ELEVEN CANADIANS KILLED AND NINETEEN WOUNDED AT HART'S RIVER

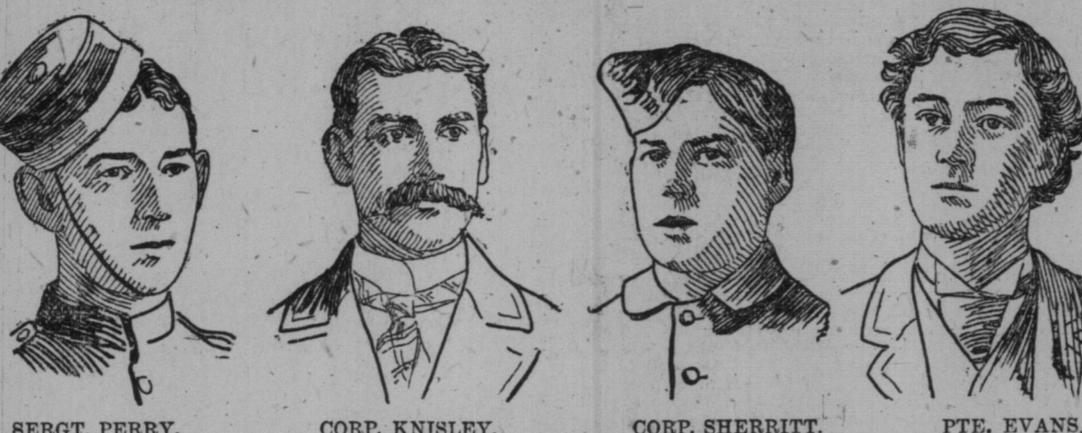
Seven Gallant Men From Ontario Give Up Their Lives in the Cause of the Empire—Galt, Selkirk, Port Hope, St. Mary's, Clarke, Brantford and Shallow Lake Will Mourn for "the Touch of a Vanished Hand."

CASUALTY LIST IS INCOMPLETE NINETEEN STILL UNREPORTED

Fearing in Ottawa That Some of Major Merritt's Troops Fell Into the Hands of the Enemy—Supplementary Report Awaited in Ottawa.

Ottawa, April 6.—The list of Canadians killed and wounded in the engagement at Hart River or Kleinhardt on Monday last is as yet incomplete. The cablegram received on Friday announced that four officers had been wounded, nine non-commissioned officers and men killed and 40 non-commissioned officers and men wounded.

ISOLATED CANADIAN'S HEROISM THOUGH DYING HE STILL FOUGHT ON

Details of the Fight at Hart's River Show Our Men in Charge of British Baggage. Repelled the Repeated Attacks of the Boers—One Party's Gallant Stand.

KLERKSBOOR, Transvaal Colony, April 6.—Details received of the battle at Doornbalt Farm, near Hart's River, March 31, in which the British had three officers and 24 men killed and 16 officers and 131 men wounded, while the Boers had 137 men killed or wounded, show that quite two thousand Boers opened a strong attack from different points with three guns and a pom-pom.

HOW THE NEWS CAME TO TORONTO ANXIETY PARTIALLY RELIEVED

A FIERCE HAND-TO-HAND STRUGGLE ENSUED

Pretoria, April 6.—Details received here of the rearguard action during the night of March 31, between the Second Dragoon Guards, of Col. Lawley's column, and the Boers, near Boschman's Kop, show that a force of 200 British, while endeavoring to surprise a Boer laager on a dark night, rode straight into a force of 500 Boers. The Boers were hidden in a drift, and opened fire almost under the legs of the British horses. A fierce hand-to-hand struggle ensued, in which both sides freely used the butt ends of their rifles. The British regained the ridge they had just left, and commenced a rearguard action.

DESERVED THEIR FATE.

More Evidence Against Australian Officers Who Were Shot. Melbourne, April 6.—A member of the Dushveldt Carbineers says that he was told by eyewitnesses that Morant and Hancock, the officers who were executed for murdering unarmed Boers, shot Boer prisoners previous to the killing of their fellow officer, Hunt. He says that Hunt was shot in the house, but was not mutilated. He confirms the report of the shooting of eight Boers who had surrendered, and adds that on other occasions shot under similar circumstances. He heard of no previous count-martalling of these Boers.

ONE KERSEY GUILTY.

Isaac Given Seven Years, But Walter Goes Free. Sarnia, April 5.—At 7 o'clock today the jury returned a verdict of guilty against Isaac Kersey, and announced Walter Kersey not guilty. Walter Kersey was thereupon discharged. Isaac Kersey was sentenced to seven years' imprisonment in the Penitentiary.

THE PEACE MISSION.

Schalkbeger to Leave Kroonstad for a More Convalescent. Kroonstad, Orange River Colony, April 6.—Owing to the great distance separating the members of the Transvaal mission here from Mr. Steyn, the former President of the Orange Free State, and Gen. Delarey, the negotiations between the Boer leaders in South Africa looking to the conclusion of the war, the Yonge-street window is expected, however, that Mr. Schalkbeger and his colleagues on the mission will shortly leave here for a more convenient center from which to conduct the negotiations.
