

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BY-LAWS.

NO. 302—A BY-LAW

To amend a By-law numbered 270, passed 25th June, A.D. 1875, entitled a Ry-law to provide for the duties of Poundkeepers, Fenceviewers, and other resident persons detaining animals trespassing, and for fixing and determining the height and description of a lawful fence in the Township of Raleigh.

Passed March 16th, A.D. 1877.

TATHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to make provisions for restraining and regulating the running at large certain description of animals and to provide for the impounding the same, and for causing them to be sold in case they are not claimed and redeemed within a reasonable time; or in case of damages, lines and expense not being paid, and for determining the compensation to be allowed for services rendered in carrying out the provisions of this By-law with respect to animals impounded, or distrained and detained in the possession of the distrainer, and for the guidance of Poundkeepers, Fenceviewers and other resident persons detaining animals trespassing contrary to the provisions hercinafter persons decaming admias trespassing contrary to the provisions hereinafter, provided, and for fixing and determining the height and description of a lawful fence, and for repealing c.ttain By-laws of the Township of Raleigh.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act of the Frovince of Ontario respecting Municipal Institutions:

Ist. That the following description of animals shall not be allowed to run at large in the Township of Raleigh, viz: Horses, mares, colts, fillies, mules, asses, and swine, and all four-footed animals known to be breachy or to leap over, throw down, or break through a lawful fence; and all bulls over nine months old, rams over three months old, whether bona fide owned in the Township of Raleigh or not; provided that all cattle and sheep not owned by residents of Raleigh, or who rent or work land therein, shall not be allowed to run at large in said Township

of Raleigh.

2nd. The owner or occupant of any land shall be responsible for any damage and keeping as though such were his own property; and the owner of any animal not permitted to run at large by this By-law shall be liable for any damage one by such animal, although the fence enclosing the same was not of the height required by the

third clause of this By-law.

3rd. That all rail and other fences within the Township of Raleigh which are four feet six inches high, posted or locked, staked and ridered, or locked at the corners, the distance between each of the four lower rails not more than four inches apart; and that any perpendicular palisade fence, the spaces between the bars of which are not more than four inches at the distance of two feet from the ground, shall be taken and deemed a lawful fence. Provided that every such fence, which shall be four feet six inches in height, shall be held to be a lawful fence against the breach of horses, mules, colts, fillies, and neat cattle, notwithstanding anything relating to the space between the rails, boards, palisades. or pickets to the contrary.

4th. All Poundkeepers appointed by the Council of this Corporation in each of the respective Rural Road Divisions shall impound any horse, bull, ox, cow, sheep, pig, goat, or other cattle, distrained for unlawfully running at large, or for trespassing and doing damage, delivered to him for that purpose, by any person who has distrained the same, which person shall at the time, or within 24 hours thereafter, deliver to the Poundkeeper duplicate statements in writing of his demands against the owner for damages (if any) not exceeding twenty dollars done by such animal or animals, exclusive of the Poundage fees; and shall also give 5th. Every Poundkeeper, and every person who impounds, confines, or causes to be impounded or confined, any animal or animals in any common pound, or in any open or enclosed pound, or in any enclosed place, shall daily furnish each animal with good and sufficient food, water and shelter, during the whole time such animal continues impounded or confined, under a penalty of one dollar for each twenty-four hours he shall neglect or refuse to so feed and shelter the same.

6th. The value or allowance of fees and damages as aforesaid, may be recovered with costs, by summary proceeding, before any Justice of the Peace within whose jurisdiction the animal was impounded, in like manner as fines, penalties and forfeitures for the breach of any By-law of the Municipality may by law be recovered and enforced by a single Justice of the Peace; and the Justice shall ascertain and determine the amount of such value and allowance, when not otherwise fixed by law, adhering as far as practicable to the tariff of the Poundkeeper's fees and charges that are anrexed to this By-law.

7th. If the owner within forty-eight hours after the delivery of such statements, as provided in the fourth clause of this By-law, dispute the amount of damage so claimed, the amount shall be decided by the majority of three Fenceviewers of the Municipality—one to be named by the owner of the animal, and one by the person distraining and claiming damages, and the third by the Poundkeeper.

8th. Such Fenceviewers, or any two of them, shall, within six hours after notice of their appointment, view the ground upon which the animal or animals were found doing damage, and shall appraise the damage committed, and within twenty-four hours thereafter deliver to the Poundkeeper a written statement, signed by at least two of them, of their appraisement and of their lawful fees and charges; Provided in all cases the fence shall be lawful against animals which are free-commoners; and if the Fenceviewers find that the fence is not lawful, they shall so award, and the person impounding the animal or animals shall pay the Poundkeeper all the lawful fees and charges.

9th. Any Fenceviewer neglecting his duty as arbitrator as aforesaid, shall incur a penalty of two dollars, to be recovered by summary proceedings before any Justice of the Peace, upon the complaint of the Poundkeeper or party aggrieved.

10th. In case an animal be not redeemed, the Poundkeeper shall, before any sale takes place, go before some Justice of the Peace and make an affidavit that he has put up and given all the notices required by this By-law, which shall be publicly read at the time of sale; and all sums over and above the lawful fees and charges, if not called for by the owner within one month, shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the Township.

11th. The owner of any geese or other poultry who allows or suffers the same to trespass on his neighbors' premises, after due notice in writing has been served upon him that his geese or other poultry have been trespassing and doing damage, the person whose premises and crops have been damaged shall make his complaint to a Justice of the Peace, who shall have power to try and summarily hear the dispute, and fine and award damages and costs as to him may seem just, not exceeding \$20.

12th. Every Poundkeeper shall, on or before the 14th day of December in each

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year, make a return to the Township Clerk under the following heads, viz.: The name of the person taking up the animal, and to whom delivered; kinds of animals impounded, and whether sold or redeemed; giving the date it was put in pound and delivered or sold; the amount of fees and damages paid; also the amount over and above such fees and damages; where the animal has been sold and how disposed of, (on a form to be supplied by the Township Clerk); under a penalty of five dollars, on a complaint to be made by the Township Clerk to any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction in the said Township of Raleigh.

13th. Every fine, penalty and lawful charge imposed by this By-law may be recovered with costs by summary conviction, under the Summary Conviction Act, before any Justice of the Peace in the County, and, in default of payment, the offender may be committed to the Common Gaol of this County, there to be imprisoned at hard labor for any time in the discretion of the convicting and committing Justice, not exceeding fourteen days, unless such fine, penalty and lawful charge and cost of said committal be soover paid.

The following clauses shall apply to animals distrained by residents of the Township and not impounded:

14th. In case the animal distrained is an ox, cow, sheep, goat, or other cattle, for straying into the premises, such person, instead of delivering the animal or animals to a Poundkeeper, may retain the animal or animals in his own possession, providing he makes no claim for damages done by the animal or animals, and duly gives the notices hereinafter in that case required of him.

15th. If the owner is known to him he shall forthwith give to the owner notice in writing of having taken up the animal or animals. If the owner be unknown to the person taking up and retaining possession of the animal or animals, such person shall, within forty-eight hours, deliver to the Municipal Clerk a notice of having taken up the animal or animals, and containing a description of the color, age and natural and artificial marks of the animal or animals, as near as may be.

16th. The Municipal Clerk, on receiving this notice, shall forthwith enter a copy thereof in a book to be kept by him for that purpose; and he shall post the notice he receives, or a copy thereof, in some conspicuous place on or near the door of his office, and continue the same so posted for at least one week, unless the animal or animals is sooner claimed by the owner.

17th. If the animal or any number of animals taken up at the same time be of the value of ten dollars or more, the distrainer shall cause a copy of the notice to be published in the Weekly Chatham BANNER or PLANET newspaper, and to be continued therein once a week for three successive weeks. If the animal is a gost or sheep, the notices for the sale shall not be given for one month; and if the animal is an ox, cow, or other cattle, the notices shall not be given for two months after the animal is taken up; which shall be given for three clear days, in at least three public places in the Township; and if such animal or animals so distrained, at the expiration of three days be not redeemed, he shall get one of the Pound-keepers to sell the same, who shall allow all lawful fees and charges, and retain the balance, if any, to be applied according to law.

18th. When not otherwise provided, every pecuniary penalty recovered before any Justice of the Peace under this By-law shall be paid and be distributed in the following manner:—One moiety to the Treasurer of this Corporation for the use of the Municipality, and the other moiety thereof, with the full costs, to the person who informed and prosecuted for the same, or to such other person as to

the Justice may seem proper.

19th. That all By-laws heretofore made by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh inconsistent with this By-law, be and the same are hereby repealed.

NO. 304-A BY-LAW

To alter the Boundaries of certain School Sections in the Township of Raleigh, hereinafter named.

Passed 25th April, 1877.

WHEREAS application has been made to this Council to have Lot No. 15 in Concession A detached from School Section No. 13, and to attach the same to School Section No. 5; also, to detach Lot No. 14 in the 15th Concession, and the N. E. half of Lot No. 145 on Falbot Road, and the Village of Dealtown, from School Section No. 9, and to attach the same to School Section No. 10,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of the Province of Ontario, and the Common School Acts now in force.

1st. That from and after the 24th day of December next that Lot No. 15 in Concession A, be and is hereby detached from School Section No. 13 and attached to School Section No. 5.

2nd. That the N. E. half of Lot No. 145, Talbot Road; and Lot No. 14 in the 15th Concession; and all the Village of Dealtown, be and is hereby detached from School Section No. 9 and attached to School Section No. 10.

NO. 305-A BY-LAW

To authorize the raising of certain sums of money hereinafter mentioned, in the Township of Raleigh, to meet the current expenses of the year 1877.

Passed the 16th July, 1877.

WHEREAS by a By-law of the Municipal Council of the County of Kent passed in the June Session in said year 1877, and entituled "A By-law to raise the sum of \$33,572,30 to meet the current expenses of the said County of Kent for the current year."

And Whereas the Municipality of the Township of Raieigh is required to raise the sum of \$3771 54, as their portion for said year 1877, to be paid to the Treasurer of the said County of Kent, without any deduction, on or before the 14th day of December next.

And Whereas the apportionment of the Legislative School grant for the said Township of Raleigh for the year 1877, according to notice received from the County Clerk, is the sum of \$486 00.

And Whereas the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise

an equal sum of money in such case made and provided.

And Whereas it is necessary to raise the following sums of money to meet the current expenses of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh for the said year 1877, viz:—

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Be at therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Act respecting Municipal Institutions of the Province of Ontario:

1st. That there shall be raised, leviad and collected upon all rateable real and

1st. That there shall be raised, levied and collected upon all rateable real and personal property in the Township of staleigh, the sum or rate of 2 45-000th mills on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid County purposes; the sum or rate of one 80-100ths mills on every dollar thereof, to meet the current expenses of the Township for the year 1877; the sum of 32-100 parts of a mill on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid School purposes (except on the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools); the sum or rate of One Dollar upon the owner or harborer of every dog, and the sum or rate of Two Dollars upon the owner or harborer of every bitch entered on the Assessment Roll for the current year.

2nd. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected by the said rates shall exceed in any case the amounts so required for the aforesaid purposes respectively, the Treasurer of this Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise to any or either of the mentioned purposes of this By-law; and if no such deficiency shall happen, then all such excess (if any) shall be kept by the Treasurer and appropriated to the general purposes of the Township, under the direction and control of the Council thereof, as all the moneys are that may come

into his hands.

3rd. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate over and above all other rates, against the estate, real and personal, of any School Section within this Municipality, on the request of the Trustees, who shall furnish him on or before the first meeting of the month of August with a written statement signed by such Trustees, of the amount of money to be raised for Common School purposes in each School Section, such a rate pro rate on all the rateable real and perfered property in such School Section as will amount to the sum so required by such Trustees for the aforesaid School purposes, together with the sum of Four per cent, thereon for levying and collecting the same.

4th. That the Collector is hereby authorized and required to collect according to law the special rates levied on the freeholders and householders of such School Section the sums of money set opposite their respective names, and to pay over the same to the Treasurer of this Corporation on or before the 14th day of December post.

5th. It shall be the duty of the Collector to pay over all money collected by him to the Treasurer of this Corporation every two weeks, under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary, and to finally collect and pay over all moneys collected by him and make a return to the Treasurer by the Fourteenth day of December next, according to law.

6th. That the Collector shall be allowed the same fees as are now allowed to Bailiffs of the Division Courts for all property seized, appraised, advertised and sold by him by virtue of his office.

NO. 306-A BY-LAW

To divide the Township of Raleigh into six Polling Sub-Divisions for Legislative and Municipal purposes.

Passed 16th July, 1877.

BE IT therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Municipal Acts of Ontario and the Acts respecting the Voter's Lists:

1st. That the First Polling Sub-division shall include all that portion of the Township of Raleigh lying between the River Thames and the line between Concessions A and 8, from the Town line between Raleigh and Tilbury East, to the line between Lots 12 and 13.

2nd. That the Second Polling Sub-division shall embrace and include all that portion of the Township of Raleigh lying between said River Thames and the centre of the 8th Concession, from the Side road between Lots 12 and 13 to the Town line between Harwich and Raleigh, save and except the North-west halves of Lots 13 and 14 in the 8th Con., and that portion within the Town of Chatham.

3rd. Thatthe Third Polling Sub-division shall contain and consist of that portion

3rd. That the Third Polling Sub-division shall contain and consist of that portion of the said Township of Raleigh from the Western boundary clasid Township to the line between Lots 7 and 8, from the line between Concessions A and 8 to the line between Concession 14 and the Talbot Road lots.

4th. That the Fourth Polling Sub-division shall consist of all that portion of the Township of Raleigh, from the line between Concessions A and 8 to the line South of the 14th Concession, from the line between Lots 7 and 8 to the line between Lots 14 and 15.

5th. That the Fifth Polling Sub-division of said Township shall include and embrace all the lands lying between the centre of the 8th Concession to the line between the 13th and 14th Concessions from the line between Lots 14 and 15 to

Town line between Harwich and Raleigh.

6th. That the Sixth Polling Sub-division shall include and consist of all that portion of the Township of Raleigh lying South-east of the 14th Concession, to the line between Lots 14 and 15, thence of the line between Concessions 13 and 14 from the Western to the Eastern boundary of said Township. PROVINCE OF ONTARIO-TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH, IN THE COUNTY OF KENT. A BY-LAW numbered 307, to raise by way of loan the sum of Five Hundred Dollars for the purpose of Public School Section number 8 of said Township. Passed 30th July, A.D. 1877.

7 HEREAS the Public School Trustees of School Section number Eight in the said Township of Raleigh have required the Municipal Council of the said Township to sanction the borrowing by the said Trustees of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars by way of loan, repayable on the expiry of one year from the day on which the By-law is to take effect, with interest in the meantime at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable yearly, in order that out of the money so borrowed the said Trustees may pay the balance for the erection of a School House and its apper lages, required in and for said School Section.

And Whereas the total rate required to be raised by special rate for paying the caid debt and interest under the terms of this By-law is the sum of Five

Hundred Dollars

And Whereas the amount of the whole rateable property in the said School Section, according to the last revised Assessment Roll, is the sum of \$153,237.00.

And Whereas the said School Section has no existing debt

And Whereas the annual special rate of 3½ mills on the dollar on the said amount of the rateable property in the said School Section is required for paying the interest and creating a yearly sinking fund for paying the principal of said debt. And Whereas the said debt is created on the security of the special rate afore-

said, and on that security only.

The Municipal Council of the said Township enacts as follows:

1st. It shall be lawful for the Reeve of the Township of Raleigh to raise by way of loan from any person or Corporation who may be willing to advance upon the credit of the Debentures hereinafter mentioned the sum of Five Hundred Dollars

for the purpose and with the object above recited.

2nd. It shall be lawful for the said Reeve to cause one or more Debentures to be made to the amount of the said sum of Five Hundred Dollars in all, but not less than One Hundred Dollars each; and that the said Debentures shall be sealed with the Seal of the said Municipal Corporation, and be signed by the said

Reeve, and countersigned by the Treasurer thereo!.

3rd. The said Debentures shall be made payable in one year from the day hereinafter mentioned for this By-law to take effect, at the Office of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham, and shall have attached to them

Coupons for the payment of interest.

4th The said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum from the date hereof, which interest shall be payable yearly on the 15th day of October in the year 1878, with the principal at said Office of the Bank aforesaid.

5th. For the purpose of forming a sinking fund for the payment of the said Debentures and the interest at the rate aforesaid to become due thereon, an equal special rate of 32 mills in the dollar shall, in addition to all other rates, be raised, levied and collected in each year upon all the rateable property in the said School Section during the continuance of the said Debentures or any of them.

6th. This By-law shall take effect and come into operation upon the 15th day

of October next, 1877, the same day as the Debentures are to be dated.

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NO. 308-A BY-LAW

To appoint a competent person to decide and award the proportion Raleigh and the adjoining Municipalities shall pay for the maintenance of Public Schools in the several Union School Sections affecting this Township.

Passed 23rd August, 1877.

WHEREAS the last amended School Law of 1877 provides that a competent person, not being a member of the Council, shall be appointed by each Municipality concerned to decide the proportion each Municipality shall pay for maintenance of the Schools in Union School Sections.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of said Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act respecting the Municipal Institutions and the Com-

mon School Laws of Ontario.

1st. That Edwin McCollum be and is hereby appointed to act with such other person as shall be appointed, and the Inspector or Inspectors, to decide and award the proportion or part Raleigh, Harwich, Tilbury East, and Dover East and West shall pay towards the erection of buildings, maintenance and other requisite expenses of Public Schools in the following Union School Sections, viz:—Number One, Raleigh, Tilbury East, and Dover East and West; No. 2, Raleigh and Tilbury East; School Sections numbers Three and Four, and Two and a-half, Raleigh and Harwich; and the period of years the award shall stand, with provision for the renewal thereof.

2nd. That a copy of the award be filed with the Clerk of this Municipality

within one month.

NO. 309—A BY-LAW

To provide for draining parts of the Township of Raleigh, by the repairing and extending of the Mummery Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$438.75 for completing the same.

Passed 23rd August, 1877.

HEREAS a majority in number of the owners as shewn by the last revised Assessment Roll of the said Township of Raleigh, of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the repairing and extending of the said Mummery Drain, have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that the following lots of land may be drained, viz: The North 4 of Lot no. 19, the N, W, 4 of Lot no. 20, Lot no. 21, and the S.E. 4 of Lot no. 22 in the 9th Concession; the N.W, ½ of Lot no. 21, all of Lot no. 22, and the S. 4 of Lot no. 23, in the 10th Corcession of the said Township of Raleigh.

And whereas thereupon the said Council procured an examination to be made by William G. McGeorge, P.L.S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained by the repairing and extending of said Drain, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by said William G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by the repairing and extending of the said Drain, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such drainage, by every road and lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made and har report of the said William G. McGeorge in respect thereof and the said drainage, being as follows:—Commencing near the center of Lot no. 22 in the 10th Concession of Raleigh, and thence runs Northwesterly to the road between the 9th and 10th Concessions; thence Southwesterly along the Southerly side of this road to the line between Lots 21 and 22, and thence crosses the Concession road to the corresponding line in the 9th Concession. It thence runs Northwesterly keeping near this line to near the middle line of the lots, and then runs Westerly and Southwesterly through lots 21 and 20 in the 9th Concession, and terminates in the Moody Creek drain. The estimated cost of the

work is \$612.25.

And whereas the said Council are of opinion that the drainage of the locality

described is desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of Ontario, passed in the thirty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign, chapter forty-eight.

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n the 15th day ated. TE. REEVE. lst. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and said Drain and

works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith. 2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of \$438.75, being the funds necessary for the work, and may issue Debentures of the Corporation to that amount, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each, and payable within three years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum, that is to say: in three equal annual payments of \$146.25 each, on the first day of November in each year; such Debentures to be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham, and to have attached to them Coupons for the payment of Interest.

3RD. That for the purpose of paying the sum of \$438.75, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefitted as aforesaid, other than the roads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for three years at the rate of five per cent. per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied, upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots; and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively, shall be divided into four equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid in each year for four years after the final passing of this By-law, during which the said Debentures have to run, with interest as aforesaid on the three last payments. Said Debentures to be dated on the lst day of November, 1877.

SCHEDULE OF LANDS ASSESSED TO THE MUMMERY DRAIN.

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4th. That the sum of \$27.25 assessed on the road allowance small be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality.

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the five Rural Road Divisions in the Township of Raleigh, and to confirm the appointment of Commissioners to expend the same,
