BOER NEWS IN NEW YORK

Delegate Wessels Says the Crucial Test of the War Will Be at the Vaal River.

THE WHITE FLAG TREACHERY

Explained by Saying the Orange Color of the Free State Had Been "Washed Out" by Storms.

New York, May 16.—Beyond a drive thru Central Park and the principal locations of interest in the city, no program was arranged for the Boer envoys to-day.

They spent the forenoon in answering telegrams and letters from cities in the United States.

From which invitations had been received to be guests. An effort is being made to arrange a plan so that the envoys can visit a majority of the cities.

All According to Plan.

P. W. Wessels, one of the trio, was asked concerning the English advances and successes reported in recent cables.

"Everything is going according to the plan of action prepared some time ago.

Every time we fall back it is given out as a British success, but if we are considered a plan and does not hurt us in any way.

Want I consider the crucial test will be at the Vaal River, near Pretoria.

The envoys were asked collectively as to the published reports that the Boers had been defeated at the expected battle at the Vaal River which they had been told would be the crucial test.

Absence of the Boers.

Mr. Wessels, one of the envoys, in discussing the alleged absence of the white flag in the country, mentioned the fact that the Boers had been told that the white flag had been washed out by the storms.

A Convenient Flag for Treachery.

"Very often," said Mr. Wessels, "the flag of the Orange Free State is used for a white flag. The colors are orange and white and invariably after a battle the Boers are seen to carry the white flag, which is a sign of treachery.

Chalmers From Kruger.

Charles F. Chalmers, general manager of the Orange Free State, received the following telegram from the Boer envoys:

"Messrs. Wessels, Fischer and Wolmarans: My justice and righteousness be praised for a flag of truce.

Salut is With Them of Course.

Washington, May 16.—Representative Sulzer of New York, chairman of the committee to receive the Boer delegates in Washington, today received a telegram from Messrs. Fischer, Wolmarans and Wessels stating that they could not leave New York before Friday.

Mr. Sulzer said that a committee consisting of United States Senators, three representatives and a number of prominent citizens, would go to New York to escort the delegates there.

Mr. Sulzer says the stay of the delegates will be made the occasion of a notable demonstration.

Calls Them Playthings.

London, May 16.—The afternoon newspapers here pay scant attention to the reception accorded the Boer delegates in New York. The papers here regard them as "playthings of American politicians."
