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## REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

# Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

The Council has the honour to submit the Report of the proceedings of the Dominion Rifle Association for the year 1898, the 31st of its existence, and in so doing is glad to be able to again congratulate the members on its continued prosperity.

An expression of its gratitude is once more due to the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Aberdeen, G.C.M.G., late Governor General, for his interest in the welfare of the Association and for his contribution of \$500 to the Prize List of 1898.

While they cannot but regret the severance of his official connection with the Association, they are assured that Lord Aberdeen will never cease to reciprocate the good will and wishes of the Riflemen of Canada, which, during his term as Governor General, he did so much to invoke.

In his successor the Earl of Minto, G.C.M.G., as Governor General, (who has graciously consented to become the Patron of the Association) the Council feels that the Association has a warm supporter, and it anticipates with much satisfaction the beneficial results which will, without doubt, accrue to the Association from His Excellency's practical knowledge of and co-operation in its work.

The thanks of the Association are also due to

- (1) The Government and Members of the House of Commons for the annual grant of \$10,000, which was voted at the last Session of Parliament, and for the further vote of \$5,000 towards the cost of the "Bisley" Building.
- (2) To Surgeon Lt.-Col. The Hon. F. W. Borden, M.P., Minister of Militia, for his generous action in authorizing the free issue of ammunition at the Annual Prize Meeting in September last, which was much appreciated by the competitors at the Meeting, and also for his contribution of \$100 to the Annual Prize List.
- (3) To the Mayor and Corporation of the City of Ottawa for their generosity in defraying the cost of lighting the camp at Rockliffe and the supply of water; also to the Hon. the Postmaster General for the convenient postal arrangements afforded to the Association during the Annual Matches.

It will be remembered that the D. R. A. Report of 1897 referred to the last meeting on the old Range and that amidst a goodly company the Hon. Wm. Mulock, Postmaster General and an ex-President of the Ontario Rifle Association, fired "The Last Shot on the Rideau Range."

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Thanks to the interest of Mr. Pittaway, Photographer, some very interesting group photographs of this ceremony were secured, and many competitors have already possessed themselves of these souvenirs. At the close of the competition for 1897, there were many misgivings as to the possibility of having the new ranges ready for the 1898 Meeting,

After much consideration by the Department of Militia and Defence of the question of a suitable Range at the Capital of the Dominion, an order in Council was passed on the 7th July, 1897, upon the recommendation of the Hon. F. W. Borden, Minister of Militia and Defence, directing the expropriation of 347 acres of land at Rockliffe for range purposes. This was subsequently increased to 380 acres. This Range is situated on the south side of the Ottawa River, about one and a half miles from the Rockliffe terminus of the Ottawa Electric Railway.

Your Council had previously conveyed to the Hon. Dr. Borden its preference for the Rockliffe site, and it is no small satisfaction to know that all the Riflemen who have visited the range, and others competent to judge, are of the opinion that the selection is an admirable one, and the site capable of being made an ideal range.

Provision has been made for shooting at ranges from 200 to 1,000 yards, and this distance can if necessary be increased to 2,000 yards. The present accommodation consists of 55 targets, in a single trench, set upon iron frames of an approved pattern, fastened to wooden posts, five feet of which are embedded in concrete.

The stop butt, which is 50 feet in rear of the targets, is 830 feet long, 25 feet high, 25 feet wide at the base, and 8 feet at the top. The crib work of the butt is constructed of cedar logs and filled with broken stone, 12,700 yards being used for the purpose. It presents every element of safety that it was possible to secure. The unoccupied space in rear of the butt, which the Militia Department has acquired, extends eastward 2,200 yards.

A sketch of the Range accompanies this report, as also a plan of the target frame.

The plans and specifications were prepared by, and the work carried out under the supervision of, Mr. Paul Weatherbe, the Engineer of the Department of Militia and Defence, and your Council desires to place upon record on behalf of the Riflemen of the Dominion, its appreciation of Mr. Weatherbe's plan and careful supervision of the work, and also of the consideration he at all times extended to the representations and suggestions your Council, through its Range Representatives, thought it necessary to submit.

The contractors for the range were Messrs. Lyons and White, of Ottawa, and while this firm was responsible to the Department of Militia and Defence, alone, for the carrying out of the contract, they were ever ready to consider the requests of your Association, and the suspension of the work to allow the D.R.A. competition to take place was an act of courtesy on the part of the contractors, which placed your Council under a deep obligation.

During the meeting communication was had with the Range by two steamers, which plied every half hour between the terminus of the Electric Railway at Rockliffe and an improvised wharf opposite the 600 yards firing point.

While this means of reaching the range must always be a pleasant one in fine weather, it is very desirable that an extension of the Electric Railway from its present terminus at Rockliffe Park to the Range should be made during the coming Spring.

The Annual Matches of the Association were held on the Rockliffe Ranges, commencing on Monday, the 29th August.

The Council feels that it may congratulate the Members on the success which attended the inaugural meeting on these splendid Ranges, where the competitions are henceforth to be held. The weather was all that could be desired, and considering the many difficulties which had to be contended with in arranging for the competitions, owing to the Range being but partially completed and equipped, the Meeting passed off successfully and to the pronounced satisfaction of the competitors. The scoring was of a high order, and the matches in consequence, were keenly contested. The great number of "possibles" in several of the matches, were among the features of the Meeting. The attendarce was not so large as usual, there being 360 competitors, as compared with 416 in 1896 and 460 in 1895, but the causes which led to this diminution in numbers are, in the opinion of your Council, of a temporary character, and with the advantages in store for the Riflemen of Canada, they anticipate that future years will see the attendance at these matches largely increased.

The Council records with pleasure the fact that the Prize Meeting was (in the absence of the Minister of Militia and Defence) opened by Major General Hutton, C.B., A.D.C. to the Queen, and lately appointed to command the Canadian Militia.

The frequent presence of Gen. Hutton during the Meeting and the deep and practical interest he displayed in the details of the shooting, lead your Council to congratulate the Riflemen of Canada and the Militia generally upon having as the General Officer Commanding so distinguished a soldier, and they anticipate, with his advice and co-operation, the cause of Rifle Shooting in Canada will be materially advanced.

The conditions pertaining to the new Range will necessitate some changes in the programme and details of future meetings, and your Council will be in a position to submit for the consideration of their successors, changes which they believe will increase the value and attractiveness of the competitions, combined with increased pleasure and interest to the competitors attending them.

With deep regret the Council has to lecord the deaths of three old and valued members of the Association. They refer to Col. Sir Casimir S. Gzowski, K.C.M.G. and A.D.C. to the Queen, a former President; Robt. Hamilton. Esq., a Vice-President for the Province of Quebec, and Colonel C. E. Panet, late Deputy Minister of Militia and Defence, and a member of Council for many years.

In the death of Col. Gzowski, who from 1869 to 1883 was its President, the Association has lost a friend who was deeply interested in its work, and who contributed in no small degree, not only in Canada, but in the competitions at Wimbledon, to the success which has attended the Association.

It is with deep regret that the Council has learned of the death of the late Colonel MacKinnon, Secretary of the National Rifle Association, an officer to whom the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association was so much indebted for various services in connection with the Bisley Building, since the lamented death of the late Major Perley, in supervising the work and attending to the payment of claims of contra lors and others in England from time to time, and also for uniform kindness and advice pertaining to the annual visits of the Canadian Team of Marksmen taking part in the competitions of the National Rifle Association.

The Council submits herewith (1) the Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditures, duly audited. (2) The Report of Lt.-Col. J. P. Cooke, 1st P.W. Fusiliers, Commandant of the Bisley Team, with the usual financial and other statements which accompany the same. In doing so they would call attention to the remarks made by Lt.-Col. Cooke, and the recommendations on the subject of the practice of the team at Bisley, instead of Staines as formerly, and also as to the admission of the Team in the "International" competition. In view of the favourable consideration likely to be accorded thereto, your Council have made application to the National Rifle Association for the necessary permission to enable the team to compete in this match, and they trust their action in this respect may be approved.

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#### FINANCE.

The affiliation fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$568.00 as against \$616.00 received last year, a decrease of \$48.00. It is suggested that a circular be issued to the Commanding Officer of every Militia Corps in Canada setting forth the claims of the D. R. A. to increased support.

The number of Rifle Associations affiliating this year is as follows, viz:—Provincial, seven; County and other Rifle Associations, twenty-nine; a decrease of three Associations as compared with 1897.

The Annual Subscriptions received to date for the year 1898 amount to \$208.00. It is matter for regret that the number of contributing members is not larger, and it would appear desirable that some special effort be made to increase the list of members.

Associate members' fees amounted to \$288.00 as against \$300.00 received in 1897.

The receipts from special donations amounted to \$700.00, the same as last year.

Donations from Banks amounted to \$775.00, an increase of \$25.00, as compared with 1897, the Ontario Bank, being added to the list of contributors this year.

Entry fees to matches, including post entries and fines for challenge shots, &c., less refunds, amounted to \$2,893.81 as against \$4,149.23 received last year, a decrease of \$1,255.42. This decrease is accounted for by the loss of revenue from the usual Extra Series matches, only one Extra Series match being competed for this year. The limiting of the competition to four days instead of the usual period of five days as in the past, left barely time for firing the regular matches in the programme, and these had to be hurried through, at the sacrifice of Extra Series matches. With the new and improved ranges at Rockliffe the extension of the time for the Annual Competition of the Association to six days, commencing on a Monday and ending on the Saturday following, and also increasing the number of matches, including Extra Series and special matches, thus adding to the revenue from entry fees, is well worthy of consideration.

Cash prizes and badges amounted to \$4,718.35, as against \$6,686.02 distributed last year, a decrease of \$1,967.67. Owing to the outstanding liabilities incurred in connection with the Bisley building, which had to be liquidated this year, it was deemed advisable to reduce the amount of the Prize List for 1898.

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The net expenditure on account of the Bisley Team of 1898 amounted to \$5,528.82 as against \$5,378.39, the net expenditure of last year; an increase of \$150.43. The team sailed a week earlier than usual, thus entailing extra expense for subsistence, &c., at Staines.

The experiment was made this year for the first time of sending Mr. Deslauriers, of Ottawa, as house steward of the team, to arrange for the opening of Bisley quarters, to put everything in order, and to superintend the catering of the team while at Bisley.

Mr. Deslauriers' services were found to be of great advantage during the period the building was occupied. Before leaving he supervised the packing and storing away of all valuable articles of furniture, &c., the property of the Association.

Receipts from ordinary sources for the year amounted to \$15,522.81, which with the balance of \$1,830.87, carried forward from last year, (less refund) shows a total of \$17,253.68 at credit side of the account.

The general expenditure amounted to \$17,475.78, including the balance of \$3,621.21 advanced as per Bisley Building Account, thus leaving a balance on the debit side of \$222.10, as an overdraft at our Bankers. This will likely be more than covered by anticipated donations from the Provinces which have not already contributed to the Bisley Building Fund,

The desire to hasten the completion of the new ranges at Rockliffe, under many difficulties, in order to be in time for the Annual Competition this year, and owing to the distance from the city the contingent expenses and charges for transport, &c., were necessarily greater than on previous years.

#### BISLEY BUILDING.

A detailed statement of the Bisley Building Account will be found in Appendix "A," showing a balance for the year of \$3,621.21, which has been paid by the Association.

All the claims against the Bisley Building in England and Canada have been paid, the only items remaining for adjustment, that the Council is aware of are two small accounts for the late caretaker, and some local taxes, amounting to about £5 stg.

Since last year grants in aid of the Bisley Building have been received; a further sum of \$5,000 from the Dominion Government and \$200 from the Provincial Government of Manitoba.

There is good reason to anticipate a grant of \$200 from the Province of British Columbia and it is hoped that the Maritime Provinces will follow the example by similar grants towards the cost of completing and furnishing the building.

The Council has to refer with regret to the death of the caretaker of the Bisley Building, Joseph Mansfield, which took place on the 25th November last, and to that of his widow, who acted as caretaker temporarily after her husband's death.

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The Acting Secretary of the N. R. A. reports that on the 23rd December last, Mrs. Mansfield was seriously burned by the explosion or upsetting of a lighted lamp, her injuries proving fatal six days later. He further states that the building narrowly escaped destruction.

The caretaker of the Surrey Brigade Hut and a cabman are reported as having been instrumental in extinguishing the fire, and the Acting Secretary of the N. R. A. has been requested to suitably acknowledge their services. It is proposed a small gratuity be awarded them.

The Bisley Building and contents is covered by insurance to the extent of £2200 sterling.

The total cost of the Building, as it now stands, is \$15,089.21. A full statement under this head will be found in Appendix "B," following the Treasurer's accounts,

#### REPORT OF

LT.-COL. J. P. COOKE, 1st P. W. FUSILIERS, MONTREAL,

COMMANDING THE BISLEY TEAM.

1898.

MONTREAL, 3RD JANUARY, 1899.

To Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. M. Gibson,

President Dominion Rifle Association.

SIR:—As Commanding Officer of the Bisley Team for 1898, I beg to submit the following report:

The members of the team in accordance with the instructions that had been issued, reported at Carslake's Hotel on Friday morning the 17th June, and at the Armoury of the 1st Prince of Wales' Regiment Fusiliers, at 11 o'clock on the same day. The whole 20 members were present, and I would strongly recommend that all members report at Montreal in future. The inspection was satisfactory in every respect, and Major General Gascoigne, who was in Montreal, kindly attended the inspection, accompanied by Colonel Aylmer, the Adjutant General. After the team had been inspected by Major General Gascoigne and myself, complimentary addresses were made by Major General Gascoigne, Lt.-Colonel Tilton and Lt.-Colonel Massey. We went on board the "S.S. Parisian" the following morning; but that evening the 1st Prince of Wales Fusiliers, about four hundred strong, with their brass and fife and drum bands, accompanied Lt.-Colonel Cooke, their commanding Officer down to the ship, and the bands entertained the passengers with a number of selections. Although the steamer's accommodation was taxed to the utmost, we received every attention, and the berths assigned to us were very comfortable and convenient.

Among the passengers were Hon. Mr. Blair, Minister of Railways and Canals, and Hon. Mr. Dobell, both of whom asked to be presented to the members of the team and wished them every success.

A tug of war was organized between eight members of the team and eight passengers, and I am well pleased to say the team won easily.

We arrived at Liverpool on Monday the 27th of June at 6 o'clock p. m., and as it would have been impossible to reach Staines before two or three o'clock next morning, I decided to stay over night at Liverpool, and put up at "The Stork", leaving for Staines the following morning at 9.45, arriving at 5.15 p.m., by the London and North Western Railway, who placed special carriages at our disposal as in former years.

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The men were quartered one half at the "Pack Horse" and the other half at the "Angel and Crown", the accommodation at the "Angel and Crown" being much the better, and if the team again goes to Staines I believe that arrangements could be made with the "Angel and Crown" to put up the whole team, which would be most desirable.

The ranges at Runemede are all that can be desired for team practice, but I believe that now we have a house and building at Bisley, the practice should be put in at Bisley, as although the regular ranges are closed for a week before the meeting opens; the Victoria team was allowed to practice on some targets beyond the 90 butts and I was informed that the same permission would have been given to the Canadians had they applied for it, as these targets are only used for extra series. I also found that the change from Staines to Bisley affected the health of the men and that they seemed out of sorts for a few days. As the Kolapore match takes place on the Friday morning of the first week of the meeting, I believe the men would be in better form for this match if they went straight to "Bisley" instead of going to Staines.

We left Staines on Monday morning the 11th of July for Bisley, arriving there at noon, and were received with a beaming smile by our good and estimable steward, John Deslauriers, who had everything in readiness for us. and I would recommend that he be sent over next year to prepare the quarters before the team arrives, and to attend to any work that may be done to the building.

I entered into a contract with Inde Coope & Co., caterers, who have replaced Paget for the camp, to provide everything in connection with our mess, and I am pleased to say that they gave the most perfect satisfaction in every respect.

Although much has been accomplished towards completing the building since last year, there still remains some minor work to be done. When completed it will be admirably adapted for the purpose for which it was built, and is acknowledged on all sides to be a credit to Canada.

We had splendid weather during the whole meeting with the exception of one day on which it rained. The wind was both strong and variable at times, and during the last stage of the Queen's there was a gale, particularly during the firing at the one thousand range.

The shooting throughout the meeting was something extraordinary, possibles being the order of things; in one match there being fifty-four possibles while there were but thirty-nine prizes, and in the International Match, the Scottish team of twenty made the marvellous average record of 97%.

I am happy to say that notwithstanding the excellency of the shooting generally, the Canadian team maintained their high reputation as shots, and carried off their share of prizes. It is true that they did not win the "Kolapore" Cup, but they were only nine points behind the winning team, the Guernseys, who for the first time carried off this coveted prize with a score of 744, and six points behind the Mother Country and Victoria teams, who tied for second place.

In the Prince of Wales' Lieut. Robertson tied for first place, although in the shoot off he was beaten.

Lieut. Ross won the "Gregory" with the excellent score of 34 out of a possible 35 at 200 yards standing. This score was only once previously made at Bisley.

Lieut. Gilchrist won the Alexander Martin with the magnificent score of 49 out of a possible 50 at 1000 yards.

Sergeant Broadhurst was well up in the last stage of the St. Georges and captured a badge. He tied for first place in the Daily Telegraph. He was first in the All Comers' Aggregate, tied for second place in the Grand Aggregate, was first in the Corporation of London Aggregate, and was only six points behind the winner in the Queen's.

Pte. Simpson won the Barlow Cup for long range aggregate.

We had twelve men in the second stage of the Queen's and five in the last stage, being the greatest number the Canadians ever had. They were Lieut. Ross, Sergeants Hayhurst, Broadhurst and Blair, and Pte. Simpson.

We had first and second places in the All Comers Aggregate, as well as another place therein; first and fourth places in the Corporation of London aggregate; three in the Grand Aggregate, one of whom tied for the second place, and four in the Volunteer Aggregate.

The Canada Cup was won by Sergt. Broadhurst, and the cup donated by Lord Strathcona by Lieut. Ross, while Sergt. Armstrong won a case of cutlery presented by Mr. Merrill, of Sheffield.

We had the honor of a visit from H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught, commanding the Aldershot District, attended by Col. Wynne, D.A.G. and Colonel Douglas, A.A.G., Lieut. Ruthven, Scots Guards, his A.D.C., on Tuesday, the 13th July.

His Royal Highness made a thorough inspection of the building and expressed himself as much pleased with the same. When offered some refreshments he said he would be delighted to partake of Canadian hospitality again on Canadian soil, and when I reminded him that he was hardly on Canadian soil, he tapped his foot on the floor and asked me if it was Canadian wood, and when I answered him in the affirmative he replied, "That is near enough for me."

The At Home was held on Thursday, the 21st July, Lord Strathcona, and Mrs. Blair, wife of the Hon. A. J. Blair, kindly assisting me in receiving the guests, amongst whom were Lord Wolseley, Commander in Chief, Sir Henry Fletcher, President, Col. McKinnon, Secretary National Rifle Association, Col. Campbell, Commandant of the Camp, Brigadier General the Rt. Hon. J. A.Macdonald, Hon. Messrs. Blair, Fisher, Dobell and Fitzpatrick.

Lord Strathcona presented the Canada Cup as well as his own, and in a short speech congratulated the team upon the good showing they had made in the different matches.

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It seemed to me a great pity that there was only one team match in which the Canadians competed, and I therefore spoke to the President, Sir Henry Fletcher and Col. McKinnon, the Secretary, about permitting the Canadian team to enter the International. They stated that if the Dominion Rifle Association would make application therefor, they would consider the matter, and expressed the opinion that it would make the match more interesting. Major Davidson, Captain of the English team and Major Thorburn, Captain of the Scottish team, both of whom are members of the Executive Committee, to whom I spoke on the matter, expressed themselves as strongly in favor of admitting the Canadians to this match. I would therefore recommend that application be made to the National Rifle Association to admit the Canadians to the International.

I had the pleasure of attending a meeting of the National Rifle Association, held during the meeting, and amongst other questions discussed was the advisability of diminishing the size of the bulls-eye or the increasing of the ranges, owing to the accuracy of the new rifle, and the concensus of opinion was in favor of diminishing the size of the bulls-eye, owing to the impossibility of getting long ranges throughout the country.

I am pleased to state that the conduct of the members of the team from the time they left Montreal until they were discharged, was all that could be desired and reflected credit on the Canadian Militia. Perfect harmony existed amongst themselves, and between them and myself, and I will always look back with pleasure to my command of the Bisley Team of 1898.

I enclose statements of expenditure with vouchers attached, also acquittance roll and detailed list of prizes won, with the scores made by individual members of the team.







### Annual General Meeting held 23rd March, 1898.

Minutes of the adjourned Annual Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, held in the Railway Committee Room of the House of Commons on Wednesday, the 23rd March, 1898, at 11 o'clock a.m.

Lt.-Col. J. M. Gibson, A.D.C., President of the Association, in the chair.

Among those present were His Excellency the Earl of Aberdeen, Governor General, attended by Major Denison, A.D.C., Hon. F. W. Borden. M.P., Minister of Militia, Major General Gascoigne, Col. Aylmer, A.G., Col. Panet, Col. Lake, Q.-Mr. General, Lt.-Colonels F. Massey, S. Hughes, M.P., Tilton, J. H. Burland, J. M. Delamere, P. Worseley, Wm. White, C.M.G., H. R. Smith, A.D.C., A. P. The President having called the meeting to order, directed the Secretary to read the minutes of the last Meeting, when it was moved by Major J. J. Mason and seconded by Major W. C. Macdonald, that the Minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the Annual Report, be taken as read and confirmed.—Carried.

Before moving the adoption of the Annual Report the President addressed the Meeting, and alluded to several matters of importance to the Association. He said that the permanent quarters of the Association at Bisley, which were a credit to Canada, were all but completed. He had attended the Bisley meeting while in England, and had done his best to have the work completed at an early date. The building had, however, cost more than was anticipated, owing to unforseen causes, and the Association had been compelled to make an appeal to the Minister of Militia to make a grant to help it out of its difficulty, and there was reason to hope that the appeal would be successful. He hoped that other Colonies would imitate this forward movement on the part of Canada, and erect buildings for the Riflemen on Bisley Common. He expressed himself as gratified at the remarkably good showing of the Bisley Team, though it had failed to carry off the Queen's Prize or Kolapore Cup. In some of the principal matches the Canadian Team stood remarkably high. The expenditure on the Bisley

Team was \$6,066 as against \$5,656 last year. The refunds, however, made the expenditure \$278 less than last year. The liabilities on the Bisley building were \$6,249.

The shooting with the new Rifle at Bisley had been so good that the opinion had been expressed that it would have a damaging effect upon the fortunes of the National Rifle Association. In other words it was considered that with the new rifle the crack shots would more frequently and in larger numbers top the score, while the element of luck, not being as great a factor as heretofore, the average marksman would have a poorer chance of succeeding, and that rifle shooting would get a severe set back. He hoped the same result would not follow in the case of the Dominion Rifle Association. Should it turn out that way it would become the duty of the Association to so arrange the Prize Lists as to continue to secure the attendance of average shots.

He alluded to the fact that the Association had held its last meeting on the Rideau Range and the feeling of sadness which they experienced in leaving them. The next competitions would, he hoped, be held on the new Ranges at Rockliffe. It was a fact, he said, that the Association would have to depend in the future, as in the past, upon the bounty and good will of the Dominion Government. He was satisfied the present Administration and the present Minister of Militia would continue to do all they could in the interests of the Association. A matter which was of great interest to them all was the question of ammunition. In this connection he threw out the suggestion that free ammunition should be given the next Annual Prize Meeting. He hoped that this could be done. In regard to Provincial Associations he would like also to see them get liberal treatment. As to local Associations and local Corps he would ask the Minister of Militia to take their case into serious consideration.

Before closing he referred to their Excellencies the Governor General and Lady Aberdeen, and the presence of His Excellency at the Meeting. He alluded to their efforts in all things which pertained to the benefit and advancement of Canada and mentioned the generosity of His Excellency in the matter of his annual prize. He concluded by moving, seconded by Lt.-Col. F. Massey, that the Annual Report as printed, be received, accepted as read, and adopted.—Carried.

In moving the vote of thanks to His Excellency the Governor General, Lt.-Col. S. Hughes, M.P., alluded to the interest he had always taken in the work of the Association, and expressed the regret felt by the members of the Association at his early departure from Canada. He then moved, and Lt.-Col. Ibbotson seconded the following resolution:—

"That the thanks of the Association are hereby tendered to His Excellency the Governor General for his presence here to-day, for his continued interest in the welfare of the Association and for his generous contribution of \$500 to the Prize List of last year.—Carried unanimously by a standing vote.

His Excellency in replying to the resolution expressed himself as being grateful for the kindly expressions towards himself and the pleasure which it

afforded him to be present at the Annual Meeting of the Association. This was the 5th consecutive year he had the opportunity of attending their annual gathering. He also had the pleasure of being present at some of the Prize Meetings in September. As long as he remained with them he would not forget his contribution to their funds. He referred to the new Rifle Range and to the Bisley Building, which he said was spoken of as the Canadian Palace. It might be said, why have we a palace? but he was sure that Canadians did not want nor did he believe in erecting a second rate shack at Bisley. There were thousands of persons who went to Bisley who knew nothing of rifle shooting, and it was most desirable that the Dominion should be represented by having a suitable and commodious building there. It would serve as an admirable advertisement for Canada. Alluding to his contribution to the Association, His Excellency made an indirect reference to the probable date of his departure from Canada. He was unable to say if this present year would be his last, or his last but one, but that at any rate he would take care to see that no interruption in the sequence occurred so far as his contribution to the Association was concerned.

The President then read an address to Lt.-Col. Bacon, who for so many years had been the Secretary of the Association, alluding to the valuable services of Col. Bacon, and expressing the wish of the members of the Association, as well as his own, that Col. Bacon would live to see many a Rifle Meeting on the new Ranges. The address was accompanied by a purse of money as a mark of the esteem and regard in which Col. Bacon was held. The address was as follows:—

To Lt.-Colonel Thomas Bacon,

Late Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

The Dominion of Canada Rifle Association cannot permit the severance of the official relations which have existed between the Association and yourself for the past twelve years without placing upon record its appreciation of your faithful and valued service as its Secretary during that period.

While the success of any Association is largely dependent upon its permanent officers, especially is this the case in such an organization as the Dominion Rifle Association, and the Council is assured that the continued and increasing prosperity of the Association has been in no small degree due to the ability and precision with which your duties as Secretary were performed.

The Council begs your acceptance of the accompanying memento of its esteem, and trust that you may long be spared to enjoy the retirement from official life which you have so honourably earned.

Ottawa, March 23rd, 1898.

Col. Bacon feelingly responded to the address in appropriate terms.

In moving the next resolution Lt.-Col. F. Massey, Chairman of Council, said that he hoped the day was near at hand when revenues would permit Parliament to vote much larger sums to the Association. The country had taken a more permanent stand in the Empire and in the world. With that prominence came greater duties, and Canadians should be placed in a position to defend themselves. All recognized the generosity of His Excellency to this Rifle Association; he has identified himself with all the interests of Canada, making him for the time a Canadian at heart.

Lt.-Col. Massey moved, seconded by Lt.-Col. J. H. Burland, that the thanks of the Association are tendered to the Government and to the members of both Houses of Parliament, for the liberal grant of \$10,000 again voted at the last session of Parliament, and also for the grant of \$5,000 towards the erection of the Canadian Bisley Building.

The Hon. Dr. Borden, in acknowledging the vote of thanks, expressed his pleasure at the Governor General's announcement that this was not the last time he would be present at the meeting. When the time came to part from the Governor General, he was sure he would be remembered, not only on account of his munificent contributions, but on account of the qualities of heart which led him to identify himself with the interests of Canada. This made him a Canadian at heart, for the time-being at any rate, and as long as he lived it would make him a warm friend of the Canadian people.

From his (Dr. Borden's) long connection with the Militia he might possibly be accused of taking too favourable a view of their interests. The object of the D. R. A. was a most desirable one and in the best interests of the Dominion, and he trusted the revenues of the country would soon permit of a larger grant being made to the Association, which it deserved, so that it might be enabled to show a surplus. He pointed out the importance of the position occupied by Canada, and with this importance, which was increasing, came increased responsibility. The country should be prepared to meet any call or any emergency, and there was no part of the National defences so important as the proper use of the rifle.

Dr. Borden promised the Association that he would be happy to recommend to his colleagues a grant towards removing the debt upon the Bisley Building. In a short time proceedings would be taken to expropriate the land for the new Rockliffe Ranges. When this was done he would ask the Association to name an officer to act in conjunction with the officers of the Militia Department in equipping the ranges for the Prize Meeting in September.

With respect to the suggestion of the President that an issue of free ammunition should be made for the Dominion and Provincial Matches, he was afraid he could not agree to the latter, especially as the new ammunition cost \$25.00 per thousand. The ammunition was free at the annual drill, and it was not so much appreciated there as at the private practices, where it had to be paid for. However, he hoped that a reduction in the cost might be obtained.

Moved by Lt.-Col. G. R. Starke, seconded by Major Jno. Bruce:

"That the thanks of the Association are tendered to the Hon. F. W. Borden and Lt.-Col. Fred. Massey for their contribution of \$100 each towards the Prize List. To the President and Directors of the undermentioned Banks for their continued annual subscriptions:

Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, for their gifts to the Bisley Team of 1897 of valuable silver cups, and to the Rt. Hon. Lord Mount Stephen for his generous donation of £50 for competition amongst the members." -Carried.

Present—Lt.-Col. Tilton, in the chair; Lt.-Cols. Anderson, S. Hughes, M.P., Delamere, Majors W. C. Macdonald, Bruce, Sherwood, Mason and Capt. Sutherland, and the Secretary and the Treasurer.

Lt.-Col. Tilton was elected as Chairman.

(3) Letter from Lt.-Col. Cotton, A.A.G.A., with reference to the target to be used on the Rockliffe Rifle Ranges.

Stands for present.

(4) From Mr. W. G. Fowler, as to target invented by him, and which he would like to exhibit and to have an opportunity of tendering for the new targets on the Rockliffe Ranges.

Stands for the present.

(5) Petition from Lt.-Col. Anderson and others, asking for the adoption of the wind guage back sight on the Lee Enfield Rifles.

Stands until next meeting of the Executive Committee.

(6) Letter from Col.-Sergt. E. Skedden, 13th Battalion, asking for a return of the entrance fees deducted from last year's Bisley Team.

Ordered that the Secretary do inform him that the Executive Committee cannot see their way to make any change in the Regulations of last year.

(7) Letter from Capt. Roper, G.G.F.G., asking on behalf of the Regiment permission to erect a bungalow on the Rockliffe Rifle Ranges for shooting purposes.

Ordered that Capt. Roper be informed the Committee have no jurisdiction in the matter, and that he should make application to the Militia Department.

(8) From Gunner W. Miller, 5th R.C.A., with reference to the refund of his post entry tees and also of his railway fare in connection with the Bisley team of last year.

Ordered that the Secretary do send the letter to Major Mason to be dealt with by him.

The question of allowing the members of the Bisley Team to proceed to England in advance of the Team was discussed, but no action was taken thereon, and the matter stands over until the next meeting of the Executive Committee.

The question of making application for the use of the Runnimede Ranges for practice of the Bisley Team was then taken up, and the Secretary was instructed to write Col. Mackinnon, Secretary N.R.A., to ascertain the terms upon which the Pirbright Ranges could be obtained.

The following Committee to arrange the Prize List and Regulations for the Meeting of 1898 were then appointed:—Lt.-Cols. Tilton, Anderson, Hood, Delamere, Majors J. J. Mason and Blaiklock.

Lt.-Col. S. Hughes, M.P., brought up the question of striking out the order or rule respecting winners of the D. R. A. medals having free entry in any of the matches of the Association, but as the matter was one provided for by the Constitution it was decided that it could only be dealt with in the method specified in paragraph 20 of the Constitution. Notice of motion to be given to the Secretary.

The names of the Bisley Team were then considered, and the Secretary was instructed to write to the first twenty names on the list exclusive of Capt. Mc-Micking, who was ineligible, and Lt.-Col. W. P. Anderson, who stated that he would be unable to go.

# Minutes of Competitors' Meeting, held at the Drill Hall, Ottawa, 30th August, 1898, at 8.30 p.m.

Present—Lt.-Cols. White, Burland, Delamere, Jones; Majors McDonald, and Dunbar: Capts. Russell, Dillon, Milligan, Ross, Davidson, Paine, C. F. Winter, S. C. D. Roper, Smith, King; Surgeon Lieut. Bertram, McNeill, Davidson, Gilchrist; Bugle Major Cawdron; Sergeants Drysdale, Corrigan, Brown, Wilson, Quinney; Corpl. Smith, Carroll; Privates Turner, D. McMartin, Annand, Bennett, Drysdale, Porteous, Quinney, McRae, Abbott, Kimmerly, Desbarats, Heller, Loggie, Simpson, Jordon, Tink, Short.

Moved by Major Mason, 13th Battalion, seconded by Capt. Davidson, 8th R. R., that Lt.-Colonel Tilton take the chair.—Carried.

Col. Tilton: Well, gentlemen, as this meeting was called for 8 o'clock and it is now over three-quarters of an hour past, I think we had better proceed to business. I am sorry to see so small a number of competitors present, because it is from this meeting the Executive not only gathers the views of competitors, but hears their complaints, and although it has been termed the "kickers" meeting," I consider this a misnomer, for intelligent discussions with reference to the work we have in hand are always productive of good results. When I had the pleasure of making an address to you in September last and bidding farewell to the old range I expressed the hope that before another prize meeting we could welcome you to a new range at Ottawa. The Executive was untiring during the past winter in its efforts to secure the selection of a site suitable in every way for our purposes, and at the Annual Meeting in April last you will remember it was announced that a new range was about to be acquired at Rockliffe. It was late in the Spring before the action of the Government took definite form, and since that period I have had many misgivings as to the possibility of the new range being ready for the present prize meeting. Only a week ago to-day it was so doubtful that I was on my way to the telegraph office to send a message to Colonel Gibson that the meeting would have to be postponed for a week, as it would be impossible to open on the 29th, but with the valuable help of Mr. Weatherbe, the Chief Architect of the Dept. of Militia and Defence, we were able to accomplish the desired end and open the new ranges according to programme. The range as presented to you has some imperfections—to these I ask your generous consideration and indulgence, with the promise on the part of the Executive, that before another prize competition the range will be complete with 55 targets, and I may safely say that in the Rockliffe Range the Riflemen of Canada will find one of the best ranges upon the continent of America. I do not wish to take up the time of this meeting, and I would ask any gentleman to speak who may desire to place his views before the Executive. The Executive is your servant and has no wish to do anything but what will

conduce to your efficiency, benefit and comfort. It will always be pleased to consider and carry out, (if at all possible), any recommendations that are made. (Applause.)

Capt. Davidson, 8th R. R.: Mr. Chairman, I think it is very evident there is very little to kick about this year on the part of those present to-night. Either this, or the object of their dissatisfaction weighs so heavily upon them that they are disinclined to get up and begin the onslaught. However, I will take upon myself, on behalf of a Regiment which for many years has sent teams to compete at Ottawa, viz., the 8th Royal Rifles, and I wish to express our appreciation of the efforts of the Executive of the D. R. A. in providing such a magnificent range for the Riflemen of Canada, which, when completed, I have no hesitation in saying, will in my opinion surpass anything of the kind on the North American continent.

The old tricky wind that we used to get upon the Rideau Range will not be found, and the old aids that used to puzzle us so upon the old ground, will be absent. There are, however, some few things we would like to see remedied, and one I do not hesitate to say, is the system of double targets. Instead of gaining time we have really lost time, no doubt due to the great number of challenges, and which, in eight cases out of ten, was allowed to the competitor. I think if the second target was used as a dummy as at Bisley, it would answer all right. The marking disc is placed on the dummy and as soon as the target is fired at is seen at once. Whether the second target is used as a dummy or to be fired upon, it should be placed in front of the frames. As it is now it is impossible for a marker to see a hit on that part of the second target which, when down, is behind the two upright frames. The markers will always lose time in finding those shots and covering up the old holes.

Lt.-Col. Tilton: I spent three-quarters of an hour in the butts to-day and questioned the markers upon that point. The markers told me they found no difficulty whatever in finding shots or placing patches on the target.

Capt. Davidson: I acknowledge that on this subject the marker's opinion must be better than any competitor, but I submit the marking has been bad and I still think that delay must have occurred from this cause.

Lt.-Col. Tilton: Has there been any improvement to-day on yesterday?

Capt. Davidson: I think not. (Voice) Much worse.

Capt. Davidson: I am quite ready to admit that the matter I have complained about would be remedied in time.

Col. Tilton: Would it be remedied by doing away with the second target.

Capt. Davidson: Possibly. I am only pointing out what I know on the views of a great many competitors.

Another matter I wish to speak about is the ammunition. Personally, I have been very well pleased, as I have not had a single cartridge with which I

could find fault, but I know a great many have. This, of course, is a matter over which the Executive have no control, but representations could be made to the Department that extremely bad ammunition has been discovered and asking them to see that the Cartridge Factory should not turn out such unreliable ammunition. We know many bad cartridges have been found—bullets show evidence of the points not being well turned, and the brass shells seem to be easily ruptured and torn upon explosion.

I believe the desire of competitors in general is not to find fault with the Executive this year. They understand the difficulties the Executive has had in opening the ranges on the 29th. At the same time many of them have had good reasons for finding fault, particularly on account of careless marking-shots they think they have made not being given them, and bad cartridges. However, I hope next year these little difficulties will be remedied, and that all competitors will be moved by this spirit of consideration and for the benefit of rifle shooting in general. Lieut. Smith, of the 59th Battalion, has just called to my attention another matter which I intended to mention-the absence of streamers. These might have been provided even at this meeting. A few polls 15 to 20 feet high along each side of the range and down the center would have been of great advantage to green shots, and as every one knows up at the top of high poles the wind is not the same as poles low down. I hope by next year that sufficient streamers will be put up. Of course, as all who have been to Bisley know, they have lines of streamers every ten targets along the range. We should be properly provided here with streamers.

Capt. Helmer, 43rd Bn.: There is another point I would like to bring to the attention of the Executive, and that is that the Association should include in its programme a list of the Hotels, with rates and so forth. I think it would not be much trouble for the Secretary to get rates from the various Hotels and have it included in the programme. I know in visiting Toronto and Montreal we all find it more or less difficult to get suitable accommodation at rates such as Riflemen can pay. Our Hotels would mostly all, I think, make a special rate for Riflemen; and if competitors coming to the meeting could know just where to go before actually reaching the city, it would be a great comfort and convenience. I would like to have this suggestion noted for consideration and action another year.

Capt. Dillon, 34th Bn.: I would like to ask how the Executive accounts for the bad ammunition. I am sure competitors would like to hear their explanation of it.

Lt.-Col. Tilton: On the point that has been made with reference to the ammunition, it is hardly necessary for me to say that the D. R. A. has no control whatever over its manufacture, nor any power towards rectifying its shortcoming beyond the consideration the Department of Militia and Defence may choose to give to such representations as it may make on behalf of the Riflemen of Canada, and I may say no one will experience greater regret at

what has developed within the last few days in reference to this ammunition than the Department itself. The Executive of the D.R.A. will lose no time in attending to this matter, as they owe it both to the Department and the Militia generally to bring at once to the notice of the authorities the defects developed at the Matches in Toronto last week, and which have again been observed here. This, I feel sure, is all you can expect from us, and I am sure these representations will meet with such consideration at the hand of the Militia Dept. as they deserve. In respect to the target, I may say to Capt. Davidson, they have been somewhat of an experiment. The frames were made from plans of the Chief Architect of the Militia Department, and he is most anxious to make a success. I may further say the Executive is most anxious to have the opinions of competitors. It is, of course, unreasonable to expect that markers who worked the targets for the first time yesterday morning should be perfect. Many of the difficulties will undoubtedly disappear before we have the pleasure of meeting you again, and I can promise you on the part of the Executive, will be remedied, so far as it may be in its power to do so.

As to the streamers, it was thought by some of the Riflemen that the large flags would be sufficient.

Frequent observation during three months of the wind at the range has shown me that the steadiness is remarkable. One of the first things that attracted my attention on the new range was the light and afterwards the wind. I never saw a place where the wind was so steady. I will see if the streamers cannot be put up to-morrow, and if not, that they are provided for next year.

On the question of Hotels, I may say our esteemed Secretary had intended to have a list of Hotels and Boarding Houses inserted in the programme, but as you know, many of the Hotel people are somewhat diffident at making known on short notice, a scale of reduced rates unless they are guaranteed or assured of a certain number. I am quite sure, however, that, as Capt. Helmer said, many of our Hotels would be willing to make a reduction in favor of our riflemen, and another year the Secretary will endeavor to arrange with Hotels and Boarding Houses to the best advantage and have such information included in the Official Programme.

Major Mason, 13th Battalion: Mr. Chairman, I think, perhaps, I might make a few remarks in connection with the observations made by Capt. Davidson, as they concur with views I have formed relative to the new range during the past-two days. While it would be unwise and unfair, perhaps, to give expression to fixed views upon such a short experience, still I may say that as regards the target, I do not think we gain any time by the double or second target. I timed several trios and found they averaged 26, 27, and 23 minutes. Now, I think this shows we have not accomplished what the Executive Committee desired, viz., to save time, and if time is not saved the system is a failure and we had better go back to the old system. I rather agree with Capt.

Davidson that the panel in the double target at Bisley is best, and I do not think we have gained much by the change. In theory the double system is first rate, but to work well you must have perfect markers, perfect range officers, perfect register keepers, and perfect competitors, and unless you have them you cannot have that uniformity which seems essential to their successful use.

As to the ammunition, I am very much disappointed at what has been experienced during the past two days—magazines blown out, bolts blown off, cartridge cases split, and all not only once but several times, and the labour of the Match Committee has been much greater than ever before. We have been called repeatedly to settle cases of bad cartridges. There ought not to be much difficulty in making ammunition as perfect as possible. There must be some shortcoming either in the ammunition itself or the breech mechanism of the rifle. I am not in a position to say where the fault lies. but I do not think we have had a meeting when we have had so many complaints as this year. We have had trouble before, but as a rule the ammunition has been fairly satisfactory.

Complaints, and strong ones, are made that ammunition made and dated in 1897 is not satisfactory and cannot be satisfactory so long as there are such a large proportion of bad cartridges. I agree with Capt. Davidson as to streamers being provided.

As far as the range itself is concerned I have no hesitation in saying that it is an ideal range in every respect, and I think we have men on our Executive who are capable of providing that range and under all circumstances bringing it up to the highest state of perfection, and that they will do everything in their power to accomplish that result goes, I am sure, without saying. (Applause.)

Surgeon Lieut. Bertram, 77th Bn.: I would like to hear from the Executive in respect to not allowing certain men extra shots for bad ammunition. I do not see why range officers should not allow extra shots in all cases of bad cartridges.

Lt.-Col. Tilton: As the Chairman of the Match Committee is here, I would ask him what were the instructions in this regard.

Major Mason: This is really covered by the ground I have already gone over. The difficulty is to know where to draw the line. The usual accepted decision is that once the shot has left the rifle that the shot is to be counted. I admit there is a hardship, but we should get over that by providing good ammunition instead of making rules. Now, as Chairman of the Match Committee, I had several shells brought me asking to be allowed extra shots. Some of these shells were split a quarter of an inch, and there is no doubt the competitors had good ground for complaint. I think the rule we adopted was the only one under the citcumstances, viz., that if the bullet had left the rifle that was the shot,

The trouble is in having to rely upon four or five different Range Officers and so many Register Keepers, and the opinion formed by one is different from

that of another, so we thought it better to make a hard and fast rule that no allowance would be made when once the bullet had left the rifle. I have, however, made a note of the matter, and I think the Executive Committee should take it up and come to some decision, instead of leaving the matter of a second shot to the discretion of the Range Officer, or even the Match Committee. I agree with Dr. Bertram that there should be some remedy, and I hope the Executive will take up the trouble, and also that their labor will be lessened by the provision of better ammunition in the future.

Surgeon Lieut. Bertram: I would like to ask the Chairman what he himself has to say about the ammunition.

Lt.-Col. Tilton: I can only repeat that the Executive will lay the matter before the Militia Department and endeavor to have the defect made good.

Lieut. H. R. Lordley, Charlottetown Eng., P.E.I.: Would the Chairman of the Match Committee explain what is the official definition of a ricochet shot, that is, what are the markers instructions; what do they understand by a ricochet? They wave the black bar often when I think it is not intended for a ricochet.

Major Mason: The ricochet bar is used not for a ricochet only, but sometimes a marker thinks his target has been struck and on taking it down finds it has not. His instructions are in such a case to wave the black bar to signify a miss or no hit.

Capt. Davidson: That is one of the most important points that could be brought up at this meeting. I have often thought of the same thing and would like to know what are the instructions given the markers in regard to signalling ricochet shots, and also what they are told to consider a "ricochet."

Lt.-Col. Tilton, Major Mason has just told us what the instructions to the markers are. I think his reply covers your query.

Capt. Davidson: My impression is that instructions to the markers specify that when a bullet goes in sideways it is to be shown as a ricochet shot. Now, a ricochet must be a shot striking the grouund first and then being deflected through the target at an angle to the line of fire; but I contend that because a bullet pierces the target sideways it is not sufficient proof that such shot is a ricochet. Of course, if a bullet when passing through the target throws up earth and turf, it is a pretty safe conclusion that such is a ricochet, but because it goes in sideways and there is no earth or turf in evidence, it does not follow at all that such is a ricochet shot. I know that both here and at Quebec I have been credited with ricochets in a score between bulls-eyes, when I knew it was utterly impossible to get such dropping shots. Every shot striking the target, whether it goes in point first or sideways, should be credited to the firer. I believe that sometimes, owing to a little irregularity in the shape of bullet, it drops or turns in its flight more or less slightly as the case may be, and so in

passing through the target gives the impression that it is a ricochet shot when in reality it is nothing of the kind. Cases of this kind are so numerous that it is a gross injustice to the man firing to not give him credit for hits made in this way. The object of all rifle shooting is to make men skilful enough to hit their man, and a ricochet hitting a man is every bit as good as any other. I may say I mentioned this matter to several of the Executive at Bisley and rather to my surprise found they quite agreed with me, and said the matter would be brought up for consideration. I do not know what decision was arrived at, but I do hold that every shot passing through the target should be credited to the firer.

Lt.-Col. Tilton: I am very glad this matter has come up, and the views of both Mr. Lordley and Capt. Davidson will receive consideration. It is difficult for a marker to distinguish between a ricochet and one that appears to be such, and I concur in the opinion that the value of every shot striking the target should, as suggested, be given the competitor. We will make a note of all these points and do our best to remedy them.

Has any other gentleman any further suggestions to offer?

Major Mason moved the adjournment of the meeting, and it was adjourned at 9.30 p.m.

### CONSTITUTION.

#### ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

- 1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION"
- 2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association, for the current year, upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

- 4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominiom subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its bona fide members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete, free of entrance fee, in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the Medal; provided always that the name of the winner, and details of the matches at which it is won, shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.
- 5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the council.

  The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

- 6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.
- 7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.
- 8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Fourteen from Ontario, Ten from Quebec, Six from Nova Scotia, Six from New Brunswick, Four from Manitoba, Four from British Columbia, Four from Prince Edward Island, Two from each of the North West Territories, so soon as Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations, one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

- The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.
- 10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occuring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be ex-officio members of the Executive Committee.
- 11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the District Officers commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.
- 12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.
- 13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

- 15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.
- 16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.
- 17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.
- 18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof, the Association year will terminate.
- 19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitors attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.
- 20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.
- 21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacany occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

### GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

ADOPTED AT

## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

#### Amended 1881 and 1882.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first Meetings of of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, Extraordinary if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the members of the Meetings. Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meet- The Council to ings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the keep minutes of Secretary, and open to inspection of any member of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three mem-Finance Combers of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time,in such chartered Treasurer to bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money deposit sums received by him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be Expenditure of required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of sums for curthe Chairman of the Executive Committee, or, in his absence, by some one of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only Expenditure of a upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be Annual rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and Accounts. closed on the 30th November.

Correspondence between the General Officer Commanding the Canadian Militia and the President of the Dominion Rifle Association, on the Subject of the Improvement of Rifle Shooting in Canada.

From the General Officer Commanding the Canadian Militia to the President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

OTTAWA, 30TH DECEMBER, 1898.

SIR:—You will recollect that at the Dominion Rifle Association, in August last, I alluded in my address, on the occasion of the opening of the Rockliffe Rifle Range, that I proposed to invite the careful consideration of the Council and its co-operation, towards the improvement of Rifle Shooting, and to the conducting of Rifle practice in such a manner as will better satisfy modern Military requirements for a rifle possessing such very different qualities to those possessed by the Martini Henry and Snider.

The prominent position held by the Dominion Rifle Association in Canada seems to me to place the Council of the Association and the Association generally, in a position of the gravest responsibility as regards the future development of Rifle shooting in this country, more especially in its relation to the Militia and the Defence of Canada. The Council of the Dominion Rifle Association should, in my opinion, assume the responsibility which I have indicated, and assist myself and the other officers concerned in the instruction of the Canadian Troops, in placing Rifle Practice and Musketry generally of the Militia of Canada upon a higher and better basis than it has hitherto held. Following upon this assumption I would suggest for the careful consideration of the Council the following points:

- (1) The Reduction in Size of the Bulls-eye and an Increase in the Ranges fired at during Matches.—It is unnecessary for me to remind the Council that with the Lee-Enfield the effective range may be considered as up to 1,200 yards, and that of the decisive Infantry Range up to 600 yards. In other words that up to the latter distance the trajectory of the Rifle is to all intents and purposes, flat.
- (2) Mass Firing as well as Individual Firing to be E.couraged.—Modern Rifle Practice is divided into two separate categories, (a) Individual Firing and (b) Mass Firing. The former is considered to be preliminary to the latter, and the latter for battle purposes is considered to be all essential. The one requires careful training for the individual; the latter for the individual when acting in concert with others. It appears to me that hitherto importance has been attached to one only of these categories, and that from a battle and purely Military point of view not the most essential Having the fact carefully in regard that Rifle

Shooting exists, and the Associations are subsidized solely for the benefit which they confer upon Canada in relation to its detences, I think that the Council would do well to devote as much attention to the second form of rifle shooting as to the former.

- (3) Moving Objects.—It is essential that our Troops should be instructed in firing at moving objects, i.e., objects moving laterally from right to left as well as objects advancing and retiring. All European armies are now instructed in this form of rifle practice, and I trust that the Council will seriously consider the importance of initiating a system similar to it and thus become the pioneers of a system to be carried out in other Ranges throughout the Dominion.
- (4) Disappearing Objects.—The remarks made as regards Moving Objects in the above paragraph equally apply to Disappearing Objects. The great point to be ensured with Troops upon active service when required to act individually, is that they shall be able to take aim and fire in the most rapid possible manner at an object which will only present itself as a target for a very limited space of time. In other words our Riflemen should be trained as sporting shots. It may be regarded as a fact that upon active service it rarely happens that soldiers engage in individual firing, whether skirmishing or taking part in a modern attack, in scattered formation, are able to take deliberate aim at their enemy. It much more frequently happens that they are called upon to fire at an object which appears and disappears at unexpected places with puzzling rapidity. It is to meet this, the usual conditions of war, that I would invite the earnest attention of the Council as to the best means for providing instruction and practice for our Riflemen.

I need hardly assure the Council how ready I shall be at all times to give them further particulars on the points which I have endeavored to lay before them, or to give them the benefit of such practicable experience as I have acquired in different parts of the Empire. I write with a very full sense of the grave responsibility which I am asking the Council to assume, as the Association which shall deal in a practical manner with the afore-mentioned most vital points for the interests of the Rifle shooting of the future.

THE PRESIDENT DOMINION RIFLE ASSOCIATION, OTTAWA.

From the President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association to the General Officer Commanding the Canadian Militia.

TORCNTO, 24TH JANUARY. 1899.

SIR:—I have already informally acknowledged the receipt of your communication of 30th December ult., inviting consideration by the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association of subjects therein referred to. In order that the suggestions you have made may receive that careful consideration which their importance demands, I have asked the Secretary of the Association to have copies of same sent to some of the leading members of the Council who are also on the Executive Committee of the Association, in order that we may have the advantage of more matured thought about these matters than can possibly be expected where a document is read at a meeting and action has to be taken thereon immediately.

It is undoubtedly the case that the arming of the Militia of Canada with the Lee-Enfield introduces new conditions for which the Force is in a great measure unprepared. In remarks which I have from year to year made on moving the adoption of the Annual Reports submitted for the past four or five years, when referring to the new rifles, I have endeavored to indicate the responsibility being assumed by the Government in the matter of rifle ranges. Apart from the desirability of longer ranges for rifle practice, the element of safety became a much more serious matter than when the old Snider or even the Martini-Henry rifle was being used. While in the case of rural corps certain rifle practice is put in during the annual fortnight at camps of instruction, and while in the case of city corps similar rifle practice is required of each man for which returns are sent in, it is undeniable that in the case of city corps and some also of the rural corps rifle practice goes on with more or less regularity from May till October. Many Militiamen shoot by way of practice every week during the summer months. There are not only Battalion Rifle Associations but also Company Associations, and frequently much desirable emulation exists between Companies, culminating in Company team competitions at the Annual Battalion Matches in the Autumn of each year. It is true that there are many corps in which if a few men who are recognized as "shots" are left out of consideration, there is little interest shown in rifle shooting, and this is sometimes attributable to the want of proper ranges, and sometimes to the fact that Commanding Officers fail to recognize that familiarity with the use of a rifle is one of the most, if not decidedly the most, important qualification of a soldier. However that may be, I fear that general rifle practice by the Militia outside of the regular annual rifle practice will be secured with more difficulty now than when we had the old Snider rifle.

There is no doubt but that if the 500 and 600 yards ranges were used for the great bulk of the rifle shooting, or if, so to speak, those were the "staple

ranges," the 600 and 900 yard ranges should now be quite as common or at any rate nearly as common with the Lee-Enfield rifle. Even with the Martini-Henry there was too much shooting at the said ranges as compared with the longer ranges-at second class instead of first class targets-yet until last year when you honored the Association by opening our new ranges, we have been absolutely compelled at our Dominion Meetings to be satisfied with three first class targets, the number of competitors being at times considerably above 400. Some of the Provincial Associations have been no better off, and I fancy if the local ranges throughout the country were examined it would be found that there is a pretty general want of proper ranges and proper target facilities for long range practice. This leads me to a suggestion of the question of how far the Annual Rifle Meeting of the Dominion Association may be regarded as the proper occasion for imparting instruction in some of the classes of firing to which you have referred. Only a limited number of Militiamen from all parts of the Dominion can be expected to come together to contest for the trophies and prizes that are offered, and those who do attend always have been the crack shots in their localities. The D.R.A. idea has been very similar to the National Rifle Association idea in the management of the Wimbledon and Bisley Meetings, viz., to afford an opportunity for skilled riflemen to meet either in individual or team competitions. Local Rifle Associations, Battalion Teams, District Teams, and even Provincial Teams, vie with one another in competitive tests of skill and a useful rivalry is maintained. There is much in all this to stimulate a young Militiaman's ambition. He is proud of the honor of securing a place on his Company team of eight or ten men. He becomes a very much more important man when at a Provincial Rifle Meeting he is chosen as one of his Battalion Team. Progressing from one stage to another he goes to Ottawa. There the Governor General's prize is open to him, as well as the possibility of shooting up to a place on the Bisley Team from Canada, -- then the Queen's Prize, the Kolapore Team, and so There is scarcely any limit to the aspirations of a Rifleman, and it is undoubtedly the case that the Annual Provincial and Dominion Rifle Association Meetings have been competitive exhibitions of skill already acquired, rather than occasions for instruction.

While saying this I do not wish to imply that new ideas or methods cannot be usefully initiated at our meetings. 'More can be done in the future, now that we have good ranges, than was hitherto possible. Of course we have had our military matches, so called, firing at disappearing targets, advancing and retiring, as well as volley firing competitions, but though the interest in these competitions has been gradually increasing, I think I am right in stating that, by the majority of Riflemen who attend the meetings, they are regarded as a sort of specialty or side show. How far mass firing and firing at objects moving laterally as well as advancing and retiring, involving the judging of distance, and firing at disappearing objects, can be made an essential part of the programme of matches in which all competitors shall participate, will require much consideration, and it must be borne in mind that changes by the Association in

that direction to be of advantage to the force generally must be followed by the introduction of similar changes in the *home* work of our Militiamen. In any case I am strongly in favor of rearranging our programme by the institution of 800, 900 and 1,000 yards firing for much of what is now done at 500 and 600 yards, and will be disappointed if we cannot make a considerable change in this way during the present year.

Without further and I fear tediously prolonging this letter, I desire on behalf of the Association to express great satisfaction that the Association should be asked to co-operate with you in the endeavor to have the rifle practice and musketry of the Militia put on a more satisfactory basis. I can assure you on behalf of the Association that such co-operative assistance will be regarded both as a pleasure and duty. Fortunately many of the most active members of our Council are practical riflemen. Others, like myself, have had their day, but can discuss to advantage the practicability of some of the changes you would like to see introduced and will appreciate the opportunity of doing so all the more because invited to the discussion by the General Officer in Command.
