ONTARIO ENDOUSES LIQUOR PERMIT PLAN

ELECTS 79 PLEDGED TO BACK FERGUSON CONTROL MEASURE

Of Thirty Prohibition Candidates, Not One Was Elected—Liberals Secure 14; Progressives 13; Independent Liberals 4

MARITIMES ONLY "DRY" PROVINCES Legislature to Meet Likely in February to Work Out Details of New Scheme—Ministers Re-elected, Save Hon. D. Jamieson Yesterday

TORONTO, Dec. 2.—Premier Ferguson's following in the Legislature was reduced by one this morning, when Ontario North was changed from the Conservative to the Progressive column. With Manitoba still to be conceded, the Canadian Press reported at noon today the election of 111 members out of 112, of whom 79 are pledged to support Premier Ferguson's government control policy.

SUMMARY: Conservatives, 74; Liberals, 14; Progressives, 13; Lib.-Prog., 5; Ind.-Lib., 4; Labor, 1; doubtful, 1. Total, 112.

TORONTO, Dec. 2.—Ontario has decided to try government control in the matter of liquor sales after a ten year period of prohibitory law. The battle of the ballots, waged yesterday after six weeks of vigorous campaigning, is over and the casualties are chiefly on the side of those who championed the Ontario Temperance Act, which since 1916 has permitted the legal sale of liquors only on doctors' prescriptions. The Conservative government, led by Hon. C. Howard Ferguson, decided to jettison this act and go to the country on a proposal to introduce government sale of liquor to permit holders over 21 years of age.

Statements of Party Leaders Ferguson Happy; Raney Blames Canon Cody and White

TORONTO, Ont., Dec. 2.—Premier Ferguson issued a statement on the results of the elections, in which he said, in part: "We have today a verdict which represents sound intelligence, deliberate thought of all the people of the Province of Ontario. The result of today's vote will, I think, do a great deal to promote law and order and better conditions hereafter in the Province of Ontario, because the government will have behind it an unmistakable, emphatic mandate from all over the province endorsing the suggestions it made to the people and enabling us to form and pass sound, sane legislation, backed up by the will of the voters of Ontario."

Nickle Unabashed KINGSTON, Ont., Dec. 2.—"If I had to do it all over again I would do it as I did today," said Mr. Nickle, after the returns showed without doubt that Alderman Kidd had defeated him in Kingston. The former Attorney General expressed the hope that he would be a good enough sport to take his defeat with the same serenity as would have marked his success in the cause for which he stood.

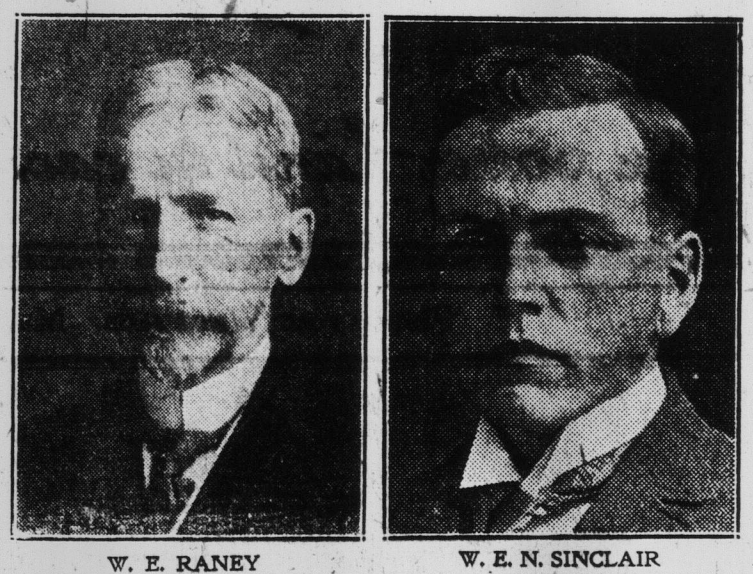
Ferguson's Policy of Liquor Control Is Strongly Endorsed

Letters To The Editor

TO HELP EAST SAINT JOHN. East Saint John, N. B., November 30, 1926.

Editor Times-Star: Sir,—Through your valuable columns, I would like, on behalf of the Executive of the Community Club of East Saint John, to place a few matters before the parishioners of this locality. As is generally known, the Community Club arranged with the Power Company, some two or three years ago, whereby an electric light service of six lights at the several car-stops on the Red Head road (from Midway avenue to the school house), would be maintained by the club. This contract is still in force; but of late, however, proper support had not been given to the parishioners in general, and in October it was felt necessary to call a special meeting, open to the public, for the purpose of ascertaining what they wished to do in the matter. So poorly attended was the meeting in question that it was felt the club had not the support needed to continue this most beneficial service. The club, in consequence, accepted a recommendation to disband, and ultimately to reorganize. This work of reorganization has been steadily taking root, officers have been duly elected, a constitution drawn up, and some necessary by-laws for its governance accepted. The club is away to a good start, handicapped only for the want of a community hall of its own, and the goodwill of the general public at large, whose patronage it is hereby soliciting.

The aims and objects of this newly-organized club are for the mutual benefit of all persons from the One-Mile House to the Little River post office, being, as it were, a kind of vigilance committee or taxpayers' association; it is open to young and old, men and women, from the age of 16 years. It is divided into classes, adult and junior, and its hopes are to stimulate through entertainment of one kind and another a social contact of an unselfish and unpolitical nature conducive of that harmony and goodwill necessary to the progress of a people. It is of course recognized that other spheres of endeavor hold the people in the religious and social life, but as something apart from distinctively denominational societies, etc., the Community Club has that feature of being capable of initiating members from all classes and creeds, for the common good. Its aims are, therefore, further enlarged to the consideration and advocacy of such public matters as referred to above. Such an organization, it is generally agreed, is needed in this thickly-populated and fast-growing part of the Parish of Simonds; but it is recognized that without the active and financial support of a fair percentage at least of the parishioners little can be accomplished. Readers of this appeal will recall the public benefits which the old club were instrumental in obtaining, such, for instance, as the two-car, 20-minute street car service; the shelters at the different stops; fire protection; water and sewerage, etc.; and, of course, the lights mentioned herein, a matter, by the way, which today hangs in the balance pending the action of the new executive of the reorganized club. This club would like to continue for the benefit of all users of the street cars, and there are many hundreds daily, the lights at the several car stops; it would also like to advocate, as did the old club, and push by a final conclusion, the provision of a sidewalk on the main thoroughfare from Kane's Corner to at least the school house; for, with the fast-growing traffic on this important highway, pedestrians are constantly in danger, and have frequently to resort to the gutter for their own personal security. Meetings have been agreed upon to take place only once a month, instead of twice as hitherto, for the transaction of business; and these it is expected would not entail any great personal sacrifice of time if regularly held, the executive handling routine matters in the interim. The fees are small, but with sufficient membership to meet all working expenses and the cost of the lights. The United Church has kindly consented to permit the club to meet in its hall in Park avenue on the first Monday of the month, and the meetings are scheduled to take place at 8 o'clock on those nights. May we not appeal to all East Saint John residents, but in particular to the taxpayers, to come and join us at our next meeting, the first Monday in December. United we stand, divided we fall. 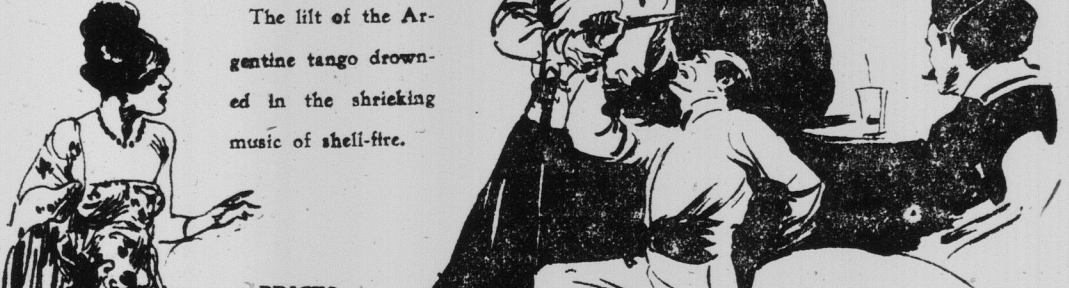
