CANADA'S HIDDEN WEALTH

The French Expert's Views On Rosiland Camp.

ENGLAND'S EYES ARE ON US

First Carload of Sudbury Coal Soon to Reach Toronto.

Columbia and Western Railroad From Trail to Robsonland Has Gold, Too.

Ontario's Mining Law-Hawk Bay and Sawbill Gold Mines-General Mining Matters.

Emile M. du Marais, the mining expert who arrived in the Kootenay some time since to investigate and report upon the mineral deposits there...

Before leaving Rosiland, Mr. Marais spoke very favorably of the camp. He said that it was remarkable for its extent and "powerful mineralization" and resembled Butte in some ways.

Continuing, he observed: "As in Butte, the ore deposits are in wide fractures in the country rock and very often go through the walls impregnating the country rock. As in Butte, the veins in copper are rarely found near the surface, but in Butte the rock is very alterable granite, in which the sulfides may be decomposed, and replaced by iron and copper pyrites, giving the enormous bodies of the Rosiland and Barus mines. In Rosiland, the rock being much harder, it cannot be decomposed by water and the large ore body beyond the vein itself can be found only in the places where the rock is fractured. In Butte there is no gold-only silver; in Rosiland the value is mostly silver. I think that the future of the camp is in the low grade ore. Every year there is some improvement in the price of such ore. I hope that the new railroad from the Crow's Nest Pass will be built very soon and bring at low price the fuel necessary for mining and smelting purposes. At that time the price of smelting will be largely reduced. It is very probable, too, that by very alluvial and some ore some chemical process such as cyanide or chlorination will be successfully used. The reduction of the price of treatment will be the most important factor in the rapid development of the camp, for it seems likely that Rosiland will become a large camp for low grade ore rather than a small camp for high grade ore."

"With such low grade ore abundant in the camp the best place for treatment seems to be the one nearest the mines with abundant supply of water at all seasons. I do not know if it is possible to bring to Rosiland a sufficient quantity of water at reasonable expense. If not it is very easy to pump on the banks of the Columbia River some good place when the output of the camp will be too great for the Trail smelter to handle."

In reply to a question as to whether he thought the French expert would be invested in Rosiland, the expert remarked that the French people preferred the sure profits of a low grade ore camp like Rosiland to the extraordinarily rich districts.

A Good Idea This. The Government of New South Wales is offering a reward of £200 for the discovery and reporting of new reefs or alluvial gold fields. If the new field is big enough to afford employment to 500 miners within a year the discoverer is entitled to another £500.

To Be Built in 60 Days. F. Aug. Heinze has advertised for bids for the construction of the Columbia and Western Railroad from Trail to Robson, to be built this winter. Bids are asked for both narrow and standard gauge and the question of the gauge will be decided when the estimates are in. Should standard gauge be decided on the road from Trail to Robson will be standardized forthwith. The French expert will call for the completion of the road to Robson in 60 days.

In this connection it may be stated that there are now in the neighborhood of 175 cars of West Kootenay coal right on the C. P. R. and Mr. Heinze has concluded that to handle the business it is absolutely necessary to have the road to Robson in operation in the time specified.

England's Eyes On Canada. According to the London (Eng.) correspondent of the Rosiland Miner, Canada has greatly increased in favor with mining investors in the last few months. He says: "Reports of new discoveries of gold in the east as well as in the west have been received recently and have been authenticated by English experts. Canada has immensely increased in favor with mining investors during the past few months, and reports of new discoveries of gold reefs in the east as well as in the west have been received recently and have been authenticated by English experts. The Dominion Government is not backward in taking advantage of this rise in public esteem, and their immigration agents are working hard in hand with the officials of the Canadian Pacific to direct a larger portion of our surplus population which every year leaves these shores to the plains of Manitoba and Ontario. No doubt a certain proportion of those who elect to make Canada their new home will not be of the stuff that makes the best colonists, but the reports of your gold fields will undoubtedly bring a number of men possessing a little capital and a large supply of energy and determination that will not fail to bring their reward."

Newfoundland Has Gold Too. Says an English writer: "It seems to be very generally admitted now that Newfoundland has established her claim to the possession of gold-bearing quartz reefs of some value. The great richness of these deposits has yet to be determined, but the recent report of a well-known English engineer has given much satisfaction to those interested in that colony. It is stated that the ore was undoubtedly of some value and well worth the cost of developing."

Little Wallace's Mine. Clarke Wallace, who recently bonded the Little Phil mine has been forced under Al Saalberg, driving the main tunnel ahead to tap the main lead, which shows up well on the surface where assays of 150 ounces have been obtained. The Little Phil is in the Alnsworth, B. C. region.

Rosiland Mining Machinery. It is almost impossible to keep pace with the orders for machinery in the Rosiland camp. We now have a capacity of 160 rock drills within a radius of three miles of Rosiland. These drills

are operated by compressed air. One year ago there were two drills in the whole camp. The Le Roi had a seven-drill compressor in operation and the War Eagle had a temporary three-drill plant.

We have grown from 10 drills to 160 drills in a single year. We are now using more rock drills than the entire country of Idaho. The Cour d'Alene district of Idaho, Ore. are already placed for half a dozen new compressor plants to be delivered within the next three months. In less time than that we shall have 200 drills in operation.

The Le Roi, Kootenay and Columbia and War Eagle compressors are the largest ever built for any mining camp in Canada. The Le Roi's new plant is of 40 drills capacity and it already has a seven-drill plant in operation. From Columbia and Kootenay plant, has 30 drill capacity, the War Eagle plant 20, Centre Star 7, Monte Cristo 7, Crow Point 7, E. L. 7, Homestead 7, Josie 5, Commander 5, City of Spokane 5, O. K. 5, Nest Egg 4, White Bear 3, and Cliff 3.

Negotiations are now pending for the largest and most complete diamond drill plant ever erected on the continent. These negotiations have gone so far that specifications have been prepared and bids asked for the equipment. In enumerating machinery plants we have mentioned steam hoists or pumps, several of which are now in operation, while others are in for completion. We do not offer any predictions for the next 12 months, but it is safe to say that the amount of machinery used Kootenay will soon rank with the Rand of South Africa.

HARRIS, THE "GOLD KING." Visits the Queen City-Wall-street, New York. Mr. W. J. Harris, the "gold king," from Rosiland, is in town again. He is assistant manager of the Le Roi, president of the Commander Smelting Company, and vice-president of the Lily May Mining Company, and will remain over in Toronto a couple of weeks.

Talking to The World on Saturday, Mr. Harris denied the truth of the story that the Le Roi is to be sold, and said that there is not even an option upon it.

Development work is going on around Rosiland with a rush, he says, and the outlook for the camp is brighter than ever.

Lily May Looking Well. In reference to the Lily May, Mr. Harris remarked that it is at a depth of 25 feet the No. 3 shaft is down in the ore. This shaft has been sunk on a parallel vein with the old working, a vein, by the way, that is claimed to be identical with those running through the Zilora property, for which Mr. Heinze of the Trail Creek smelter is building a branch of his railway to the Zilora and it will cross the Lily May shaft.

With such excellent shipping facilities and such a good showing of ore as has been struck, the prospect of the Lily May are bright, indeed.

Mr. Frank C. Loring, the expert mining engineer, who visited Rosiland last week, said that the world is watching the development of the Kootenay region. As yet they are a little cautious, but with this reticence is likely to be overcome.
