system, but a fluctuating and superficial philosophy. If it should change to any of these systems, that it should at any time be found unequal to resist the onslaught of the adversary, let it recognize, that the cause and fault of this is at home. While we say this we certainly do not reproach the learned and ingenious persons, who bring their industry and erudition and wealth of new inventions to minister to the cultivation of philosophy; for we well understand that all this tends to the development of doctrine. But we must take great care that our whole or principal work should be devoted to that industry and erudition. And in like manner we should judge of sacred theology, which it is grateful indeed to develop and illustrate by the multiplied contributions of study, but it is altogether necessary that it should be treated after the serious method of the scholastics, so that the forces of reason and revelation being combined therein it may continue to be the "invulnerable" bulwalk of faith.
