TRANSATLANTIC TRADE.

Shipping Companies Suffered Heavily Last Year.

LONDON, April 11.—The fall of the transatlantic shipping trade for 1930 shows an extraordinary decline, which makes the year 1930 the lowest in the history of the industry.

The shipping companies reported a loss of 100,000 tons in 1930, compared with a gain of 100,000 tons in 1929. The loss was due to a combination of factors, including a decline in the demand for shipping and a rise in the cost of fuel.

FIRE DESTROYED QUEBEC VINEGAR FACTORY

QUEBEC, April 11.—There was a fire this morning on the Rue St. Jean, near the St. Charles corner, which destroyed the factory of the Quebec Vinegar Co., a large factory which was totally destroyed with all its contents. Only one building in the rear was saved.
