Dr. Bourne, of this city, completed a tip on foot from Portland, Oregon, to this city, yesterday at one o'clock p.m. He left Portland on the 27th of May, and his logbook gives the following notes of his travel:—Distance, 800 miles; days and parts of days actual walking, 302; consumption of unbolted bread or crackers during the journey, less than 40 pounds; other food, stewed fruits and water; loss of weight, five pounds. The Doctor is 66 years of age and cannet afford to lose much flesh.
