Paris, April 24.—Allied and Associated Governments informed the German Government through General Nadunt, at Spa, that they are ready to receive the German delegates at Versailles on April 28. They will leave Berlin on April 28 and arrive in Versailles on May 1, according to messages from Berlin. It is known that a small delegation and a suite of seventy-five persons with a staff of forty telegraph operators and electricians to prepare for the telegraphic installation will arrive at Versailles from Spa immediately.
