Cable News.

Special Evening Telegram.
NEW YORK, Aug. 21.
A Paris cable to the Tribune this morning says: "Though there is no foundation whatever for the rumor current in London last night that Germany had declared war against France, it is a fact that the German-Franco situation is most unsatisfactory. No progress whatever has been made in the negotiations, and a settlement is as remote as when the conversation began. Germany's claims for compensation offer no basis for compromise. They extend not merely to territorial concessions in the hinterland of the Kameroun country, but also to recognition of German industrial and commercial supremacy. Any disposition that the German foreign minister may have shown to abate these excessive demands is belittled to have been arrested by England's domestic troubles. Berlin's view is, the recent epidemic of strikes has caused a weakening of Britain as a factor in the European balance of power. This idea, implied in many different quarters, is openly expressed in the following words of the Berliner Neuer Nachrichten: 'England would not at the present moment be able to oppose a more decisive attitude by Germany on the Moroccan question with the same emphasis as, say, shortly before Lloyd George's Mansion House speech.'"

Special Evening Telegram.
LONDON, Aug. 21.
The railroads are rapidly restoring their normal service. To-day the managers confidently expressed themselves that by the evening all lines would be in operation almost as smoothly as before the strike. The men of the London and North West roads are still on strike, and to-day there was some trouble on the Midland railway. A hundred thousand strikers in Liverpool, more than one-third of the number, reported for work to-day, and the number returning increases hourly.

LONDON, Aug. 21.
King George has gone to Scotland for grouse shooting, but has been in constant telegraphic communication with Premier Asquith. He had intended to return to London if the strike trouble had continued any longer.

MINOT, North Dakota, Aug. 21.
Five are dead, 125 injured, and damage to property of \$150,000, as the result of a tornado yesterday which caused a devastation north of this city. Over one hundred are injured at West Hope. Of this number a dozen are dangerously hurt.

C.P.R. Places Order for Two New Steamers.

MONTREAL, Aug. 18.—It has been officially announced that the Canadian Pacific Railway Company has placed an order in England for two new steamships for its Vancouver-Hong Kong service. This step has been under contemplation for some time, the C. P. R. rapidly increasing freight and passenger traffic on the Pacific Ocean necessitating increased transportation facilities.

The contract for the new boats has been let to the Fairfield Shipbuilding Company of Glasgow, one of the most famous firms along the Clyde. The new ships will be of the most modern construction in every respect. They will be 595 feet long over all and will have a tonnage of about 16,000 tons. They will be equipped with engines of from 16,000 to 17,000 horse power, and will be required to maintain an average speed of eighteen knots per hour, and develop on their trial trips a speed of twenty knots an hour. In size a trifle larger than the Atlantic Empresses, the new boats will be literally floating palaces. They will be luxuriously fitted up and will undoubtedly materially decrease the running time between Vancouver and the Orient.

The boats will be ready in January 1913 and will cost over \$2,500,000 each.



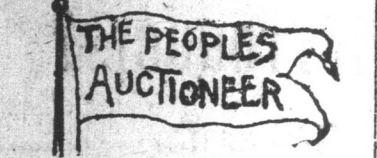
