THE ARGONAUTS PRO AND ALSO CON

Majority in Favor of Confining the Famous Water Event to Home Talent.

THE ARGONAUTS PRO AND ALSO CON In the Dread of Appearing Churlish and Cowardly Arent the Committee at Best

London, July 31.—In the letters to the Times and other newspapers discussing the question whether the Henley regatta shall continue open to foreigners or not, those who say "no" are distinctly more numerous, and their names individually more weighty, than the other side. From Rudolph Lehmann, Dr. Wasiolek and the men well known to the public as rowing men have maintained that Henley is not the place for international contests, and the press has agreed with them.

Before saying anything of their reasons for this opinion, the views of the men who have proposed the restriction may be dismissed in a very few words.
