Archbishop Perce's
HE IS CONSIDERED ONE OF THE MOST REMARKABLE MEMBERS OF THE CATHOLIC HIERARCHY.
Archbishop Perce is considered one of the most remarkable members of the Catholic hierarchy. Sixty-eight years ago he was born in Naples of a noble Neapolitan family. In 1837, after completing his classical course, he renounced all worldly prospects and entered the Capuchin order, with the idea of becoming a foreign missionary. He was ordained in 1846, before he had completed his twenty-third year. As he has not reached the canonical age for ordination, a special dispensation had to be obtained from the Pope before he could be made a priest. After pursuing a supplementary course of studies at the Propaganda he was sent to a Vicariate-Apostolic as a missionary. For some years he visited the remotest parts of that extensive vicariate, reaching the frontiers on every side, including Nepal, Sikkim, and Chinese Tartary. In 1871 he went to the East Indies, and shortly after advocated before the English Government the interests of the Catholic population of India. As Vicar Apostolic of Agri which was created in 1854, he had charge of a district extending to Cashmere, Cabul, Afghanistan, and Tibet. During the Crimean war he served as chaplain in the British army. After the war he sailed for Europe to solicit means to restore the Church in his vicariate to its former condition, but was almost miraculously rescued almost miraculously. The Indian climate didn't agree with Bishop Perce, and in 1867 he resigned his vicariate and came to the United States as a missionary. He was appointed Bishop of Savannah, March 20, 1870, when he was made Bishop of Savannah. Three years later his health began to fail, and he resigned his See. He was sent by the Holy See to Canada to adjust some delicate questions, and subsequently to Malabar, where he was appointed Bishop of the United Dioceses of Aquino, Portorico, and Sora, in Italy. A few years ago he was made Archbishop of Damietta, in Africa.

Some Foreign Ministry Statistics.
Few Catholics have the remotest idea of the wonderful growth of the Church in foreign lands. We are astonished at the progress of the Church in this land and often astonished at the figures presented from year to year which show the Catholic population increases from hundreds to thousands and tens of thousands in a few years.
Here are a few facts and figures from a region hitherto little known in modern days in the annals of the Church, which will not fail to interest any who glory in knowing how zealous the Holy See is in sending out her Divine Commissionaries to preach the Gospel to all nations.
The Illustrated Catholic Missionary gives the following figures showing the number of Catholics in the countries designated, at different periods, and the increase thus demonstrated in something every Catholic should regard God thanks for:

The Catholic Mission in commenting on these figures representing a more than fivefold aggregate increase, points out how far this ratio is surpassed by the growth in individual localities which may be truly called miraculous. "Some instances," it says, "are so amazing as to recall the days of St. Francis Xavier. Everybody has heard of the 'outpouring of grace' in Chota Nagpore, Bengal. We have in our hands a letter from a Bengal Father, who says of this district, 'God has indeed wonderfully blessed the endeavor of our missionaries, for in the short space of five years the number of converts has risen from 255 to over 50,000.'"
The same periodical records on the authority of the Madras Catholic Directory the still more wonderful figures of the martyred for the Faith in Eastern Cochin China, in July and August, 1884. Here, out of a Catholic population now numbering 17,775, there suffered death at that time 24,000 Christians, together with nine European missionaries, seven native priests, 69 catechists and 270 Annamese monks. This forcible persecution recalls those of the early Church in the numbers and constancy of its victims.

Holyrood Abbey.
DESCRIPTION OF THE MOST FAMOUS BUILDING OF THE SCOTCH CAPITAL.
Holyrood Abbey, situated in the environs of Edinburgh, was founded, in 1128, by David I.
Its monks were canons regular of the Order of Augustines.
The edifice, in its palmy days, comprised a suite of apartments for lodging royal guests, a quadrangle of cloisters for the use of its own monks, and a very magnificent cruciform church, with two towers on its western front, and a grand central tower at the intersection of its nave and transept.
The apartments for royal guests stood to the south of the church, and were swept away to give place to the royal palace.
The cloisters projected from the angle between the church's south transept and its nave, on ground which came to be required for extension of the palace, and only the part of the north side of them can be traced.
The choir of the church was of great extent, and probably had a Lady chapel at its eastern extremity, but it has utterly disappeared.
The nave was 148 feet long, and 66 feet broad. It continued to be respected after all other parts of the pile had perished; and with the exception of the roof its southern tower and some of the upper parts of its walls, it is still standing.
The entire edifice forms an open quadrangle chiefly of Grecian character and somewhat resembling the palace of Hampton Court.
The royal apartments are reached by a grand staircase from the south-west angle of the piazza. These were formed to represent all the older royal residences in Scotland, and a few years ago, after having long lain in great neglect, they were entirely refitted, in a style of much elegance, under the direction of the decorative artist, B. E. Hay.
The picture-gallery, measuring 150 feet in length, 27 feet in breadth, and 18 feet in height, occupies the first floor on the north side of the quadrangle. Its walls are hung with portraits alleged to represent

TARTE-McGREGG INQUIRY

Sir Hector Langevin appeared before the committee on Tuesday last week. After the minutes had been read an approved Sir Hector rose and said: "Mr. Chairman, I have seen notice of the proceedings of this committee, and finding that my name is connected with the inquiry, I have come here of my own free will and I ask to be put under oath, and be permitted to make a statement in my own defence."

THE BAIE DES CHALEURS BOODLING AFFAIR

On the 8th inst. the Senate railway committee applied to the Senate for power to send for persons and papers and to examine witnesses under oath in reference to charges of graft boodling connected with the Baie des Chaleurs Railway. The request was granted without comment, in the committee, Mr. Harvey, who is in charge of the charges that continued his case. He stated that he believed and could prove that a large portion of the \$200,000 paid as an extra bonus to the old Baie des Chaleurs railway had been used for political purposes with the knowledge of the directors of the new company. He said that Armstrong, the original contractor, had received \$150,000 of the \$200,000 of this money had been used in bribery. There had been five cheques made out of \$20,000 each, payable to Armstrong and signed by Chrysostom Langelier. Armstrong had endorsed such with a general endorsement but never cashed any of the money. The cheques when endorsed were used by Mr. Langelier.

WHAT THE GLOBE SAYS

When Mr. Armstrong was first brought before the Senate Committee, in connection with the Baie des Chaleurs Railway affair, he refused to give evidence. We repeat, the Toronto Globe, the leading opposition newspaper in the Dominion, came out with the following, from which some of the lesser Ork shrews would do well to take a lesson: "The state is in duty bound to compel him to tell the whole story and, by hands upon Pasco, Garneau and them all at the earliest opportunity. The federal government has paid \$225,000 in cash to the railway, and the federal taxpayer is entitled to know at once whether there is any truth in the statement that the money has been lost with fraud. 
