**The Rejection of the By-law.**

"Impolitic and illegal action of the majority." This is the text for a lengthy article in *The Fergus News-Record* of Thursday, upon the action of the Wellington County Council in refusing to submit the amended Credit Valley Bonus By-law to another vote of the grouped municipalities. The people of the South Riding, but more especially of the town and township of Guelph, are treated to another instalment of the scolding which the *Fergus* and *Elora* papers have been bestowing liberally upon them of late. They are told once more that they are a heartless selfish set, caring nothing for the welfare of their northern neighbours; and the writer on to charge the representative of the town and township of Guelph with the sole blame of rejecting the by-law. This is a gross inaccuracy, which we cannot allow to pass without correction. An examination of the division list will expose it at once:—

AGAINST THE BY-LAW.—Messrs. This division list will show clearly the absurdity of the cry raised against Guelph. It will be seen that there voted for the by-law, in addition to the five much-berated Guelph men, eight representatives from the townships directly affected by the by-law—or enough to have swamped entirely the Guelph and Eramosa vote put together! And besides this, the Reeves of Harriston and Orangeville did not consider the matter pressing enough to require a journey to Guelph. Gentlemen from these railway-seeking townships cry out about being persecuted by Guelph; but they are divided amongst themselves on this question; and if a large number of their own people oppose this by-law, they cannot reasonably complain of Guelph men following the same course, in the exercise of their own judgment as to what are the true interests of the county. Had the grouped municipalities been a unit upon the question there might have been some force in this outcry about Guelph opposition—but in that event they could have disregarded such opposition altogether.

The real reason for the rejection of the by-law is the uneasiness existing in the minds of many of the councillors as to the construction of the trustee clause. Upon this point there is a doubt which can only be set at rest by a judicial decision; and the County Council by rejecting the by-law will enable such a judicial decision to be recorded. Proceedings will be taken against the Council to compel them to submit the by-law, and they will probably plead in defence that the by-law is defective on the clause in question. Should the Council be defeated, the by-law will then go the people; but the people will have the assurance that it is a perfectly sound and legal by-law, and they will be so far beholden to the County Council for having set the vexed point at rest. Should the Council be successful, their action will be entirely vindicated, and the people will have been prevented from paying away money which might after all have been diverted to the construction of a railway out of the county entirely. A by-law dealing with so large an amount of the hard-earned savings of our farmers should be like Caesar's wife—above suspicion; and that this by-law is open to much suspicion, is proved by the opinion of our County Solicitor, already published in *The Mercury*. True, it is attempted to set against this the opinion of Mr. Blake; but a moment's examination of Mr. Blake's opinion will show that it was given upon an *ex parte* statement from the Company. Mr. Blake was not asked to pronounce upon the trustee clause, but confined his statement to the general question of whether the by-law was such a one as the Council was bound to submit; and he expressly refers to the desirability of a judicial decision. Besides, Mr. Blake is retained on behalf of the Company; and those who lay so much stress upon this point are virtually asking the Council to act upon the advice of the Credit Valley Company's lawyer, and reject the advice of their own!

Upon the merits or demerits of the scheme itself it is not necessary for us to enter at this juncture. But it certainly appears to us that the County Council can make out a good case for postponing the submission of the by-law.

**Native Rubber.**

(From the London Advertiser.)

We observed this morning at the Provincial Exhibition a mass of odd looking material, which Mr. Ellis was informing the numerous visitors is a sample of native rubber, manufactured from the common milk-weed, which grows abundantly in this country and from time immemorial has been recognized as a nuisance to the farmer. The substance as shown at the Exhibition is an unvulcanized state; it attaches to the finger when touched and when drawn out flies back quickly, and indicates that it possesses all the elasticity of the South American rubber. Experiments have proven that the gums will bear vulcanizing, when it may be wrought into any or all of the many useful articles which vulcanized rubber is now made for. It is impossible to fully estimate its value, as many articles now made of wood and other materials in consequence of the high price of foreign rubber will shortly be made of the native material which, we learn, can be produced in any quantity required at less than one-fifth the cost of the other, and is much more servicable than wood for many articles now made of that substance. The milk-weed, it has been discovered, when cultivated will yield more abundantly than when gathered wild, and a single acre may be made to produce from ten to fifteen tons of weeds, or on an average of from ten to twelve hundred pounds of gum. Foreign rubber is now sold in Canada, at from 50 to 90 cents per pound, which is considerably higher in comparison with what the native rubber may be made for, and yet leaves a fair margin for the producer. It is said that the price will not exceed 15 cents per pound—a figure which must at once, as soon as it is placed upon the market, revolutionize the trade.

Some months ago Mr. D. Lamb, of Strathroy, discovered that by a chemical process he could prove to be a fact what had long been suspected, that the milk-weed would produce a material similar in every respect to the South American rubber. He laid the result of his experiments before Mr. M. Knowlton and Dr. McKenzie, of this city, who, recognizing the importance of the discovery, joined with him in obtaining letters patent in Canada, which have since been secured also in England and several European countries.

This is undoubtedly one of the greatest discoveries of the age, which ultimately will affect the entire globe. Rubber is a substance which is now in universal use, and in the course of time the foreign must give way to the Canadian article, which can be marketed at such an extraordinarily low figure, and, of course, Canada must reap untold benefit from the discovery. We hope the promoters will be able as they intend to get all the necessary apparatus ready to convert the next season's growth of weed into gum and that their success may be complete.
