T. C. Robinette, K. C., Who Will Defend Little Josie Carr, on the Law as it Applies to Juvenile Offenders—Expects to Face Charge of Murder.

"What punishment can be meted out to that child?" T. C. Robinette, K.C., who has been retained by Mr. Carr, was spoken to by The World. He said:

BEREAVED FATHER DITES GIRL WHO BRINGS GRIEF

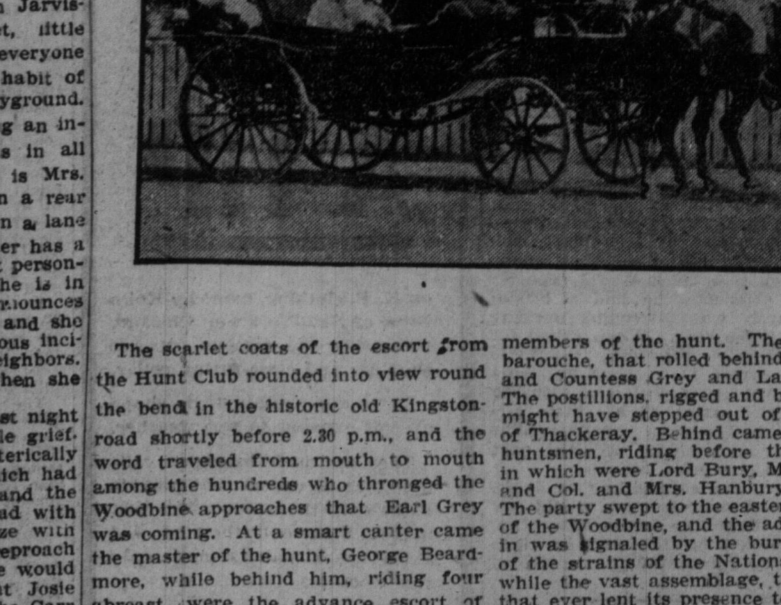
"Poor Little Girl" He Said When Told of Confession—Mother is Still Prostrated.

"Among her playmates and the rest of the little ones at the shelter at the home, she was particularly bright and was a prime favorite and seemed to be the leader of those of her own age."

"During the time that she was under our care she had charge of her little brother and sister. That I think was the only time that she displayed any cruelty. One day she beat her brother with a stick so that he complained, but I think that was more to enforce obedience than anything else."
