collected and paid into the hands of the Treasurer the sum of £10, which was £2 16s. 3d., more than was contributed the previous year. The moneys thus paid in were expended strictly in accordance with the resolutions proposed and adopted at the general meeting of this Parochial Branch, in 1849, viz.,—one-fourth, or £2 10s., forwarded to the Parent Society for general purposes; one-fourth, or £2 10s., toward the support of the Travelling Missionary in the Home District, so soon as one is appointed; and the remaining two-fourths, or £5, was expended in purchasing books for the Parochial Lending Library in connexion with this Church, and by this means about thirty new volumes were added. While the committee is thankful for the increased prosperity of this Branch, it trusts that the contributions of this coming year may show an increase over those of the last, inasmuch as there are two or three objects of importance which require funds to carry them into execution. The one, the insurance of the church against fire; the others, the repairing the outside of the church, fencing the churchyard, and erecting a shed. It was hoped the usual Sunday offertory would have proved sufficient to have met any expense connected with the necessary repairs of the church and churchyard; but during the last two years the expenses have exceeded the amount received from this source by £8 10s. Your committee deem it advisable that the three-fourths of the funds raised this year by the Parochial Branch be devoted to the objects just mentioned.

The other Associations above enumerated have not sent in any report further than their subscription lists, which will be found in the Appendix.

In the flourishing Mission of Newmarket a Parochial Association has not yet been organized, owing to great difficulties which are giving way, but which it will take time to surmount. Meanwhile local matters of great importance have engrossed the Church in this quarter, and various local enterprises for the benefit of the Church have been commenced, and are being carried on at considerable expense. A Parochial Association will be formed, it is hoped, before the close of the year.

*City of Toronto.*

The formation of Parochial Committees was noticed in last year's Report. It is highly satisfactory to observe that they still continue to work most beneficially for the interests of the Church in this growing city. Through their instrumentality the claims of the Society are brought home to a larger number and, for the most part, with greater force than heretofore:—with greater force, because local interests and predilections will always have a stronger hold on men's hearts at large, than those which are general and more remote. We must believe, therefore, that this measure is likely to promote very effectually the welfare of the Church in this City, although an unavoidable result has been a material diminution of the Society's Fund for general purposes.

**ST. JAMES'S PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY.**—The committee of the Parochial Association of St. James's cathedral church, in connexion with the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, beg to lay before its members a statement of their proceedings since the last annual meeting, in May, 1849.

Several important objects, as stated in their published Report, were contemplated by the Association last year, and sums set apart to aid in the furtherance of each. The committee regret that from various causes, to which it is unnecessary more particularly to allude, they have been unable to carry them into full effect. It is intended, however, to keep them steadily in view, and with the additional funds which they will now have at their disposal, they confidently anticipate the speedy accomplishment of at least some of them.

It will be remembered that the ladies of the parish, with a zeal which entitles them to the lasting gratitude of the congregation, raised more than a year ago, with great exertions, a sum exceeding £500, for the erection of a parochial school-house. Owing to circumstances over which the committee have no control, the projected building has not yet been erected. A confident hope, however, is entertained, that this most desirable work will be completed during the course of the ensuing summer; and that the parish will, ere long, possess the inestimable advantage of a school for the education of its poorer children in the faith and principles of the Church of England. In the meantime, a portion of the funds of the Association have been set apart for the maintenance of July qualified teachers, in order that on the completion of the building no time may be lost in bringing the school into active operation.

The grant to the parochial library will be expended immediately in making some valuable additions to the small stock of books which it already possesses. It is also recommended that from the funds at the disposal of the Association for the present year, some assistance should be afforded to the library attached to the Sunday-school, to render it more complete and efficient for its useful purpose.

The sum which has been voted towards forming the nucleus of a fund for the purchase of a peal of bells for the parish-church, and which it is hoped may be further augmented this year, it is proposed to invest in short Government debentures, bearing interest at six per cent. The committee trust that this small beginning may serve to encourage the members of the congregation, and prompt them to special and vigorous exertions, to attain an object which must be earnestly desired by every Churchman.

The committee have to regret the loss of their Secretary, W. M. Westmacott, Esq., who has resigned his office and retired from the Association. For the zeal and ability with which he discharged his honorary duties during the short time he was connected with them, the committee desire to record their grateful thanks.

In regard to the state of the funds, it is to be observed, that, although the number of subscribers has somewhat diminished, the actual receipts have nevertheless increased. The subscriptions and donations for this year, already paid in, amount to £67 15s.

Our parish church being still in ruins, and having on that and other accounts many difficulties to contend with, the committee are thankful that

they are able to make on the whole so satisfactory a report. And in concluding, they would express a fervent hope, that when, through God's mercy, their church shall be again happily restored, the members of the congregation will come more generally forward to aid the efforts of a Society possessing such powerful claims on their sympathy and support. Let every name be enrolled. Let those whom God has prospered, give abundantly. But let no one be discouraged, because as his means are small, so also of necessity must be his gift to the treasury of the Lord. Possessing little, let him gladly give of that little, assured that God will not despise the humblest offering of a grateful heart. And let him who cannot help with his alms, give what is still more valuable, his supplications and prayers; remembering that it is not by human "might or power," neither is it exclusively or chiefly with silver and gold, that good is to be accomplished, or the Redeemer's kingdom enlarged. Our help is in the name of the Lord—our reliance is upon His Almighty Spirit. Thus only do we look in faith for the Divine blessing; thus only may we believe that the labour of our hands—all weak and unworthy though it be—shall not be in vain in the Lord.

**ST. PAUL'S CHURCH PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION.**—As the first year of the existence of St. Paul's Parochial Association has now drawn to a close, it becomes the duty of the Secretary to lay before the Society an account of what has been done, during the last twelve months, towards carrying out the objects for which it was organized. The first step was taken by the committee appointed to collect subscriptions, who set about their work almost immediately after the formation of the Society. In doing so, they kept studiously in view the third rule of the constitution, that the "payment of any sum, however small, qualifies for membership;" being of opinion, that the great object they ought to aim at was to induce, if possible, every parishioner to enrol his name as a member,—that it so might become, not only in name, but in reality, a Parochial Association. Their efforts were attended with a very fair measure of success. The sum subscribed amounted to £37 3s. 7d.; of this, £31 4s. 4d., has been received, leaving subscriptions to the amount of £5 19s. 3d., still due to the Society. Of the moneys received, one-fourth has been paid over to the Parent Society, as required by the constitution; and there is therefore now at the disposal of this Association the sum of £23 8s. 3d. The parochial committee, whose province it is to recommend the particular appropriation of this fund, would suggest that it be devoted towards the liquidation of the debt still due upon the organ, as there is at present no other fund available for that purpose.

The success which has thus far attended this Association affords us matter for great thankfulness to Him who has put it into our hearts to do what little we have done towards carrying out the holy purposes for which we have associated ourselves together, and should stimulate us to fresh exertions in helping on the good work; more especially when we consider how much there is in this parish which calls for the most liberal and well-combined exertions on our part, as a congregation. The revenue arising from the rents of the pews, together with the amount received from the offertory collections (after deducting what is required for charitable purposes), is sufficient, if promptly and regularly paid, to enable the churchwardens to meet the amount required for the clergyman's salary and the ordinary current expenses of the Church; but it is not more

than barely sufficient for these purposes. In the meantime, the building in which we are now assembled presents an appearance far from befitting the house of God. There are few of us whose very outhouses do not possess a more decent and respectable interior.

Now, the only method that suggests itself of remedying what we certainly ought to take as a great disgrace to ourselves, is that, of each member of the congregation liberally contributing, according to his ability, to the funds of this Association; so that we may have such a sum placed at the disposal of this Society as will enable us to remove this reproach, and render God's house more worthy of the high and holy purpose for which it is set apart.

**TRINITY CHURCH (KING-STREET) PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION.**—The Parochial Association of Trinity Church, having now closed the first year of its existence, it becomes the duty of the Secretary to lay before the Society an account of what has been affected by it, since the time of its formation in February of last year.

We number 175 members, who have all paid up their subscriptions, which together amount to the large sum of £30 11s. 3d. Of this sum, one-fourth, £7 12s. 10d., has been handed over to the Parent Society, as required by the constitution; and the remaining three-fourths, £22 18s. 5d., have been appropriated to liquidate the debt of our Church.

For the success of this Association, we cannot be too thankful. The Almighty has put into the hearts of those who have "little, to give gladly of that little;" and of those who have much, "to contribute liberally." Were proof wanting of what well-combined efforts, perseverance, and firmness of resolution, can accomplish, when directed to carry out religious objects, we have it here. Were encouragement required for continued exertions in this and every good work, we can look back with pleasure and satisfaction to our labours of past years; yea, and we can look forward with confident anticipation that the same spirit which has hitherto animated us, will carry us successfully through this work we have begun in faith.

There is another subject to which your committee have much pleasure in directing your attention, viz.: the gradual diminution of the debt for building your church. Our late beloved Pastor, during the years of his Incumbency, with the most liberal Christian spirit, devoted all the revenues of the Church to that desirable object. By this means, the large sum of £1700 was, at his lamented demise, reduced to about £750. Since that time, a further sum of £200 has been paid off, leaving a balance of about £550. This we hope soon to liquidate, by uniting our exertions with those of our present Incumbent, who has with an equally liberal spirit given up the proceeds of the Church, until the time we can look upon a temple raised in the midst of us, almost entirely from our own resources, and properly dedicated to the service of Jehovah.

It may not be out of place here to mention, for our future encouragement, the amount of moneys raised amongst us within the last year:—

We cannot close this Report, without expressing the pleasure your committee feel in being able thus publicly to acknowledge the valuable assistance they have received from several ladies of this Association. Had it not been for their praiseworthy exertions, neither so large a sum could have been collected, nor so numerous a list of members published in the Church Society's Report.

In conclusion, let us always bear in mind, that the best tribute of respect we can hereafter pay to the memory of our late beloved pastor, is to support, with our prayers and alms-giving, the Society he established amongst us, and in the success of which he felt so deep an interest. And let us ever bear in mind that portion of Holy Scripture he was wont to quote:—"There is that scattereth, and yet increaseth; and there is that withholdeth more than is meet, but it tendeth to poverty."

ST. GEORGE'S PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION.—Without some explanation it would appear that there was a falling off in the subscriptions from this Association, the amount subscribed for general purposes being under £40. The committee however, desire to report with thankfulness that such decrease is entirely apparent—the aggregate collections being in reality upwards of a third more than those of the previous year. The local claims on the liberality of Churchmen are of a peculiarly pressing nature in this District—foremost among which may be named the large amount of debt still remaining unpaid on the erection of the church—towards this, special collections *in money* have been made amounting to upwards of .....

In addition to this brief explanation—the committee gratefully record that the Paatorial Letter of His Lordship, on the important subject of a Church University, was first taken up by this Association at their general meeting in February, and has warmly engaged the co-operation of Churchmen in the district.

CHURCH OF THE HOLY TRINITY, (YONGE STREET) PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION.—The contributions to the Parochial Association of this church, in connexion with the Diocesan Church Society, amounting to £20 16s 1d., were received this year, as before, through the Offertory—each member of the Association attaching his or her name to the envelope containing the offering. In a similar manner the offerings of this congregation, to the amount of £374 in money and memoranda of gifts in money and land, to the Bishop of Toronto's projected Church University, were received on the evening of Sunday, the 7th of April.

This sketch, brief and summary though it be, of the Society's operations during the past year will suffice to show that they have not been unfruitful. For whatsoever success has attended our

labours of love and ventures of faith in this holy work, let all the praise be ascribed to Him whose approval is our highest ambition, and His grace our only availing support.

In the events of the period which has been under review, we are called upon to observe that varied scene of blessing and trial which is so often exhibited in God's dispensations towards individual Christians, and is, doubtless, the only economy suited to the development of all the graces of the Christian character and life. The Society has to mourn the loss by death of three of its officers,—two of its Vice-Presidents, and its late lamented Secretary. The Honourable Mr. Justice Sherwood—Joint Treasurer with the Honourable Mr. Chief Justice Robinson, for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, in this Diocese,—and the Honourable Captain Boswell, after long and useful lives spent for the most part in different spheres of public duty, were very recently gathered to their fathers, both in a ripe old age,—the one having reached the age of 73, the other that of 80 years,—an unusual term of existence, indeed, compared with the general brevity of human life.

Our late deeply lamented Secretary, the Reverend William Honeywood Ripley, B. A., was removed at a much earlier period of his life, to his reward and rest. Endowed with a peculiarly clear perception of Gospel truth, and a warm-hearted attachment to it; observing unwearied diligence in the discharge of varied and onerous duties, keenly alive to the responsibilities of his ministerial calling, and devoted to the advancement of Christ's kingdom upon earth,—he was a man of whom it may be most truly said, that not only were his services advantageous to the Society; but his very character was a treasure to it. In the Chancel of the Church, in which literally "without money and without price," from his Ordination to his death, he dispensed to his loving Parishioners the Word and Bread of Life, an interesting Tablet has been erected by the flock whom he so faithfully fed, attesting their estimation of their former Pastor's worth; and in the hearts of Churchmen in this Diocese, and wheresoever he was known, his memory will be enshrined for many generations.\*

The Society has also to deplore the decease, since its last Annual Meeting, of two other Clergymen in this Diocese,—the Rev. G. C. Barrett, and the Rev. Job Deacon.

\* *Extracts from the Minutes of The Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto :*

"The Society met on Wednesday, the 24th day of October, 1849, having been convened, by order of the Lord Bishop, to attend the funeral of the late Rev. W. H. Ripley, Secretary.

"The Members of the Society present proceeded to the late residence of the Rev. W. H. Ripley, deceased, to attend his funeral.

"The Society met on Wednesday, the 7th day of November, 1849.

"The Lord Bishop in the Chair.

"After the usual prayers the Lord Bishop announced that it had pleased Almighty



It is no more than an act of filial affection, and an act which we most cordially perform, to record our thankfulness to Almighty God for the continued prosperity of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts,—a Society which, with marked munificence, has expended upon this Diocese a very large portion of its funds, and has, for so many years, fostered our young and struggling church with a parent's tenderness and care. It is likewise satisfactory to be able to repeat the announcement, that the sister Diocesan Societies in British North America are most undoubtedly proceeding onwards in an useful and prosperous course.

When we take into consideration the moral renewal which men must undergo, before "the kingdoms of this world become the kingdoms of our Lord and of his Christ," the mind is apt to recoil from the vastness of this idea; and what little we can do towards the preparation of the earth for the universal diffusion and final supremacy of the Gospel, appears extremely small. But in the designs of that Infinite God, whose thoughts as to little and great are not as our thoughts, the efforts and the prayers of the humblest and poorest have their allotted proportion and place. More especially, in the kingdom which has sprung from a beginning small as the grain of mustard-seed, "the day of small things" is not to be despised. Little as we can do, God requires us to do what we can. Let us, then; individually, put to our consciences the question,—“Am I duly impressed with the solemnity and importance of this holy work? Have I, to the utmost of my ability, exerted myself to carry it on?” And, if it should appear that we have failed in aught, may God give us grace to see our deficiency in its proper light, and to make it up for the time to come. The arrangements through which the Church Society works are various; but let us bear in mind that, like converging rays of light, they all tend to the focus of one grand design,—to win souls to Christ. This considered, what weight or value is there in all the poor dust which we can throw into the balance, when set against the almost infinite significance of that one word,—Salvation: salvation, *in* the Church, *by* the blood of the Incarnate Son of God! And what are all the sacrifices which we can make, compared with the future glory of the Church, in which we all hope to share, when she shall stand, without spot or wrinkle, before the Throne of God and in the presence of her Redeemer and her Spouse!

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, to the intent and upon the trust, that the rents, issues, and profits thereof, after deducting all such charges and disbursements as may be incurred in the care and management of said property, and in the execution of said trust, may be appropriated and applied towards the fund for making provision for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the United Church of England and Ireland in the Diocese of Toronto.

**Schools.**

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, to the intent and upon the trust that the rents, issues, and profits thereof, after deducting all such charges and disbursements as may be incurred in the care and management of said property, and in the execution of the said trust, may be appropriated and applied for the encouragement of Education, and for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the Diocese of Toronto, in conformity with the principles of the United Church of England and Ireland.

**Particular School.**

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, to the intent and upon the trust that the rents, issues, and profits thereof, after deducting all such charges and disbursements as may be incurred in the care and management of said property, and in the execution of the said trust, may be appropriated and applied for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools [or Day Schools] [or Sunday Schools] in the Township of ..... **Erection and Endowment of Churches and Parsonages.**
